I, H. W. Hale, City Secretary of the City of Tahoka, Texas, in pursuance of the hereinafter set out resolution do hereby give notice of the matters and things contained herein, which resolution is as follows: RESOLUTION APPROVING AND ADOPTING ENGINEER'S STATEMENT AND ESTIMATE OF THE COST TO ABUTTING PROPERTY OWNERS AND THEIR PROPERTY, FOR IMPROVING CERTAIN POR-TIONS OF THE PUBLIC SQUARE, SWEET STREET, MAIN STREET, HARPER STREET, PORTERFIELD STREET, AND KING STREET, DETERMINING TO LEVY ASSESSMENTS AGAINST THE OWNERS OF ABUTTING PROPERTY AND THEIR PROPERTY, SETTING A TIME AND PLACE FOR A HEARING, AND DIRECTING THE CITY SECRETARY TO GIVE NOTICE THEREOF.

—I— Whereas, the Board of Commissioners of the City of Tahoka, Texas, has ordered that the following portions of the below named streets in the City of Tahoka, Texas, be improved in some permanent manner, to-wit: District No 1. The Public Square. District No 2. Sweet Street from the north boundary line of Black Street to the south boundary line of King Street and from the north boundary line of Porterfield Street to the south boundary line of Lockwood Street. District No. 3. Main Street from the north boundary line of Porterfield Street to the south boundary line of Lockwood Street. District No. 4. Harner Street from the north boundary line of Sweet Street to the west boundary line of Main

District No. 4. Harper Street from the east boundary line of Sweet Street to the west boundary line of Main H. M. Larkin ----Street

Porterfield Street from the east boundary line of Cowan Street to the west boundary line District No. 5. of Sweet Street. District No. 6. Porterfield street from the east boundary line of Alley Street to the west boundary line of

Knighton Street. District No. 7. King Street from the east boundary line of Cowan Street to the west boundary line of Sweet

Street Plans for paving the above districts, same showing the widths of streets between curbs and widths of parkways, if any, are on file at the office of the City Secretary. The paving in all the above named districts shall, at intersection streets and alleys, be extended and rounded to a greater width, if found necessary, so as to present a neat and finished job and appearance. The districts shall be improved by raising, grading and filling same, and paving with a three inch vertical fiber brick on a prepared natural foundation, said foundation being water-proofed with an application of Tarvia, and installing and con-structing concrete curbs and gutters, wherever necessary, together with necessary sewers and drains for such im-provements, and by installing all as shown on and in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor adopt-ed and on file with the Board of Commissioners, and Whereas, a contract for the construction of such improvements has been let to the Plains Paving Company, and as directed the Elrod Engineering Company, City Engineers, have filed with the Board of Commissioners a statement showing an estimate of the cost of such improvements, the names of owners of abutting property, de-scriptions of abutting tracts or parcels, estimated costs to be assessed against such property and the owners there-of, and showing every other matter and thing required by law and the proceedings of the City for such statement and the said statement has by the Board of Commissioners been examined and corrected. -II-

That said statement having been examined and corrected is hereby, as corrected, approved and adopted.

That the Board of Commissioners does hereby determine to assess the entire costs of curbs and three-fourths of the cost of all other improvements, except the cost ofstreet and alley intersections, against the owners of prop-erty abutting on said improvements and against such property, all in accordance with the terms of Chapter 11, Title 22, of the Revised Statutes of Texas, 1911, and ordinances and other proceedings of the City of Tahoka, Texas, but which assessments shall be made after the notice and hearing hereinafter provided for. The costss of improvements shall be apportioned to abutting property and the owners thereof in said districts according to the front foot plan or rule, provided that if the application of this rule shall, in the opinion of the Board of Commis-sioners, be unjust or unequal, or result in individual cases of assessments in excess of special benefits received from such improvements, then the Board of Commissioners shall adopt such rule of apportionment as shall effect a substantial equality between the said owners and their property, considering the benefits received and the bur-dens imposed on such owners and their property, and provided further that in no case shall an assessment be levied against any owner or against any property in excess of the special benefits in enhanced value of such property by means of such improvements.
