
Her escort was Cameron Clark. She was sponsored by Chamber of Commerce.

City Commission Meeting Held June 18th

The Gorman City Commission met in regular session on June 18, 1998 with the following present: Mayor Jack Simpson, Commissioners: Judy Morris, Robert Ervin and Donnie Rodgers and Kenneth Good. Others present were Estelle Craddock.

Robert made a motion to approve the minutes of the previous regular meeting with a second from Judy. Motion carried 4-0.

Donnie made a motion to approve the minutes of the called meeting with the correction to be added that motion was made and approved of an employee 3% raise for the new physical year. Judy made a motion and it carried 4-0.

Robert made a motion to approve the bills for payment and Judy made a second. The motion carried 4-0. There was some question about Enviro Tech, Kenneth will be sure that we have to send this many samples per month.

Hershell Cordell was present to request that the East part of Roberts Street, from Briscoe Street to Ecton, be opened back up to thru traffic. There is a problem with semi trucks fueling and not being able to turn around. The Commission said that opening this part of Roberts Street back up to truck traffic would be fine just so the trucks did not travel through down town. No motion was necessary. Signs will be relocated.

Old business, there was discussion about one of the city's rent houses. The roof was repaired on this rent house, but only a portion was being considered for repairs. When the bill was presented to the city, it included all of the roof.

Judy made a motion to negotiate the bill with the roofers and take care of the bill with the money from the insurance payment. Donnie made a second and the motion carried 3-1. Further decisions about this rent house will be made at a later date.

Further business on old business on old business was the purchase of the talapia fish. Kenneth had spoken with Mr. Arms about permits and the purchase price. This was put into abeyance.

On new business the Commission approved the street dance for the Gorman Livestock Raisers Association. Donnie made the motion to approve with a second from Robert.

Uniforms were put into abeyance until Tacy can get prices on shirts and possibly jeans.

Reorganization of the Commission was put into abeyance, and will not be put on the agenda until further notice.

On personnel Charles Buckmaster was put on a medical leave of absence due to his recent health problems. Also the Commission discussed Gaylord Battenfield taking his test for his license.

There being no further business Kenneth made a motion to adjourn with a second from Robert. Motion carried 4-0. Meeting adjourned at 6:30 p.m.
