Judge Steven R. Herod Seeks Re-Election

On November 7 the voters of Eastland County will select the individual who will serve as judge of the 91st District Court for the next four years. By their selection the voters will be telling us all which specific qualities, characteristics and factors they believe a candidate for judicial office should possess.

In my opinion, there are many factors which, when combined, make a good judge. The best judges are the ones who have a broad knowledge of the law, are patient, fair, are harsh when necessary, and listen to all sides before making a decision which is consistent with the law. A judge must be above reproach and must have the respect of his peers, not only professionally, but by all who appear before him. I believe I have these qualities and that Governor George W. Bush recognized these things in me when he appointed me judge of the 91st District Court more than five years ago.

I believe that since the District Court is a trial court, a candidate for this office should be a person who has tried many difficult cases - both to the

Court and to a jury. In the past five and one-half years I have presided over many difficult criminal, civil, family and juvenile cases, some of which were tried to a jury, many more of which were tried to the Court. Prior to becoming judge, I tried many difficult

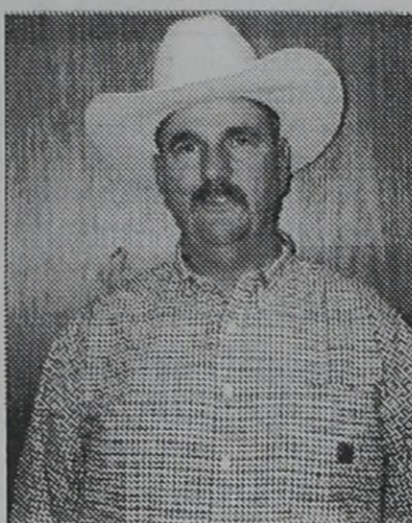

Panthers Defeated By May; Host Mountaineers Friday

The Gorman Panthers traveled to May on Friday to meet the Tigers in a 12A District game and came out on the short end of a 28-8 score. The first period was played fairly even terms but the tigers scored 15 in the second period and 13 in the third to lead 28-0 at the end of the third, the Panthers came back with 1:38 left in the 4th and scored to make the final score 28-8 after holding the Tigers scoreless in the 4th period.

May hit the scoreboard first in the second period when they took the ball on their own 37 and scored in 9 plays with Kyle Ribble getting the final 18 yards on a run with 5:08 left in the period. Cody Wade got the 2 point conversion on a run to make the score 8-0.

Then on their next possession the Tigers took the ball on their own 29 and moved

the distance in 7 plays with Jeff Tischler catching a 26 yard pass from Ribble for the score with 2:14 left in the half. Cooper Thornhill booted the point after and May was up 15-0 at halftime.

The Gorman Panther Marching Band performed in full uniform at the intermission and turned in a great performance.

Following the halftime the tigers got the kickoff on their own 31 and scored in 10 plays with Thornhill getting the final 14 on a run with 6:29 left in the third. The try for point failed and the Tigers led 21-0.

Then on the next Tiger possession they got the ball on the Gorman 16 and scored in 6 plays with Wade rambling in for the score from 37 yards out with 1:15 left in the third. Thornbill added the point after and May was up 28-0.

The Panthers finally got on the scoreboard late in the fourth period when they took the ball on their own 6 yard line and moved the distance in a long 16 play drive with Steven Patel getting the score from 4 yards out with 1:38 left on the clock. A pass from Longoria to Ryan Keller added the 2 pointer and the score was 28-8.

The Big Red tried an on-side kick which failed and the Tigers ran out the clock.

Patel led the Panthers with 77 yards rushing on 14 tries. Jacob McCullough had 23 on 4 carries. David Seaton got 19 on 6 tries. Josh Longoria had 20 on 3 and Ben Longoria had 15 on 2 keepers. Wade led May with 139 on 13 carries.

The Panthers will host the Santa Anna Mountaineers in their final home game of the season on Friday night at 7:30 and will end the season at Rising Star on November 10th at 7:30.

