Until now, if a resident did not pay the water bill, the city would send out a person to deliver a 'disconnect notice' to the house. This is a problem because it involves several people and takes several hours a month to complete. Plus, the city had to wait several days from the date the notice went out before they could legally stop the
Starting next month, if a bill isn't paid, than the next bill that goes out will be clearly stamped "Disconect". If the resident doesn't contact City Hall, the city will then cut he water
