

New York, March 16.—In defending themselves against criticism that they underpay their athletes, owners of major lengue baseball clubs claim that the average rate of pay is higher for a baseball player than that of many other professions.

Considering the time actually spent in their work, baseball players make much more money than they could in an average white collar job or in the overalls of a mechanic but their pay does not compare to that of boxers, wrestlers and even bike riders.

It is well known to the public what the heavyweight boxing champions and prominent boxers in the lower classes.

In less than three years Paul Berlenbach cleared a fortune of close to \$300,000 and retired. Dempsey made more than a million dollars and his successor Gene Tunney will have as much if he succeeds in holding the title for any considerable length of time.

least by bloody incidents caused on our territory by armed Italian banes, and our territory by armed Italian banes, and the process of the Storder.

Events moved rapidly. The Franco-Talian border for years had been about as peaceful as the frontier between the United States and Canada, But now the French government took action to meet the situation at her southeastern frontier. Into the peaceful Riviera region, one of the world's most famous playrounds, moved thousands of poilus. At the fortified places of the Alps, which had been stripped of men, cannon and munitions, cannon rolled back into place thousands of troops again took up station and stocks of munitions were established. Tanks even rolled through Nice. The French Mediterranean squadron drew up off the Riviera. Even in Tunisia, though it was not known at the time, France took similar military and naval precautions to protect her territory.