Let's all come out and back the Panthers on Friday night for the Santa Anna game and give them our support.

Campbell and Purcell Announcement Engagement

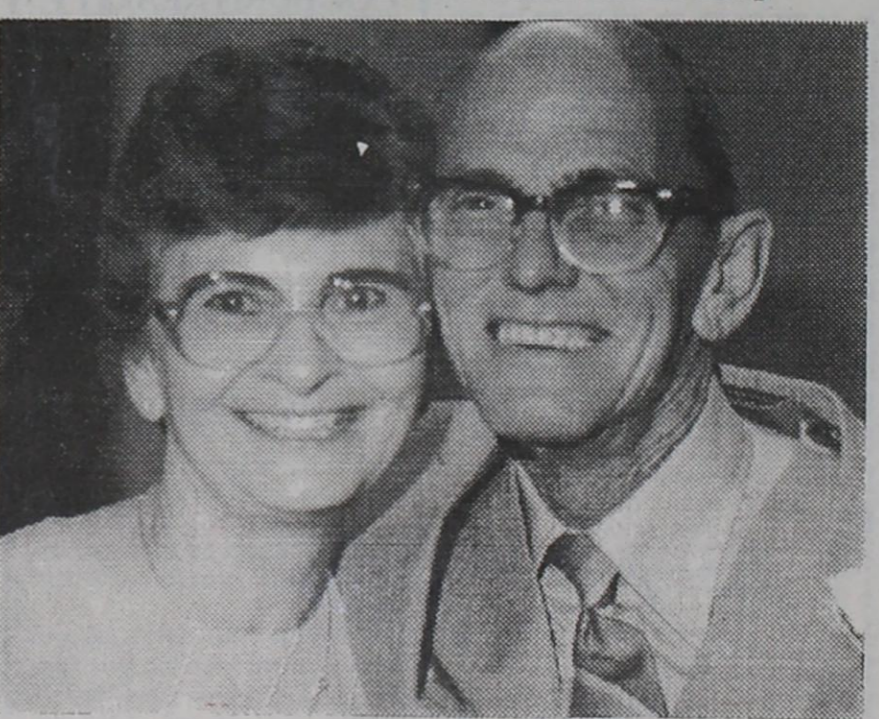

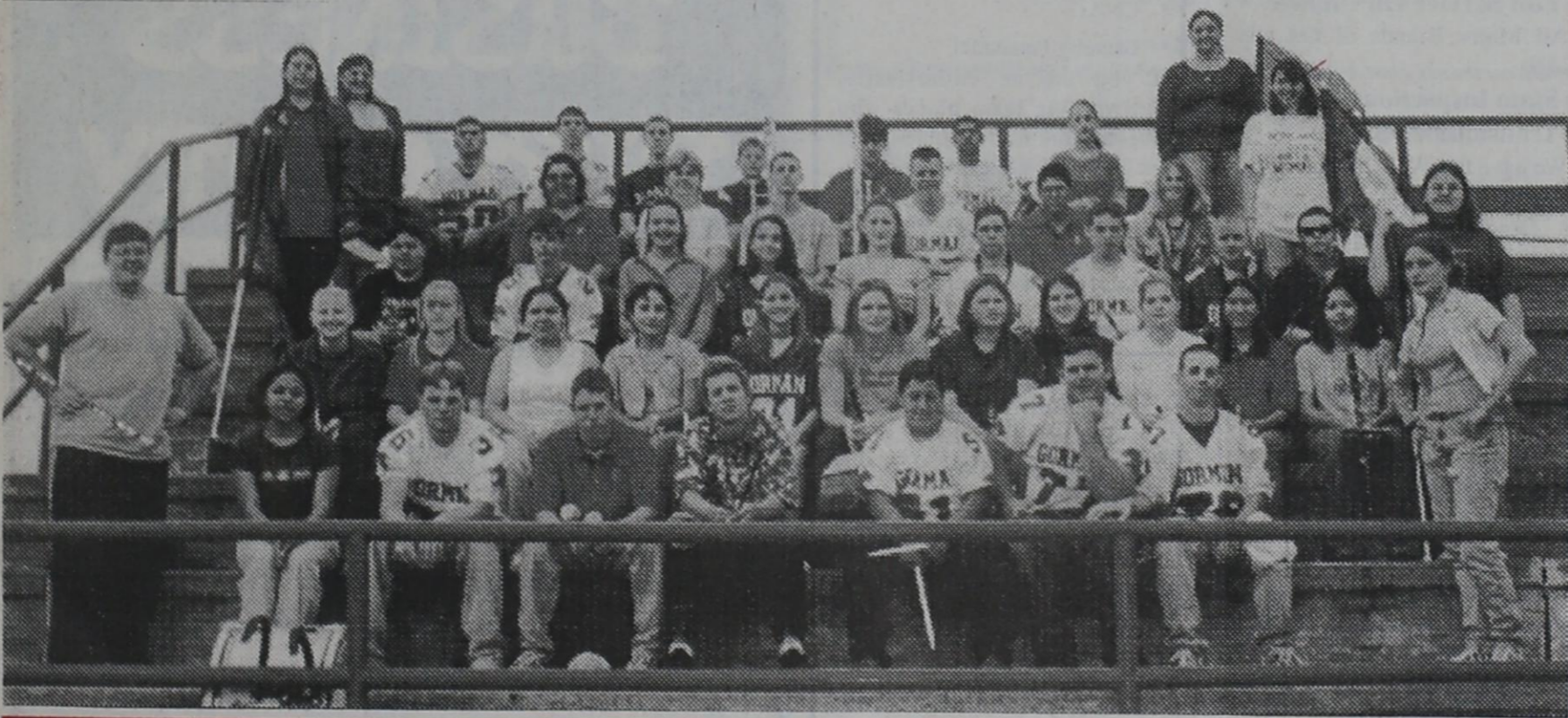

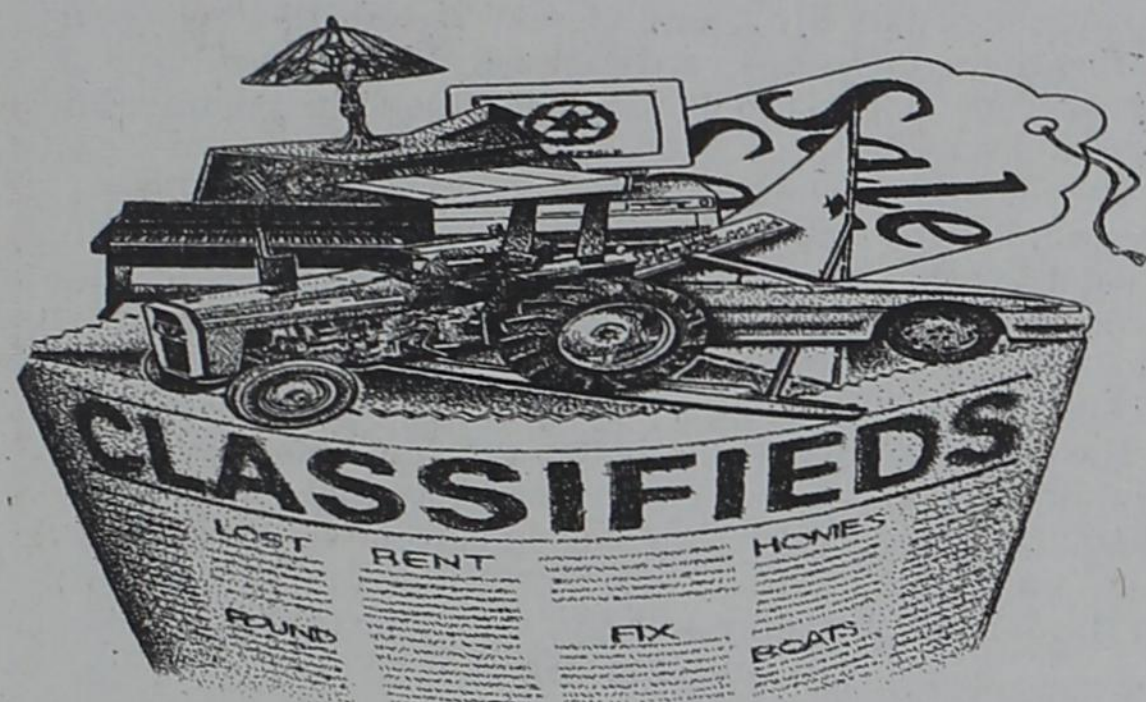

cases as an attorney practicing law here in Eastland County and the surrounding area. This was one of the factors that Governor Bush considered when he appointed me: I was the only applicant who had been actively trying criminal, civil, family and juvenile cases.

There are many reasons why you should take a personal interest in the selection of your district judge. First of all, the operations of the Court are paid for by YOU, the taxpayer. Secondly, the district court is where important decisions are made each day which may directly or indirectly affect YOU or someone you love. By way of illustration: if someone sued you for property or money; if your spouse sued you for divorce or for custody of your children; or, if