During his high school career, he was a member of National Honor Society, Student Council, and FCA.

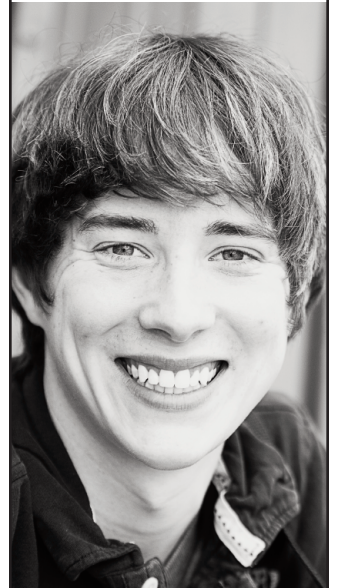
He participated in football, basketball, tennis, track, One-Act Play, and several UIL academic teams. He is an active member of the youth group at the First Baptist Church of Farwell.

Texico folks asked to start voluntary water conservation measures

Citizens of Texico were asked by the City Council May 10 to begin voluntary water conservation measures.

Street Supt. Darryl Stanton said that he wants folks to water their properties on a set schedule:

Odd numbered addresses -- Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday; and even numbered houses -- Wednesday, Friday and Sunday.

With the ongoing drought in the area, this will help keep the city water as high as possible.

In other news, the council:

- Appointed Lewis Cooper as Texico's rep to the Eastern Plains Council of Governments, and Carolyn Johnson as alternate.

- Heard the engineer who had been working on the wastewater plant for Texico has left the engineering firm, but will still work on the project to get the permits needed to continue work.

- Looked at taking out a loan for \$200,000 for the Phase 2 water project that will connect two water wells to the city water system.

- Was asked by Roland Goforth for a variance to put in more than one mobile home on his property. Letters will be sent out to neighbors and it will be on the next agenda.

- Heard that Stanton will open the city pool this year on June 1. He asked for permission to hire lifeguards to clean and prepare the pool.

- Heard Councilman Doug Scioli report that the Texico EMS received a \$8,700 dollar grant toward another power gurney. The EMS hopes to raise the rest of the money at the June 4 Bike Run.

The power stretcher is important for smaller or older members of EMS who have to pick up folks who weigh several hundred pounds.

State Track Champions...

With two fast stepping relay teams leading the way, the Lazbuddie Longhorns last week rolled to the state Class B track and field championship at Austin by compiling 40 points to runner-ups Leuders' 30.

It was the first time in the 51-year history of the meet that a Panhandle area team won a state track championship, and it took only four lads from the Parmer County school to turn the trick.

Lazbuddie's 440-yard relay team, made up of Odis Bradshaw, Billy Hardage, R.L. Porter and Freddie Savage, clipped off a blistering 43.5 time to give the Longhorns their only first place in the meet.

These four athletes accounted for all of Lazbuddie's points. The 440 relay victory gave Lazbuddie 20 points and then the same four boys turned right around and ran a 3:24.7 mile relay, which was good for 2nd place and another 16 points.

Hardage turned in a 50.4 time in the 440 yard run to win 4th place and give the Longhorns another four points.

The mile relay team was just barely nosed out by the Leuders foursome which turned in a time of 3:24.4. Both Lazbuddie and Leuders ran the race faster than the previous state record of 3:29.0.

Lazbuddie's clocking in both the 440 and mile relays were the fastest the Longhorn sprinters had turned in all season. Their winning time of 43.5 in the 440 was shy of the state record, which was 42.9.

Besides the relay team and Bradshaw in the 440 yard run, two other Lazbuddie boys qualified for the finals in Friday's preliminaries.

Bradshaw ran with both relay teams also qualified for the finals of the 220, but chose not to run because the race came off shortly before the mile relay. He qualified Friday with a time of 22.4.

Jimmy Seaton qualified for the finals in the 120 yard high hurdles and was well on his way to what looked like at least a 2nd place finish when he fell over the last hurdle and failed to place.

The hurdles race was so close that the split second Seaton lost on the last hurdle cost him a place in the event. Despite the lost time, he was still clocked at 15.6.

Two other boys who made the trip to the state meet were Cooper Young, alternate on the mile relay team, and Mike Bean, alternate on the 440 relay team.

The Lazbuddie thinclads, coached by Bobby Crooks, achieved the goal they set out to reach at the start of the season. The team won district in 1959, won both district and regional in 1960, and this year made it all the way.

In all, the Lazbuddie team won a total of 18 trophies.

The State Line Tribune published a special 4-page supplement with its May 18, 1961, issue to congratulate the great Lazbuddie sports achievements. Here are some excerpts from that special issue of 50 years ago:

Making Panhandle History...

Lazbuddie Longhorns, in walking off with the state's Class B track and field championship in Austin, made Panhandle sports history.

