terest rate of five percent and are scheduled for repayconsistent with the applicant's reasonable ability to pay. Loans beyond actual
losses have various maturities, depending upon the purpose of the loan. The interest rate for actual
loss loans is five percent. loss loans is five percent.
Other loans are being made at an interest $t$ rate of thirteen
and one-half $(131 / 2)$ percent. and one-half $\left(13^{1 / 2}\right)$ percent. To be eligible for an emer-
gency loan, an applicant must have suffered losses from the disaster and be
unable to get credit from unable to get
other sources.