you or someone you knew were accused of having committed a serious criminal offense; in Eastland County, the 91st District Court is where the case would be tried. These types of cases and others are tried throughout the year, year after year, in the 91st District Court. In other words, you should care who serves as district judge because the decisions he makes can affect your rights in property, your family, the custody of your children, or even your liberty.

Having now served as judge for more than five (5) years, I can honestly say that it has been an honor and a pleasure for me to work with and for the many fine citizens of this county. I realize, though, as I meet people coming to the court that people generally come to court for only one of two reasons: 1. They are summoned to be in court as a juror, grand juror, jury commissioner or as a witness, or 2. They (or a loved one) are a litigant in a pending suit. In either situation, a person coming to court should expect to be treated fairly, with dignity and courtesy no matter who that person may be.

I am a lifelong resident of Eastland County. My wife, Lesa, and I grew up in Ranger and attended Ranger schools. We have three children: Leah (18), Reagan (15), and Evan (9). We both attended Ranger College and Tarleton State University. I received my bachelor's degree in business administration (BBA) and graduated summa cum laude. I was admitted into law school at age 20 and graduated from Texas Tech University's School of Law at age 22. I have worked ever since as an attorney in private practice or as a trial judge for the 91st District Court and it is my experience trying cases since moving back to Ranger in 1988 that makes me the most qualified candidate for District Judge.

My parents, Bill and Sandi Herod, reside in Ranger as do Lesa's parents, Ken and Sue Grice. Lesa and I are members of the Mesquite and Rusk Street Church of Christ where I serve as a deacon. We are both active in Church, particularly with the youth and

