**Mrs. Stewardson Buried June 21 At Shields Cem.**

Mrs. John (Willie B.) Stewardson, 71, died at midnight Friday, June 21, in the Brownwood Community Hospital following a short illness. Funeral services were held Sunday afternoon at Stevens Funeral Home in Coleman with burial in the Shields Cemetery. Bobby Weathers, pastor of the Brownwood First United Methodist Church, officiated at the services.

Born April 16, 1903 in Williamson County, she was married to John M. Stewardson in Santa Anna on December 14, 1924. He died in 1963.

A Coleman County resident since 1908, she was a housewife and a member of the Shields Baptist Church.

Survivors include one daughter, Mrs. Carl H. Benton of Santa Anna; two sons Virgil Stewardson of Abilene and Wayne of Plainview; five grandchildren; one sister, Mrs. J. K. McClain of San Angelo; two brothers, C. A. Scarborough of the Shields Community and T. L. Scarborough of San Angelo.

**Former S-Annan Is Buried Here In June 21 Rites**

A former Santa Anna resident, Sam P. Jones, 76, of Dallas was buried in the Santa Anna Cemetery Friday, June 21, following memorial services in Dallas. Mr. Jones died June 19 in a Dallas hospital after being a patient there since June 5.

Born August 8, 1897 in Navarro County near Corsicana, he came to Coleman County with his family soon after the turn of the century. The family moved to Santa Anna in 1912. He married Lois Niell in Santa Anna in 1920.

Jones was operating engineer for Southern Ice Company for several years, and 49 years ago founded the J & S Carbureator Company in Dallas. He invented several devices and held eight patents. As a young man he was employed as engineer with Santa Anna's first electric power company.

Despite the loss of a leg in a hunting accident 50 years ago and poor health in recent years, Jones was active in business until a few weeks ago.

Survivors include three children and his wife; five brothers, Ed and Robert Jones of Santa Anna, Dick of Houston, James of Memphis, Tennessee, and Lester of California; three sisters, Frances Strauss of Houston, Minnie Hambricht of Dallas and Ethel Williams of California; and eleven grandchildren.

### OWLS, PIRATES WIN MORE GAMES

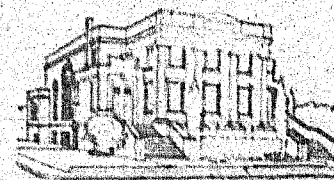
