What a crazy world it is. And last week seemed to prove that axiom true again. We all heard about the little 5-year-old boy who was missing in Clovis. At this point, the situation appears tragic as he has not been found - and likely was abducted. Then the report of the former Bovina woman charged with murdering one of her own children - and the investigation into the deaths of her other five other young children and another relative. At the Mother's Day dinner held at Farwell Schools Sunday, I heard about a Farwell boy who was punched around by a gang at an Amarillo Mall the preceding Friday for no apparent reason. Fortunately, he was not seriously injured. The point is: it's dangerous out there. And it doesn't matter where you live, there are crazies on the loose. And it's getting worse. I can empathize completely with mothers who may seem over-protective of their young-uns. In today's world, you simply cannot be "too safe." Obviously, living in Texico-Farwell is safer than residing on the South Side of Chicago, where I was reared. But back then, life was less dangerous. If a gang approached you, you would be hassled or beat up. Today, the question is whether they will allow you to live.

For example, the "drive-by, shootings" for which Los Angeles is becoming famous for really take the cake. And the "wilding" case in New York... What kind of persons would do this? And how do you solve it? Oh, I know the correct liberal answers: more education, more job opportunity, more social consciousness, better home life, etc., etc. And the conservatives would chime in with longer prison sentences, more prisons, stricter law enforcement, etc. But solving the "safety problem" is not a priority in our nation. And I really don't know if there is an answer to getting the "crazies" off our streets, especially when you only find out that they are crazies after the crime has been committed. I guess the only realistic answer is to simply hope and pray that you or your family don't get caught up in the web that crazies spin. It's like a wheel of fortune. Except when you get involved, it's not a game. I've just been thinking aloud with this column. About the only real point I wish to make is: you can never be too safe, regardless of where you live and how many locks are on the door. And teach your children caution. Crime and drug problems are solveable. But our country doesn't have the will - nor wishes to spend the necessary funds - to do so. That leaves it up to each of us as individuals to be cautious. 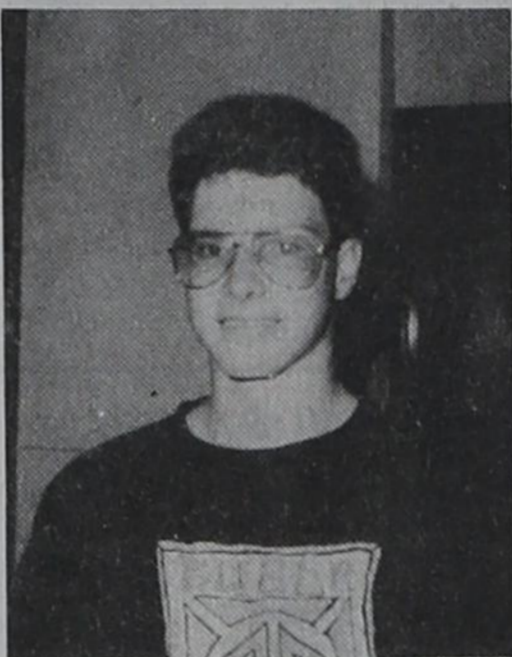
Salutatorian is Angie White, daughter of Robert and Dorris White.

Chris has been a member of band for four years; band council for two years, including president; class president; FFA president three

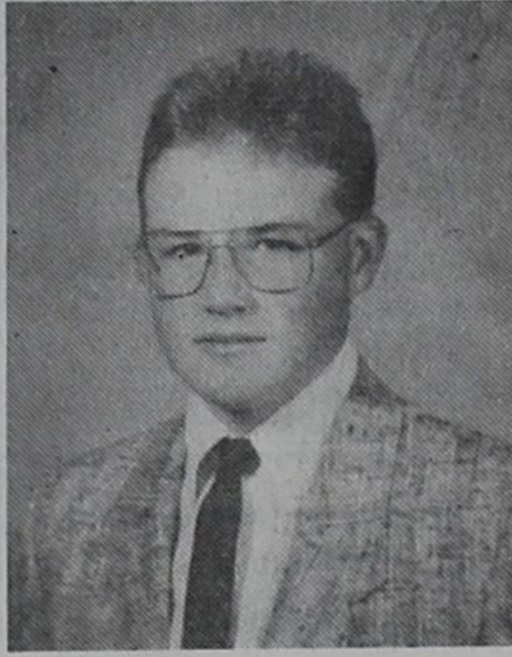

Six deaths to be probed

District Attorney Johnny Atkinson has asked local law enforcement agents to open an investigation into the deaths of several children in this area since 1976.