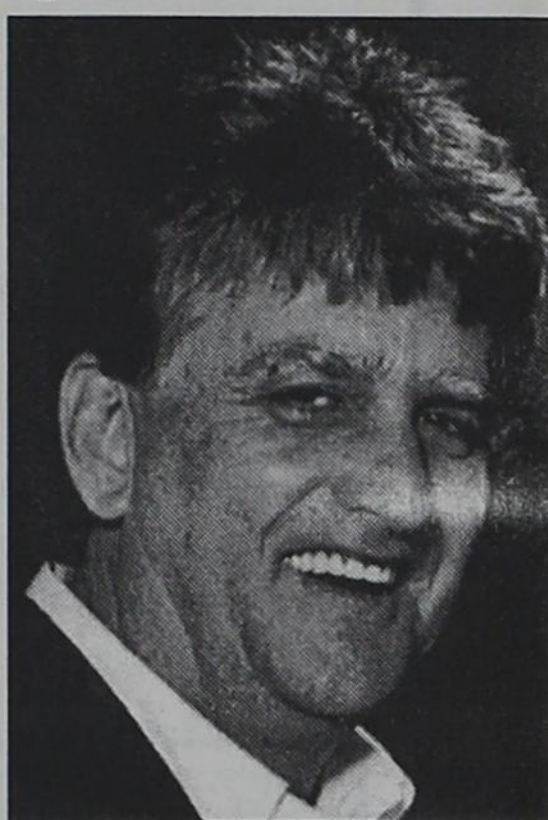

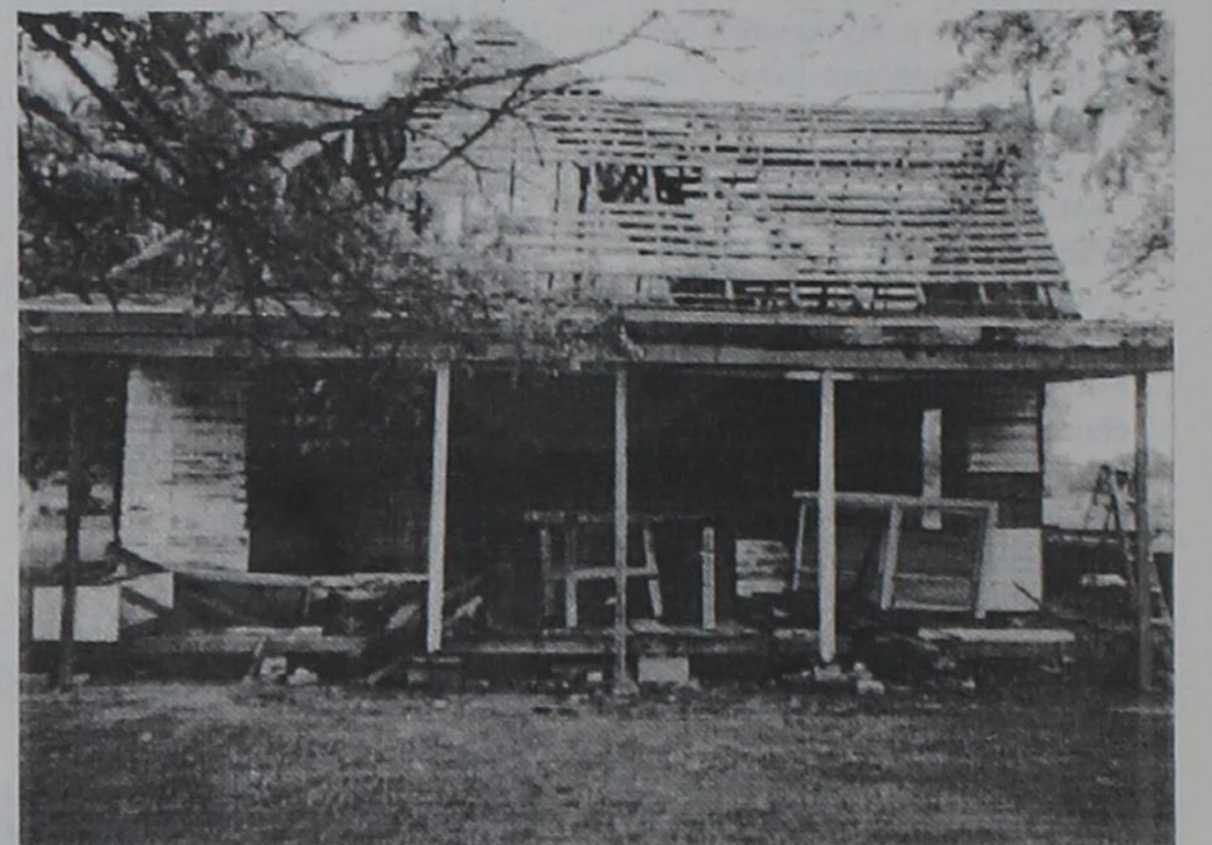

James New Candidate for County Commissioner Precinct 3, Eastland Co.

