Mailbox Vandalism Everyone Loses A Message from ine Mailbox vandalism comes in a variety of shapes and sizes from the place-
ment of objects inside the mailbox to the actual theft or destruction of the mail receptacle. Occasionally the damage is enough to cause an interruption in service until the box is repaired or replaced. Beyond the damage to the boxes, which costs the postal customer
time and money to repair or replace, time and money to repair or replace, mailbox vandalism sometimes causes the loss or destructil
U.S. Mail receptacles and the mail inside are protected by Federal law from theft, damage, and destruction. The violations are felonies which carry penalties of between three to five years imprisonment and/or fines between $\$ 1,000$ and $\$ 2,000$ per incident. The vast majority of incidents of
mailbox vandalism are the result mailbox vandalism are the result of
juveniles playing pranks or having fun The best way to prevent the destruction and vandalism of mailboxes is through public education. Everyone needs to be aware of the importance of other individuals mail, and the protec tion provided to the mail. Remember, what is intended or appears as a harmless prank, is actually against the law
and that everyone involved loses, the prankster, the customer and the community. It's your mail-protect it. Any acts of vandalism or information concerning vandalism of mailboxes should be reported immediately to the loca sheriff or police, and the local postmas
