









## Recipe of Week

### Crazy Crunch

- 1/2 c. all - purpose flour
- 1/4 c. Parmesan cheese
- 2 Tbs. cornstarch
- 2 tsp. garlic salt
- 1/2 c. beer
- 1 (12 oz.) can mixed nuts
- 1 (6 oz.) box Brownberry rye croutons

Combine flour, cheese, cornstarch, garlic and beer. Beat with a rotary beater until blended. Fold in nuts and croutons; stir until coated. Spread in greased 10 x 15 - inch baking pan. Bake at 300 degrees for 45 minutes, stirring occasionally. Cool.

While far too difficult for the average seventh grader, these bright seventh graders scoring at or above the 98th percentile on other standardized achievement or aptitude tests. Mrs. Farris expressed her congratulations to these students, and praised their academic achievements which assure their selection for inclusion in this very prestigious program.

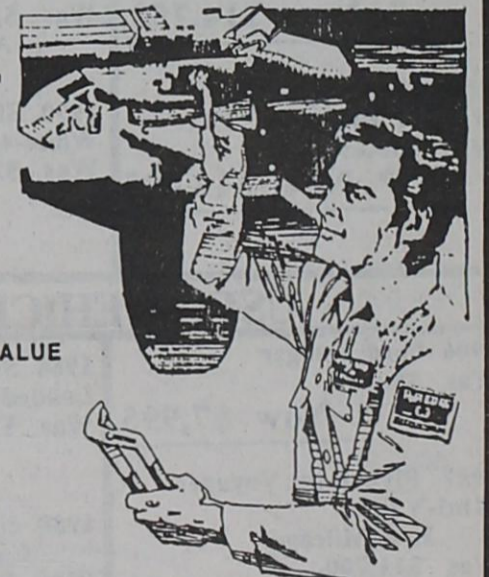