In an article last week my opponent stated that paving county roads seems to be a big issue and that he had an estimate of \$26000.00 to pave .8 mile of county road using county equipment and some county material and that he doesn't believe that much paving can be done and still care for the rest of the roads. With that kind of research and money management we will not have any paved county roads.

To me paving is an important issue. For as many years and as much money as has been spent on the roads they should be in excellent shape and some already paved.

In an earlier article I stated that I had made some cost studies and that it would be possible to pave some county roads and improve the others but with the budget cut it will not be possible to pave as many miles. I met with Mr. Bryan Neaves, District Engineer for the Texas Dept. of Highways in Eastland to get specifications, type and amount of material and application rates to pave a road such as that of a farm to market road. I also visited with Mr. Clyde Braddock, Road maintenance supervisor V, as to the equipment needed and application method to do this type paving. I also called the suppliers of the materials needed for their cost and recommendation applications. With their cost estimates and my own, it is my belief that a mile of county road can be topped for approximately \$3500.00 per mile.

After this years budget cut, Pct. 3 is allowed \$1066.85 per mile to maintain the roads. The cost to do the .8 mile of road Mr. Underwood referred to was done for a cost of \$2712.11, (\$3390.14 per mile). These figures are a matter of public information. This being the case, the \$3500. should pave more than a mile of road.

I have also stated that I am very concerned about the way the budget was set this year. One man set a 4 million dollar budget. I believe that no man should have that authority. The commissioners were told that it is against the law to have tax funds held in reserve as a road and bridge fund.

Since funding for the budget is approximately half tax funds and half other funds, it seems to be that the reserve funds taken from the precincts should be returned or at least half of it should be returned. By law the commissioners can set statutes (laws and rules) relating to Road and Bridge care. If we have a commissioner that has the knowledge and ability then a statute can be enacted that will allow the commissioners to have a savings account accumulate from these OTHER funds. Now allowing the commissioners to accumulate a savings account will create waste and even promote waste because if they have any funds left at the end of the year it will be pulled back into the general budget and distributed to those that are wasteful and poorly managed. No tax cuts.

I think that property tax is unfair for property owners. We pay county, school, city, hospital district and any other taxing entity taxes. I have a tax plan that can eventually eliminate this tax and even provide more funding for the county. I have discussed this with a lot of knowledgeable people and they agree that it is a workable plan. It will take too long to explain it here but I will introduce it to the commissioners court for their consideration and action if elected.

I will work with any economic development group to help bring industry into our county. I will also help the towns in the precinct with streets and paving.

I believe that with my education, experience in accounting, finance and

administrative supervision will qualify me to better represent you in managing the county's business. As owner of a dirt contracting company and being an experienced heavy equipment operator, I am qualified to build and maintain the precinct roads.

If you will elect me as your county commission I will represent you honestly and in the best interest of pct. 3 and of Eastland County.

