CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS Almost a hundred proposals for amending the constitution of the United States were submitted to the first session of the Sixty-eighth congress. One of these proposed amendments, introduced by Senator Norming in the dates of the annual meeting of congress and the inauguration of the president, passed the senate on March 18 by the substantial vote of 63 to 7, but was not voted on in the house of representavoted on in the house of representatives. 





Born the son of a truckman on the lower East Side of New York, Smith had few advantages in early life. He went to parochial school, and while still a youth, took charge of his father's trucking business. His first job was in the old Fulton fish market, where he got around to work at 6 a. m. except on Fridays, when 5 a. m. was his hour to begin work. Seeing no future or money in his work, he began to look for tther work, and in 1895 he received his first political job, primarily, as he put it, because "it paid more money." This appointment was a clerkship in the office of the New York commissioner of jurors.

At that time Smith had no idea of making politics his vocation. His father died, and Smith's financial support was needed at home. So he stuck to his job and gradually became interested. In 1909 he was elected to the assembly. He continued in the lower house of the legislature for 12 years, serving as democratic floor leader in that body in 1911 and 1912, and in 1913 became speaker, one of the most powerful positions in the state government.