Diana L. Lumbrera, 31, of Garden City, Kan., has been taken into custody there on a charge of a first-degree murder in the death of her son, Jose Antonio Lumbrera, 4. She is being held on \$100,000 bond.

The Garden City newspaper reports that a preliminary autopsy performed on the child reports the cause of death to be "asphyxia due to smothering."

Mrs. Lumbrera had taken her son to St. Catherine Hospital emergency room on the day before his death for a respiratory infection. Antibiotics were prescribed for the child. She later called the emergency room to tell

the doctors that the child had begun vomiting. She was instructed to bathe the child to reduce the fever. At that time, there were no signs of abuse.

The next day, when she carried the child into the emergency room he was dead on arrival.

She has lived in Kansas about five years.

In investigating Mrs. Lumbrera's background, law enforcement agents there found that she had five more of her children die suddenly while she lived in Texas. During that time she lived in Bovina and Dimmitt.

A relative in her care also died suddenly in Dimmitt.

Dead are: Joanna Lumbrera, Nov. 30, 1976; Melissa Garza, Nov. 2, 1978; Melinda Ann Garza, Aug. 17, 1982; Jose Lionel Garza, Jr., Feb. 13, 1978; Christopher Daniel Lumbrera, March 28, 1984;

Erica Lenore Aleman, Oct. 8, 1980, and Jose Antonio Lumbrera, May 11, 1990, in Kansas.

Erica Aleman was the niece of Mrs. Lumbrera's sister, Virginia; she was the daughter of Ben and Irene Aleman of Dimmitt. The others in the list were Mrs. Lumbrera's own children.

Each of the deaths in Texas was attributed to natural causes. Autopsies were done on Melissa Garza and Melinda Garza. It is possible that there were also autopsies on others. Law enforcement agents are checking on this point.

According to Bovina Police Chief Gary Coleman, Melissa Garza's death certificate says "congestive heart failure,"

and Melinda Garza's death is from sudden infant death syndrome.

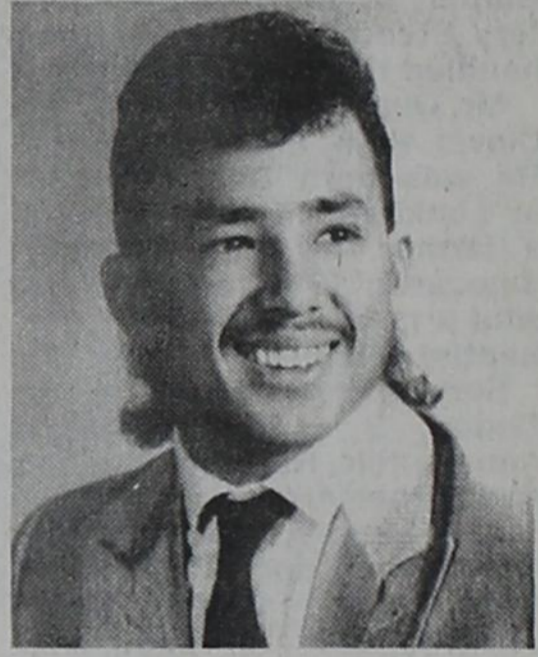

Law enforcement agents from the Bovina Police Department, the Parmer County Sheriff's office, and the Castro County Sheriff's office have joined the investigation started in Kansas.

Suspicion about the deaths at the time each occurred was minimal because: - The children were taken to different hospitals, and different doctors handled the cases.

