really excited about new math. It would be the solution to
all of our nation's difficulties with the teaching of mathematics. Students would no
longer simply memorize facts, they would really understand the concepts being taught, he
said. It sounded wonderful. In the decade that fol-
lowed, schools all over the U.S. adopted new math. They
turned away from memorization of number facts to "understanding concepts." Obviously, if you want to be good at something, you must both
know the facts and understand the concepts.
Unfortunately for the new
math proponents, the results math proponents, the results
of the new math curriculum of the new math curriculum
experiment have not been as good as our nation hoped.
The results will be felt in the next two decades.
$\qquad$ the number of doctoral degrees awarded by colleges in the U.S. in math has fall from
1,281 in 1972 to 730 in 1986 , 1,281 decrease of 43 percent. The number of those de-
grees going to U. citizens has fallen from $1,031-367$,
a decrease of 65 percent in a decrease of 65 perce
the same time period. What difference does that
make to the average U.S. citizen?
It means that foreign na-
tionals are taking jobs as tionals are taking jobs as
math professors in college in engineering schools, and in
physics and chemistry. U.S. citizens are quickly becoming minorities in colleges such as
UCLA and Stanford.
A hundred years ago forA hundred years ago for-
eign nationals came to this country to take jobs as fac-
tory workers or on crews tory workers or on crews
building rail roads across this country. They took the min-
imum - wage, un-skilled poimum - wage, un-skilled po-
sitions. Today they are taking
the high paying hialy skilled positions. And, our children
will get the minimum wage,
unskilled jobs if we do not
watch our steps. watch our steps.
Should we shut the door
on these immigrants? No, we on these immigrants? No, we
should open the door, and let They are helping to make our. colleges the best in the world.
Nationally, we need to revamp our math and science curricula. Our children are no
smarter and no dumber than smarter and no dumber than
any other children on earth. They are chipable of earth.
more more than they are doing in the areas of math, science
engineering, and medicine More than that, we need to encourage our children to study more math and sci-
ence. It is really hard to motivate children to take courses like trigonometry and calcu-
lus and physics and strug-
gle for grades gle for grades when their courses ànd get good grades courses and get good grades.
It is even harder to keep
children in school when they know that there are plenty
of jobs available that will be
easy easy to get - which will be
the case in the next decade. The problem is convincing
children that they must look
to to the long run and work
at difficult courses because they will be of great value in

## Principal Craig plans to retire

The Farwell School Board Tuesday accepted the resigna-
tion of Elementary School Principal retire June 30 . Craig has been employed by Farwell for 30 years in
many different positions including teacher, coach, principal administrator and tax assessor
The board expressed the sentiment that they will they will miss him and that they appreciate his service.
The board also voted to pass a 1990-91
The board also voted to pass a 1990-91 school year calendar proposed by the calendar committee with a few in February and a full week off at Easter. Members of the calendar committee indicated that most of the teachers prefer this change.
Board members Tom Nichols, Joe Schilling, and Ronald Byrd voted for this calendar option. Roberta Johnson, Katherine White, and Steve Kaltwasser voted against the
calendar. Board President Doyle Johnson voted for it although he personally prefers the earlier break.

the tests showed that all drinking fountains meet the federal guidelines of .05 milligrams of lead per liter of
water. Two water coolers in the Texico schools showed exceeding a .02 per liter cutoff which requires clos monitoring. Both water coolers will be removed. The water coolers showed readings within the legally acceptable limits,
