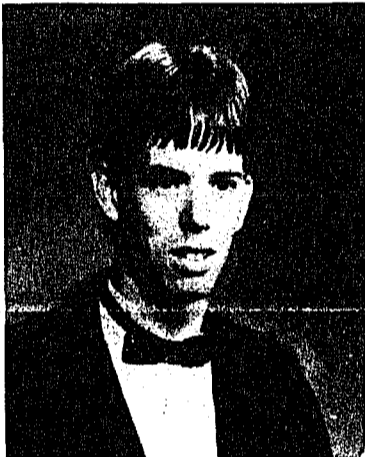

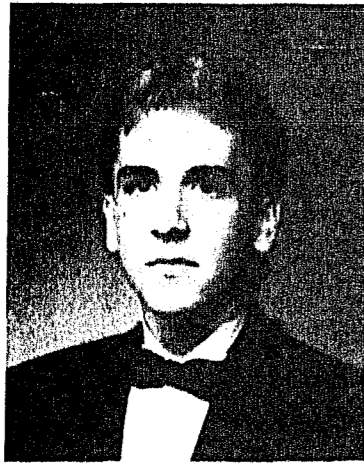

U.I.L. literary participation has included science, number sense, calculator, readywriting, and newswriting.

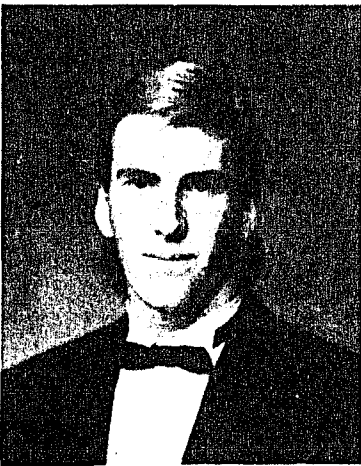

He plans to get a job after graduation.



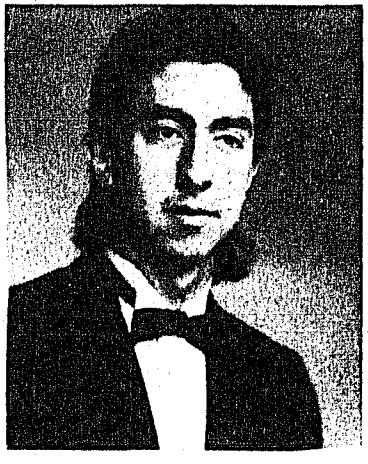
Selina Cook

Buddy Hardin

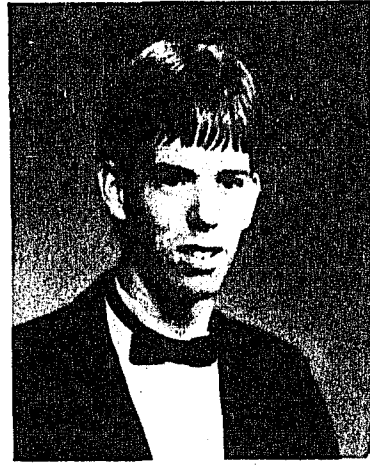
Buddy is the son of Buddy and Judith Hardin, and was born in Acayucan, Veracruz, Mexico, April 12, 1971.

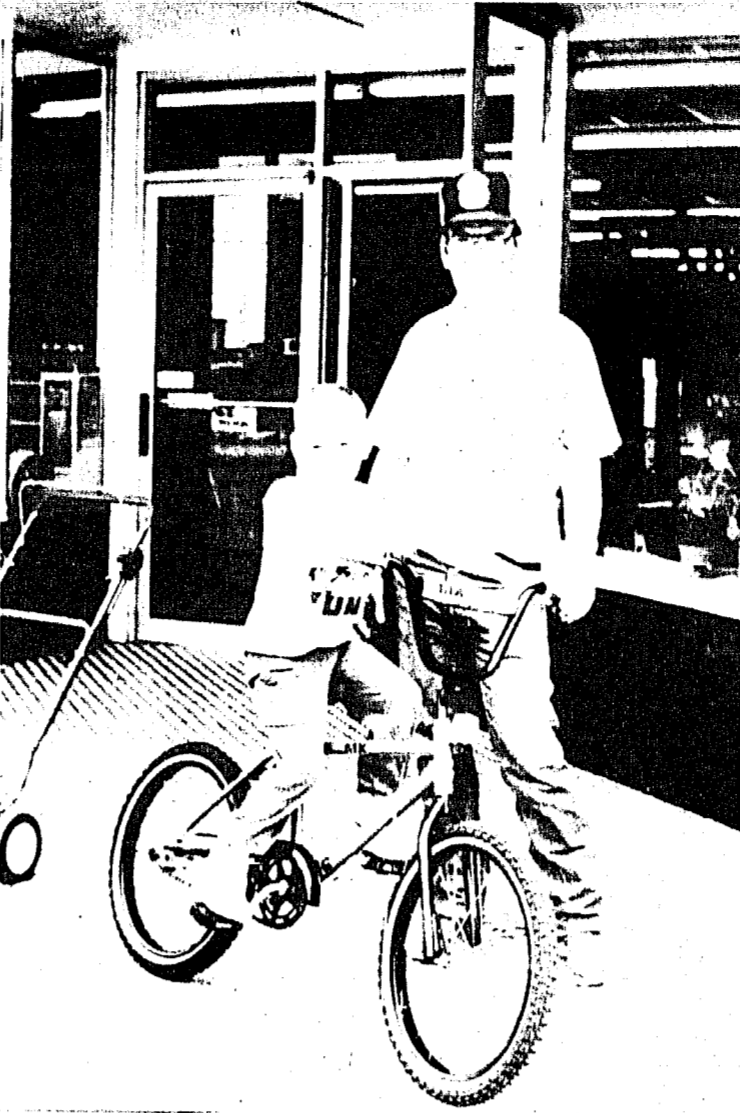

Now Is The Time To Spray For Pecan Nut Casebearer

Surveys indicate that the ideal dates to spray and control the pecan casebearer in Coleman County will be from May 28 through June 1. The spray dates are set five to eight days after eggs are found on the nutlets. This year the eggs were found on May 24. The casebearer larve (not eggs) should be killed before they enter the nutlets. Once inside, the larve are protected until they emerge from the nutlet.

County Agent Kerry Shropshire says if you are interested in checking your own trees for casebearers you need to look for greenish white eggs deposited on the outer edges and tips of the pecan nutlets. These eggs are smaller than a pin head but visible to the naked eye.

There are several insecticides that can be used for control of these insects. This is also a good time to apply zinc to these pecan trees in the same solution. This will decrease rosette problems and allow them to produce high quality nuts.

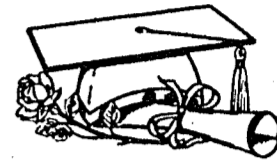

The community will miss them, as will the school system and a long list of ex-students and their parents who all wish them well.