- Doctors and justices of the peace who filled in death certificates had no reason to suspect Mrs. Lumbrera.

- The children had different last names, so clerks filing the death certificates may not see any connection between their deaths.

Some of the children who died in Parmer County were taken to the hospital in Friona, and some to Muleshoe. One was brought to Dimmitt.

Curry County 4-H Clubs culminated its week-long observance of County 4-H Week with a Food Fair and Poster Contest in March at the county fairgrounds.

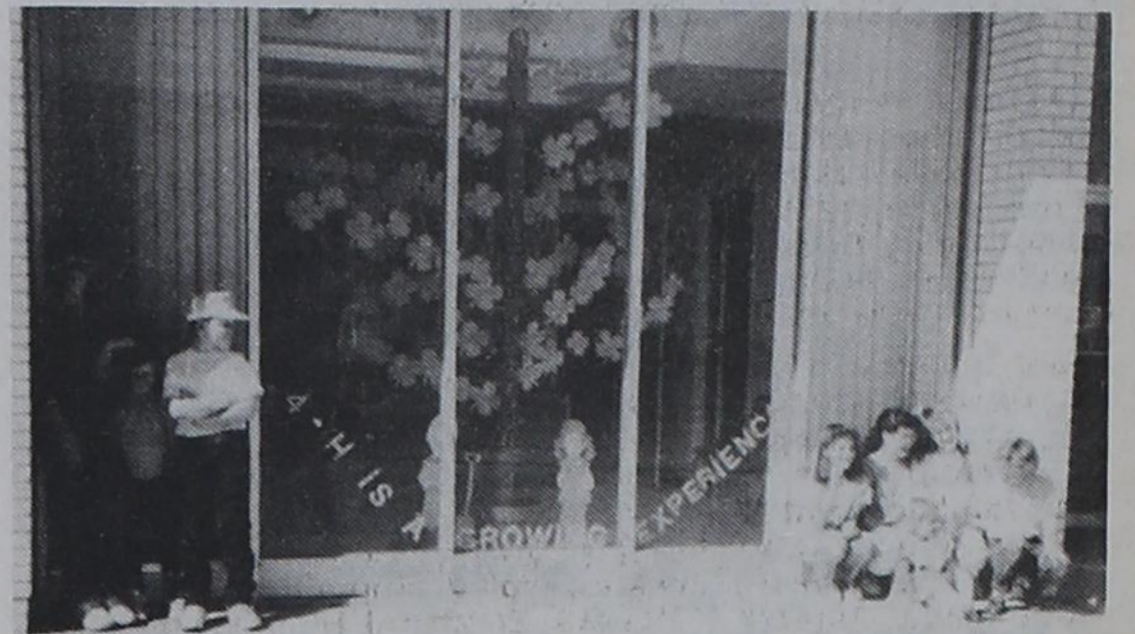

"Workman's Comp is killing New Mexico," said Caudell. Nearly 25 percent of the cost of building a house in New Mexico now goes to pay for the workman's compensation costs. "We pay three times the benefit costs that California pays." If New Mexico is going to stay competitive, workman's compensation must be brought into line with neighboring states.

New Mexico's tax structure also needs revision, he said. The gross receipts tax hurts industries. He favors the sales tax approach which exempts items such as groceries and services from taxation.

The third area Caudell would like to change is the state's approach to education. As a member of the House Education committee, he became aware of many of the problems in this area. New Mexico has some unique problems in education which cause higher education costs than other parts of the nation. For instance, schools are so far apart that travel expenses are much higher here than in other place. Also, the number of schools which must offer bi-lingual and migrant programs is higher than in other parts of the nation.

He also suggested that the state would function better with a civil service system which would end "pork barrel politics", and the institution of an economic development trust fund which would provide seed money to attract industry to the state.

Caudell would especially like to see economic development money go to fund trash recycling in New Mexico. Caudell favors the idea of recycling low - level nuclear wastes at the WIPP site to make plutonium which could be sold to Europe which relies heavily on nuclear powered electricity. He would also like to see plastics recycled and used to replace costly wooden items which must be shipped in from other parts of the nation.

