## Man Known Here Awarded Honor In El Paso ISD

A Santa Anna native and relative of several local people was named Administrator of the Year in the El Paso Independent School District last month. The award was made by the El Paso Teachers Association.

Hibbard G. Polk, Northeast area superintendent in the El Paso system, was recipient of the annual award and presented a trophy for a "friend of education." He will be nominee for the same honor from the Texas Classroom Teachers Association.

The son of the late Ernest and Mamie Polk, he was born in Santa Anna and resided here for eight years before moving to Abilene. Polk is a cousin of Mmes. Norval Wylie, Henry Newman, Basil Gilmore and George Stewardson and has many friends here.

A graduate of Hardin Simmons University, he earned his M.A. degree from the University of Texas at El Paso in 1951. He taught at El Paso Bowie High School in 1940 before entering the armed services. After World War II he returned to teach and became counselor in 1947.

His administrative work began in 1948 where he was appointed elementary principal. He served in that capacity in several El Paso schools until being named personnel director from 1955 to 1964. He assumed the area superintendent post in 1972.

Polk is active in many civic organizations and community groups in El Paso.

## Stroke Workshop Set in Coleman Next Tuesday

The West Texas Rehabilitation Center of Abilene will conduct the first of two workshops to be presented on Stroke. Special consideration is being given to strokes due to the high incidence and numerous problems encountered. Basic skills will be taught to facilitate rehabilitation in motor, sensory and speech problems.

The stroke workshop is directed toward all individuals who are involved in direct patient care.

The most significant physical recovery from a stroke occurs within the first three or four months past onset. The Rehab Center Staff hopes this workshop will enable you to initiate rehabilitative measure during the early stages of convalescence.

This workshop will be held in Coleman at the Coleman Bank Clubroom on December 10th, from 1 p.m. until 5 p.m. All interested people are invited.

## Holiday Opening Friday

The Santa Anna Christmas opening parade and festivities are planned for Friday, December 6, sponsored by the Chamber of Commerce. The big event of the day will be a parade at 3 p.m.

## SA Scout Troop Meets Tonight

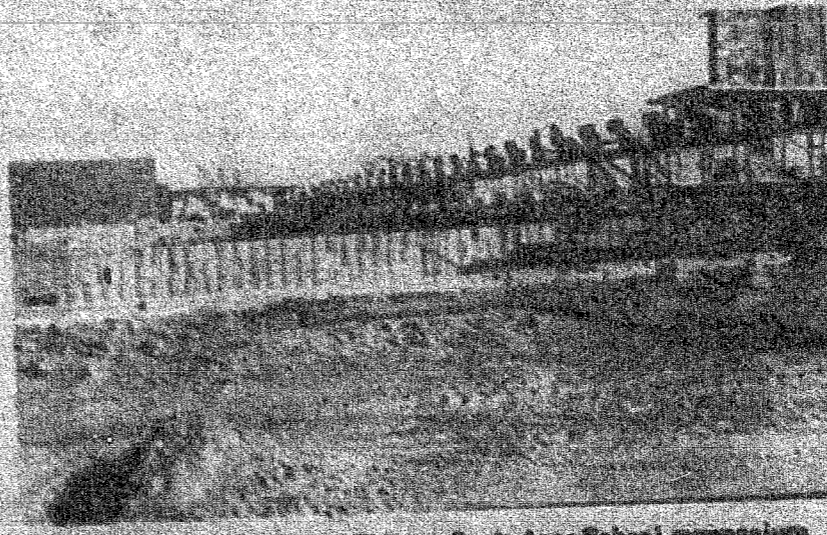
Boy Scout Troop 230 will meet at the annex of First Baptist Church Thursday night, December 5, at 7 p.m.

## 1974 RAINFALL TOTALS 23 IN.

Official rainfall for Santa Anna during the month of November totaled 1.40 inches according to Ray Owen, rain reporter. The total was received on three days; .38 inch on November 4, .75 inch on November 7, and .25 on the 10th.

The November amount brings the yearly total to 23 inches, about two inches short of the average yearly rainfall for Coleman county. September has been the wettest month of 1974 with a total of 6.78 at the official gauge in the east part of town.
