The Runoff Election will be held on April 11th and voters must stay with the Party they voted with in the Primary Election.

The last day to Register to VOTE in this Election will be March 13th. Early voting will be held April 3 thru 7 at the County Clerk's office.

The Primary election and the Run Off will help choose names of the Candidates who will appear on the November 7th General Election ballots. Both elections are very important and hopefully the county will have a good turnout.






