

Approximately \$350 was raised through student donations this past week during registration for a student beautification campaign fund. This figure brings the total of all student donations to this fund up to about \$1500.

Several questions have arisen in the minds of students concerning this money. Many would like to know where it goes, who spends it, how much has been spent and why can't the state legislature appropriate money instead of leaving the looks of the campus up to the students.

As far as THE TOREADOR is able to acertain, the campaign was first started in February of 1943 after a semester's active work on the part of Toreador editor Bill Latson. The plans that were drawn up provided:

1. That the funds be collected by and disbursed through the office of the fiscal agent of the college and that the funds be expended for purposes as directed by a committee, the organization of which is described in the following.

2. A committee to be known as the committee on Student Campus Beautification Fund to be suggested, this committee to comprise six members made of three students who shall be elected by the student council, and by two faculty or staff members and one alumni, the last three to be selected by the President of the college. At least one of the faculty members of this committee shall be also a member of the Campus planning committee. It is felt that the chairman of the committee shall be a faculty member.

3. It is apprehended that the duties of this committee shall be onfined solely to the allocation of funds to those projects which may be considered to be in accord with the objects for which the funds have been collected. These projects might include: water lines, shrubs, flowers, grass, sidewalks, small maintenance equipment, hose, mowers, etc., but shall not include major structural improvements or maintenance.


