## City Sales Tax Shows Increase

State Comptroller Bob Bullock last week announced a record \$236.4 million in sales tax revenues during the 1978 fiscal year, a 14.8 percent increase over the previous budget year.

Checks were mailed to 903 cities as their August share of the local option one percent sales tax.

The current state budget year ends August 31.

The city sales tax is collected by merchants along with the state sales tax and rebated monthly to the cities in which it is collected.

Santa Anna received \$1,310.55 for the collection period ending July 27, a six percent increase over the same period last year.

The 1978 payments to Santa Anna have totaled \$8,672.12.

Leslie took her student teaching last spring at Comanche.

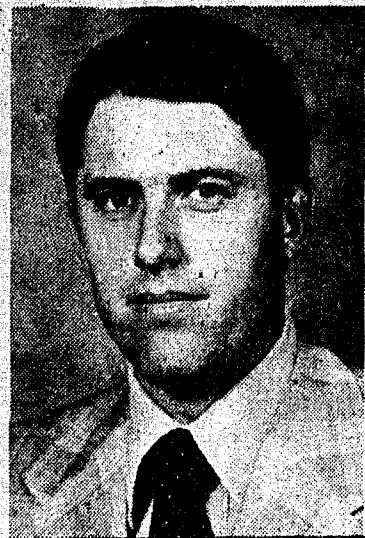
## Part Of Area Has Rainfall

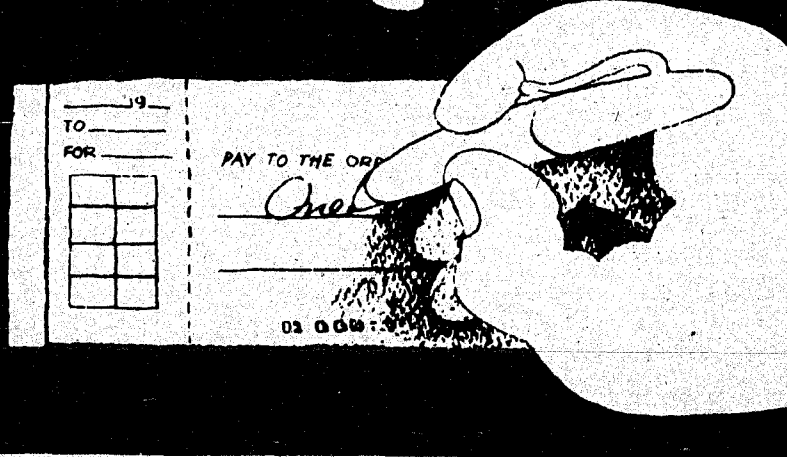

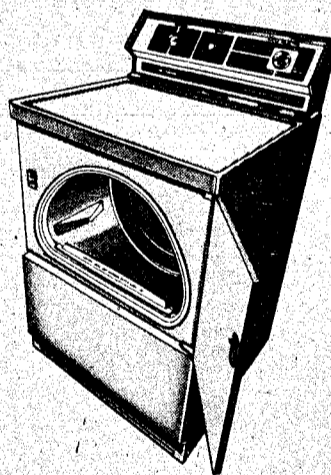

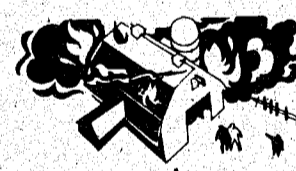
