INTERMENT MADE IN ROARING SPRINGS CEMETERY SUNDAY AFTERNOON

Death selected the spirit of Mrs. Q. A. Fletcher from her home two miles north of Roaring Springs near six o'clock Saturday morning, September 2, 1933. Her death was ascribed to leakage of the heart.

PIGS TO FORT WORTH MARKET MUST NOW HAVE PERMIT; FEDERAL RULE

MARKET GLUTTED BY RUSH OF SWINE TO RECEIVE GOVT. BONUS

L. L. Ballard who took charge of the Motley county office of Emergency Agricultural Ass tant last week, made vacant by M. P. Leaming's departure to ranhandle, Texas, to take charge of Co-operative Extension Work there, declared today that the rush of pigs to the Ft. Worth Market has caused such a glut that A. A. Lund, Local chairman of the Institute of Meat Packers had been forced to declare an embargo until Tuesday morning, Sept. 5.

Mr. Lund also issued the following executive order to the Fort Worth Stock Yards Company and to all commission firms operating on the Fort Worth market:

"The following ruling has been received this morning from the Agricultural Adjustment Administration and which will be rigidly enforced on this market (Fort Worth). Beginning Monday, Sept. 4th, all pigs received for the account of the Government must be accompanied by permission to ship. No premium will be paid for hogs unless permission has been granted before shipment is made.

Advance permission must be secured through commission firms or co-operative commission associations operating on terminal market.

Effective immediately no permits are to be issued through commission companies to any other than the original owner and in no case are permits to be issued to any owner for more than 200 head.

Permission to ship obtained through commission firms are to be evidenced by letter or telegram to the original owner and all to this market must be accompanied by such permit.

PERMIT TO SHIP PIGGY SOWS NOT NEEDED

The minimum weight of sows qualified to receive Government bonus, effective immediately, is allowed from 175 to 240 pounds.

Farmers may still have their pigs handled through cooperative shipping association or by country buyers by supplying them with the letter or telegram from commission firm indicating they have permit to ship their pigs.

Such agency must also act on behalf of the original owner in securing permits, but these permits must be made out in the name of the original owner, and must accompany the pig to the Ft. Worth market to make this pig eligible for acceptance under the government plan.

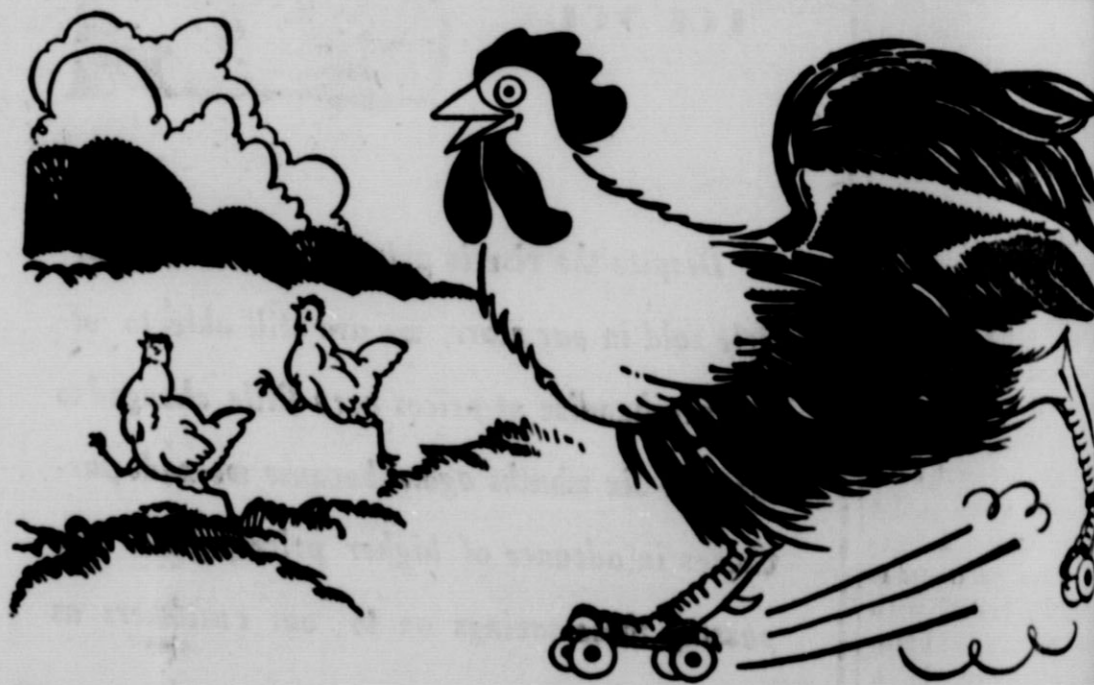