Never before in the inter-scholastic league meets' 51-year history has any team of any classification from the Texas Panhandle region been able to snare a track championship.

At least that was what was reported by the Amarillo Daily News and the area's leading daily publication should have records on this if anyone does.

One thing for certain is that it's the first time a Class B team from this region has won the title.

While the Texas Panhandle has had its share of state titlists in basketball and football, for some odd reason the boys from downstate have always had an edge on our area when it comes to track.

It's hard to understand why the Panhandle has ever had a state track champion, in view of the fact that they fared so well in other sports, but an explanation for this oddity has been the weather.

With the spring track season coming at a time when this time normally has a great deal of wind and blowing sand, it has been pointed out by "authorities" on the matter that this has an effect on the athletes.

There are many days when track teams can't work out in our area, while downstate this situation doesn't exist.

In winning the state meet, the Lazbuddie team could also claim to another sports first. It was the first time that a Parmer County athletic team had won a state championship. The Friona girls basketball team came close in 1959 when they took 2nd at State, and the Bovina boys basketball team won 3rd a few years ago.

Greatest Year Ever...

The year 1960-61 was the greatest year ever recorded in the annals of Lazbuddie sports history and it may be sometime before Parmer County's small school district equals it again.

Besides the district, regional and state championships the Longhorn track team won, Lazbuddie School also produced the district football champion and the district baseball titlist this year.

That's a record that will be hard to equal. The school's basketball team also had one of its most successful seasons, in compiling a 26-4 record but had to settle in 2nd place in district to Bovina.

Lazbuddie won the district round robin schedule in basketball with an 8-0 record, but lost to the Mustangs in the best 2 of 3 playoff games. Bovina was the only school Lazbuddie lost to all season.

The Longhorn football team, coached by John Bond and Bobby Crooks, compiled a 4-0 conference record and a 7-1 overall record, before bowing to Groom in the Bi-District playoff.

The baseball team won the district title. Then, the Longhorns won Bi-District with a 25-2 win over Darrouzett. Bi-District was the last baseball playoff game scheduled in Texas at that time.

Lazbuddie FCCLA students staged a Shattered Dreams program last week at the school.

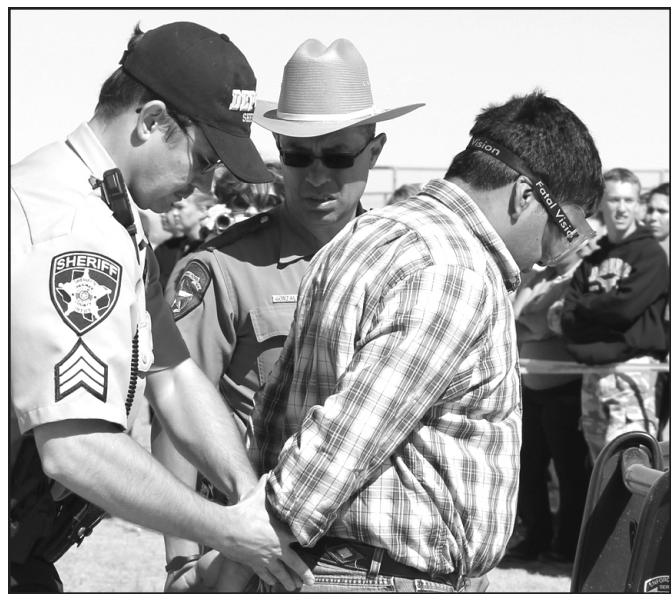

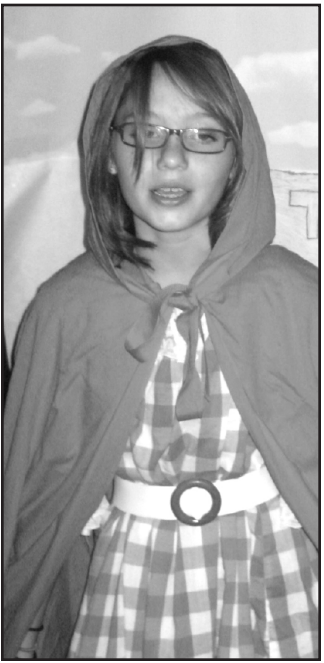
Texico Elementary School presents living literature

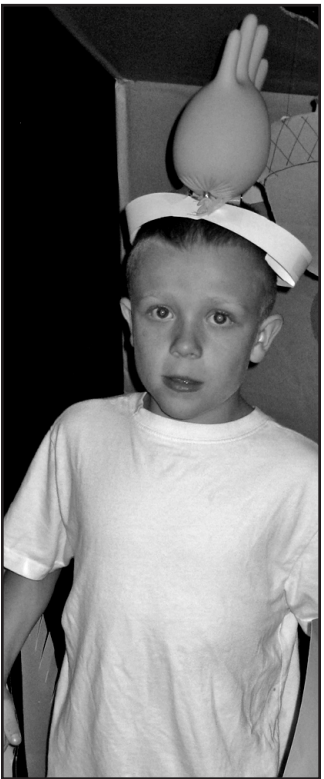
This "brain-based" learning technique transforms a simple reading assignment into an adventure for the pupils in which books are transformed into much more than just words on a page.

