

Labor Disputes By United Press. MOSCOW .- Workers who are discharged can go to court about it, un-der the soviet labor laws. Special "labor sessions" of the lower courts are held to hear cases of complaints against being "fired," or other complains such as the rate of wages. If the force of workers is to be re duced, the law provides that widowed or divorced women with children must be the last of all discharged. Workers whose husbands or wives are earning good salaries must be the first dismissed when a reduction in personnel is contemplated. Also, the law forbids an employer to dismiss a wombids are salaries. an worker who is an expectant mother. Such women are entitled to a month's vacation with pay before the birth of a child and to another with pay after the birth.
