| The Texico Varsity Wolverines met Floyd in Bronco gym and the fate of Friday the 13th was against Texico as Floyd topped the Wolverines 63-52. <br> Floyd's Broncos galloped past the Wolverines in the first quarter of action to take a 3-8 lead. The Wolverines rallied during the second period to pump in a total of 15 additional points to pull their score up to 23. The Broncos were able to sink 10 more points to give them 23 and the teams retired to the dressing rooms at halftime in a $23-23$ draw <br> The Broncos regrouped their efforts when play resumed and dropped in 19 points to out-do the Wolverines who came up with 14. The Floyd team was in the lead $42-37$ when the fourth stanza of action got underway Floyd slammed 21 points through the hoop and held Texico to 15 during the final period and were declared victorious by a $63-52$ decision. <br> Leading the scoring for Texico was Roger Pace who dropped in 25 points on 11 of 30 field goals and three of five free throws. Also scoring in double figures for the Wolverines was Steve Harrington. Harrington popped the net for 12 points on six of an attempted 16 field goals. Other Wolverines adding to the scoring effort were Jimmy <br> Ortiz, two of seven field goals for four points; Max Winkles, two of six field goals for four points; O'Jay Autrey, one of three field goals for two; Randy Cain, one of two field goals for two; and Barry Lindley, one of six attempted field goals for two points. <br> Pace also paved the way for the Wolverines in the rebounding department as he picked 19 from the backboard. Other rebounds were credited to Ortiz, six; Winkles, three; and Harrington and Lindley, one reWolverine team statistics reveal 24 of 70 attempted field goals successful for 34 percent and three of nine free throws for 33 percent.