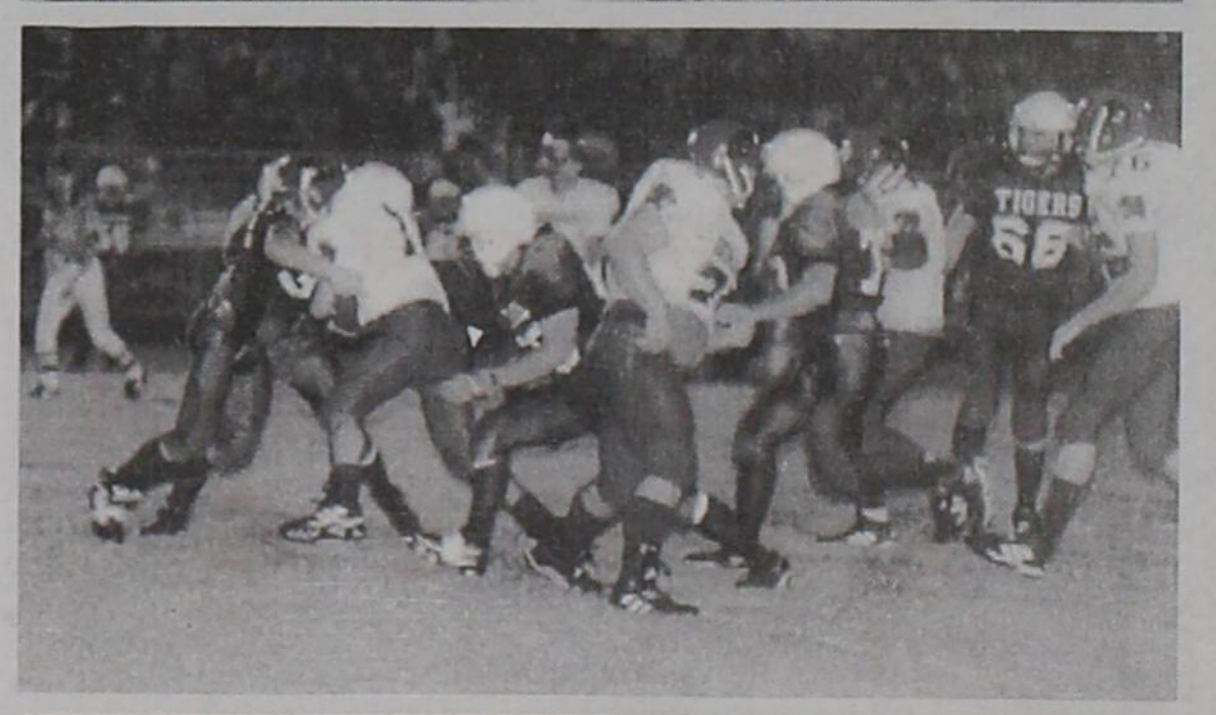

Pause To Think

It is needful this week to discuss the issue of spiritual community in our city. Saturday, the Gorman Church of Christ canvassed Gorman with Doctrinal tracts. I admire and commend them for this.

However, as I was reading through the tracts early Sunday morning, I was disappointed. There are two reasons for my disappointment

1. Spiritual Community
 2. Jack H. William's declaration against baptism of the Holy Spirit
- It occurred to me as I was reading that every church in our city believes and teaches the five points of doctrine that are displayed in the tract titled "What Must I Do To Be Saved"? This is a disappointment to others and me. You, the members of the Gorman Church of Christ are our friends and neighbors. We come together on many issues, triumphs, difficulties, and tragedies that come to our city. I feel it is time to consider how important it is for us to come together concerning spiritual matters. It is time to break down barriers and establish strong Spiritual Community. *Till we all come in the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God,

unto a perfect man, unto the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ: Ephesians 4:13

Also, it disappoints and frightens me when declarations are made against the Holy Spirit of God. There are several reasons for this and it would be impossible for me to enumerate them all here in this space allocated to **Pause To Think**. But, I would like to mention a couple of them.

Christ died so that we could be redeemed and to bring into being a better thing. **Hebrews 11:40** The baptism of the Holy Spirit is none other than the comforter of whom the following scriptures speak: **Lamentations 1:16, John 14:16, John 14:26, John 15:26, John 16:7, I John 2:1**. It is a puzzle to me why people feel that the baptism of the Holy Spirit is not important to the Church of Christ (*I speak in a general sense. I too believe that I am in Christ's Church.*) It is impossible to ignore all the scriptures that speak of this. **John 7:39, John 20:22, Matthew 3:11, Luke 3:16**

Speaking against the Holy Spirit of God borders on blasphemy. Blasphemy against the Holy Spirit is a dangerous thing. There are many verses in the Bible that speak of this. **Mark 3:28-29, Acts 26:9-11, Luke 12:10, Hebrews 6:4-6**

Please note this article is not intended to be harsh, critical, slanderous, or reprimanding. Hopefully, it will not be taken as such. I speak from a genuine desire that all in our city come to revival and a spiritual awakening.
