





Many of the Green Revolu-tion's observers say the 200 bushel per acre target is still out of sight and probably can-not be developed until interim hybrid varieties are completed and stabilized. Implications are nearly staggering since po-tential production for the United States alone could ap-proach nine billion bushels.



On July 4, 1776, our founding Fathers proclaimed our Declara-tion of Independence which no less than four times referes to the existence of the Creator.

It was during the Presidency of Abraham Lincoln that Con-gress directed the inscription "In God We Trust" be placed on our coins.

With this in mind, several Congressmen and Senators sug-gested legislation adding the phrase "under God" to our

phrase "under God" to our Pledge. Congressman Oliver Bolton asked that there be no comma separating "one nation" from "under God" and the Conress adopted his version in 1954.

Thus, when the Pledge is recited, it should be remembered that nothing stands between our Nation and our God, and no pause should occur at this point in its recitation.