From Parmer County extension agent Benji Henderson:

Most producers across the county are in the height of planting the 2011 crop. Many are reporting to be finished planting this year's irrigated cotton crop.

Cool, dry temperatures seem to be the norm which can cause some problems and delayed emergence of the cotton. There also needs to be some precipitation so that we can get a dryland crop up and going. There still has been little to no precipitation across the county.

Much of the dry land will soon begin to be "dry" planted in hopes of getting some rain to get it up. Some warm days are also needed so that we can begin to get some heat unit accumulation as well as get emergence of the crop.

The cool morning temperatures can cause some chilling damage to young cotton plants as they begin to swell and sprout.

Obviously, like you, I was thrilled that our Navy Seals killed Osama bin Laden.

Now let's take a look at the big picture.

To recap, just after 9/11, I predicted a 100-year war with Moslem extremists. In the past 10 years, I have given updates on this battle about twice a year.

As I pointed out recently, the battles are fierce in Africa with extremist Moslems doing their best to annihilate Christians in places like Nigeria, and Sudan.

So how does the Al-Qaeda leader's demise tie into this?

Sure, it's a big plus. The man had charisma in some part of the Moslem world and his death hurts the extremists' cause.

But how does it shape up in the long run?

What we must remember is that Al-Qaeda is but one of many Moslem extremist groups. There are terrorist groups throughout the Moslem world that may call themselves "Al-Qaeda," but in reality had nothing to do with bin Laden.

These extremist groups are not going away. There is going to be a lot of fierce warfare coming down the pike.

To me, what is happening in the Arab world recently is more important than bin Laden's death. I'm speaking of the uprisings against dictators in Egypt, Tunisia, Yemen, Libya, Iran and Syria.

This is the most positive news since 9/11.

And who should get a lot of the credit for that, but won't?

George W. Bush.

When President Bush sent our troops into Iraq, he stressed that bringing freedom to Iraq could have a profound effect on the region.

He was right. But I bet you won't find a liberal in the entire U.S. who

would give him credit for that.

I have never criticized President Bush for his decision to go to war with Saddam Hussein because I believe that every one of us, including me, would have made the same decision based on the intel available at the time.

Yes, it's been a hard time for our troops in Iraq since that invasion. You all know my feelings about the horrifying decision that our "leaders" made in disbanding the Iraqi army, thus causing the unnecessary deaths and injuries to thousands of our troops.

So now, in 2011, we are drawing down in that nation and apparently leaving a decent democracy in place. How long that will last I don't know. But I want to be optimistic and that, especially in view of the Arab Spring, it will hold.

I believe that the growing democracy in Iraq has had a ripple effect on the other nations I mentioned above. And that means President Bush was right.

In putting this Arab Spring into the perspective of our 100-year war with Moslem extremists, this is a very promising event.

Extremists fare better under dictatorships. More young people struggle with those binds and turn to violence to get changes made. And when the U.S. aligns itself with those dictatorships (re: our support of the Shah of Iran), hatred is directed toward us.

Since we are in the midst of the uprisings in North Africa and the Middle East, it's way too early to see how it will turn out down the road. But it's a definite plus in our war with terrorism.

And we should thank President Bush for that.

Bovina council reviews commercial property codes

The Bovina City Council on May 9 reviewed the city codes for commercial property.

Residences that currently exist in areas designated for businesses can remain under a "grandfather clause." However, as they change hands in the future, those properties will be reverted back to only commercial uses as a part of the city goal of increasing the number of businesses in town.

Council members also discussed the operation of the roll-off box site for the disposal of refuse at the Bovina site, for which the city of Bovina now receives the bill.

The Parmer County Commissioners Court had voted on May 9 to pay half of the costs for roll-off box removal and replacement at that site over the next three months.

The city council voted instead of that to simply prohibit the use of the city's refuse disposal site to anyone who is not a resident of the city of Bovina. Those persons who wish to dispose of waste at that site can go to Bovina's city hall to pay the fee and to obtain the key to unlock the site's gate.

A valid driver's license and any utility bill paid to the city will be required to confirm the applicant is a Bovina city resident.

In other business, the council:

-- Approved a budget amendment for a \$1,000 donation to the Texas Police Chiefs.

-- Approved the contract with Perdue, Brandon, Fielder, Collins, and Mott for its services in the collection of delinquent fines for traffic and other violations.

-- Approved an ordinance through which violators and not the city will pay the additional costs of processing and collecting that delinquent fines make necessary.

-- Incorporated the Fire Department and Emergency Medical Service by-laws into the city code.
