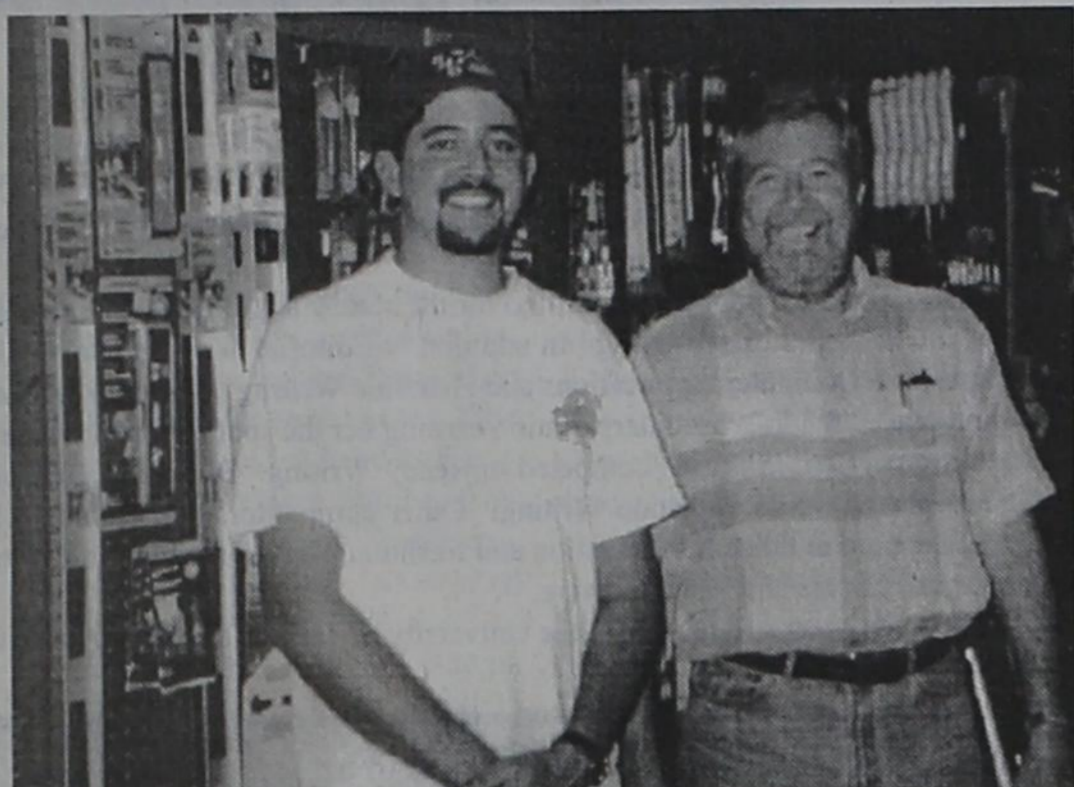

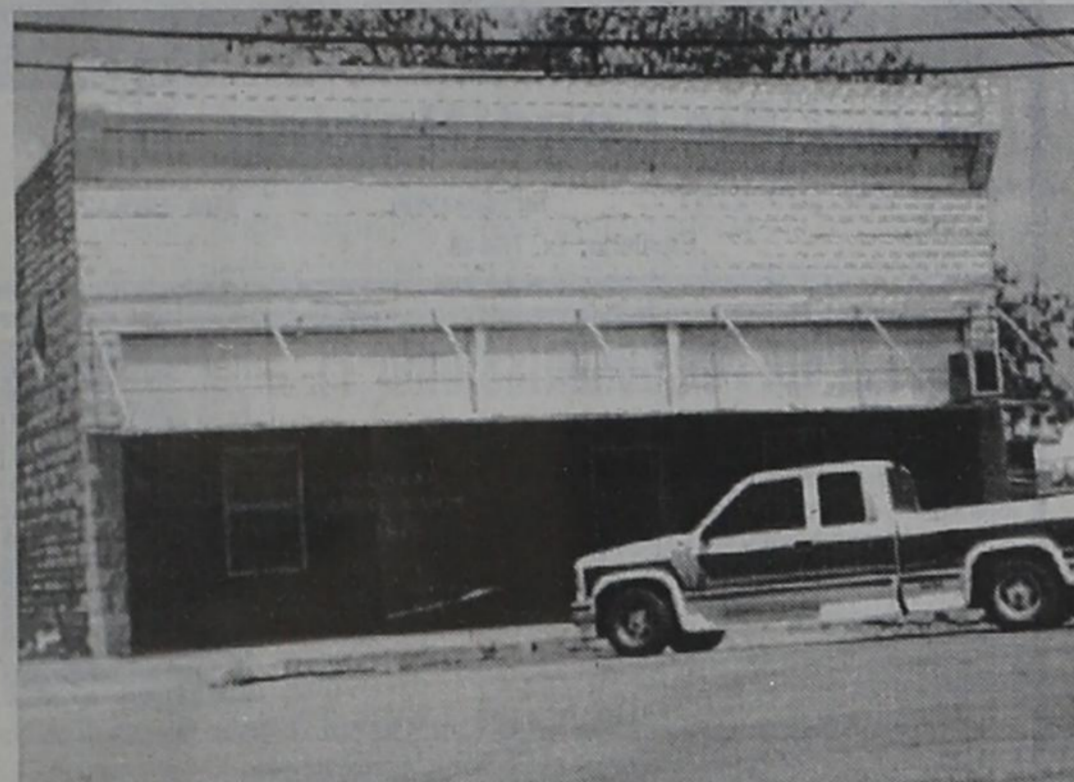

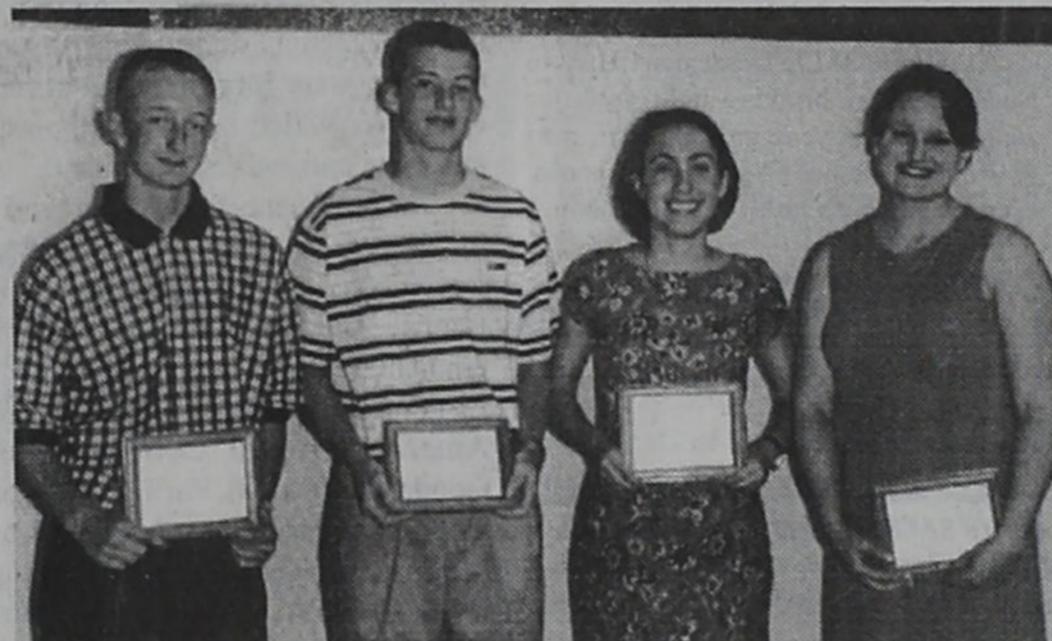

Our Community Service Award this year goes to Jackie Don Simpson, who was born and raised in Gorman. He graduated from Gorman High School in 1961, and after earning a degree from Sam Houston State University, returned to Gorman to farm peanuts for several years. He went to work for Birdsong Peanut Company and has been with them for 25 years. He started out as a buying station manager at Carbon and has moved to the Head of the Farmer Stock Acquisition for the entire Southwest. He has worked very closely with the farmers in our area, as well as all over the state of Texas and Oklahoma.

He has served one many Committees and Boards of Agriculture, such as Texas Seed Trade Association, Oklahoma Seedsman Assn., The Oklahoma Crop Improvement Assn., as well as the Southwest Sheller's Association. He has been instrumental in Birdsong's support of all local Gorman Associations, such as the Fire Department, the Baseball