# Proclamation

WHEREAS, the Nancy Seaberry Frost Arts Endowment and the Eastland Fine Arts Association have come together to honor and support Cultural Exchange in Eastland County. Residencies are made possible in part by funding from the National Endowment for the Arts and the Texas Commission on Arts. It is also supported by a grant from the Lila Wallace Reader's Digest Community Folklife Program, administered by the Fund for Folk Culture; and WHEREAS, the Community Residency Program brings an array of Texas' most esteemed traditional musicians to small, mostly rural Texas communities. The artists spend one week in the community conducting workshops and demonstrations, speaking to organizations and schools, and jamming with local musicians; and WHEREAS, all ethnic groups have a strong musical history that is traditionally performed and is sometimes referred to as its "folk music:; and WHEREAS, in Texas, the Spanish term "conjunto" refers not only to a musical group, but also to a distinctive style of dance music involving use of the accordion, bass, drums, and bajo sexto, a Mexican instrument which looks much like a typical guitar but adds six bass strings. Conjunto is truly the result of Cultural interchange over the Texas-Mexican border, the style developed around 1900, following an influx of Germans and Slavs into Northeastern Mexico and communities in South Texas; and WHEREAS, Santiago is the son and namesake of one of the great pioneers of Tex-Mex conjunto music. He began his career as an accordionist at 13, forming his first conjunto in 1957. In an effort to keep the tradition alive, Santiago performs many original songs composed by his father some forty years ago, which have become part of the local repertoire; and NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved, that I, Brad Stephenson, County Judge of Eastland County, Texas do hereby PROCLAIM MAY 17-24, 1999 AS CULTURAL EXCHANGE WEEK HONORING SANTIAGO JIMENEZ, JR., co-sponsored by Nancy Seaberry Frost Arts Endowment and Eastland Fine Arts Association, within Eastland County, Texas and urge all citizens of Eastland County to recognize this week.

# **PROPERTY TAX PROTESTS AND APPEAL PROCEDURES**

The law gives property owners the right to protest actions concerning their property tax appraisals. You may follow these procedures if you have a concern about:

- the value placed on your property
- any exemptions that may apply to you
- the cancellation of an agricultural appraisal
- the taxable status of your property

 the local government which should be taxing your property

- any action taken by the appraisal district that adversely affected you.

### Informal Review

Contact the appraisal district staff at 254-629-8597 in Eastland, Texas for an informal review.

### Review by the Appraisal Review Board

If you can't resolve your problem informally with the appraisal district staff, you may have your case heard by the appraisal review board (ARB).

The appraisal review board (ARB) is an independent board of citizens that reviews problems with appraisal and other concerns listed above. It has the power to order the appraisal district to make the necessary changes to solve problems. If you file a written request for an ARB hearing (called a notice of protest) before the deadline, the ARB will set your case for a hearing. You'll receive written notification of the time, date, and place of the hearing. The hearing will be informal. You and the appraisal district representative will be asked to present evidence about your case. The ARB will make its decision based on the evidence presented. You can get a copy of a protest form from

### Deadline For Filing Protests With The ARB\*

### Usual Deadline

On or before May 31 (or 30 days after a notice of appraised value was mailed to you, whichever is later).

Late protests are allowed if you miss the usual deadline for good cause. Good cause is some reason beyond your control, like a medical emergency. The ARB decides whether you have good cause.





the appraisal district office located on the second floor of the Eastland County Courthouse, Eastland, Texas.

NOTE: You shouldn't try to contact ARB members outside of the hearing. The law requires ARB members to sign an affidavit saying that they haven't talked about your case before the ARB hears it.

### **Review of the District Court**

After it decides your case, the ARB must send you a copy of it's order by certified mail. If you're not satisfied with the decision, you have the right to appeal to district court. If you choose to go to court, you must start the process by filing a petition within 45 days of the date you receive the ARB's order. If the appraisal district has appraised your property at \$1,000,000 or more, you must file a notice of appeal with the chief appraiser within 15 days of the date you receive the ARB's order.

the determination was mailed to you.

For ARB changes (the ARB has informed you of a change that increased tax liability and the change didn't result from a protest you filed), the deadline is before the 30th day after the notice of determination was mailed to you.

If you believe the appraisal district or ARB should have sent you a notice and did not, you may file a protest until the day before taxes become delinquent (usually February 1). The ARB decides whether it will hear your case based on evidence about whether a required notice was mailed to you.

\*The deadline is postponed to the next business day if it falls on a weekend or holiday.


