There are many things that the student assistants can be praised for, but one of them is not grading papers. No two people grade discussion type tests alike. The students who grade papers do not realize what has gone on in class and cannot be fair to the pupils when they grade the papers. Several answers could be correct, but the assistant might mark off because the student does not state his answers in the exact words that it was told to the grader by the prof.

A test is supposedly for the purpose of informing the teacher what the students have learned, and the Prof. rarely knows if he gives discussion tests which are assistant grades. Objective type tests would help the teachers grade more fairly in most cases. Anyone can grade those fairly, and the teacher can judge the class by the grades if he had used thought in making out the test questions. This would eliminate "apple-polishing" by the students toward the student graders—B.J.B.
