tional Labor Bureau under the terms of the Versailles treaty, the various international labor conferences that have since been held, including the original one at Washington in 1919, that of Genoa in 1920 and the three successive ones at Geneva in 1921, 1922 and 1923 have drafted thirtysix international conventions and recommendations relating to the adjustment of labor conditions.

To date these thirty-six conventions, of which the most important one is that of the eight-hour day,

have received a tital of 133 ratifications in the various countries.