Association, various School organizations and functions, and the Lions' Club. He has worked closely with the FFA, and has served as Baseball Commissioner. He was elected to the City Commission in April of 1985. He helped initiate funding for the new sewer plant by applying for grants and low interest rate loans from FmHA. This kept the city sewer plant in compliance with the state. He met with the Texas Dept. of Housing and enabled the city to receive a grant for new water lines and improvements. He is currently working with the county about available funding for possible business who might be interested in opening a business in the Parnell Building.

He was appointed as Mayor of Gorman in 1991, and still serves as our Mayor at this time. He has served this city with honesty and integrity through very difficult times. He is married to the former Becky Dossey, and together they have four children, and one grandson. Our Community Service Award goes to - Jackie Don Simpson.

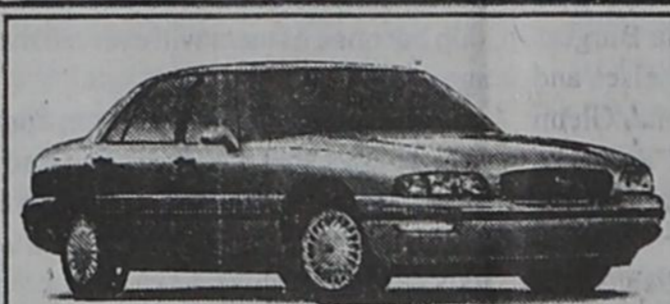

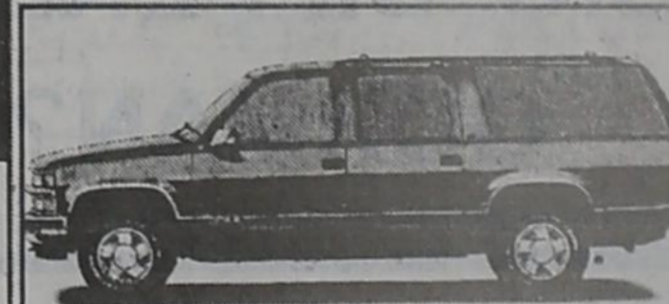