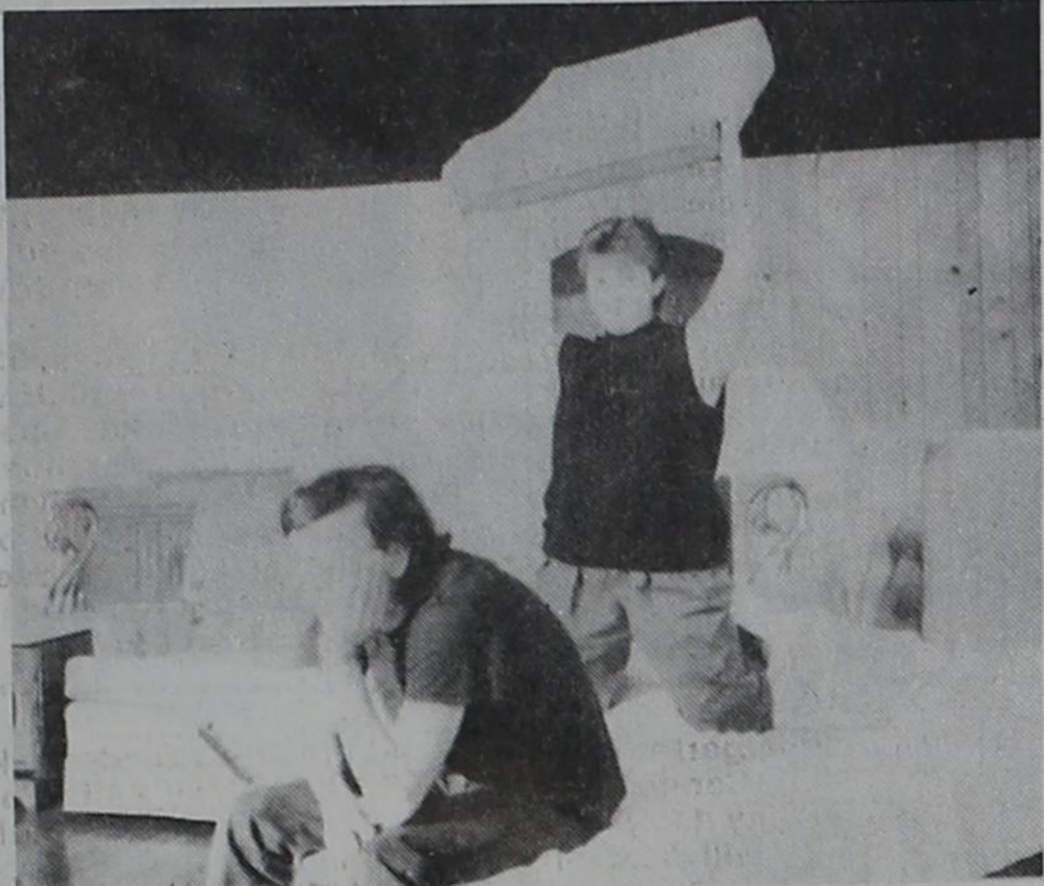

## Record number of cattle fed

Feedlots in the area served by Southwestern Public Service during 1989 fed the highest number of cattle on record, according to SPS's annual Fed Cattle Survey. Feedlots in the SPS service area fed 5,468,350 head of cattle, a 2.5 percent increase over the 1988 total of 5,335,603. The previous record was set in 1987 with 5,406,975 fed. The survey also showed that the one-time total capacity of area feedlots in 1989 was 2,785,475 head, up from the one-time total capacity in 1988 of 2,758,662 head. SPS serves 52,000 square miles. Also, the survey found that 4,694,852 cattle were slaughtered last year at 13 beef-packing plants in the SPS service area. This is close to the facilities' capacity of 4,818,320 head. The report also shows that the total number of feedlots in the area has grown to 117.

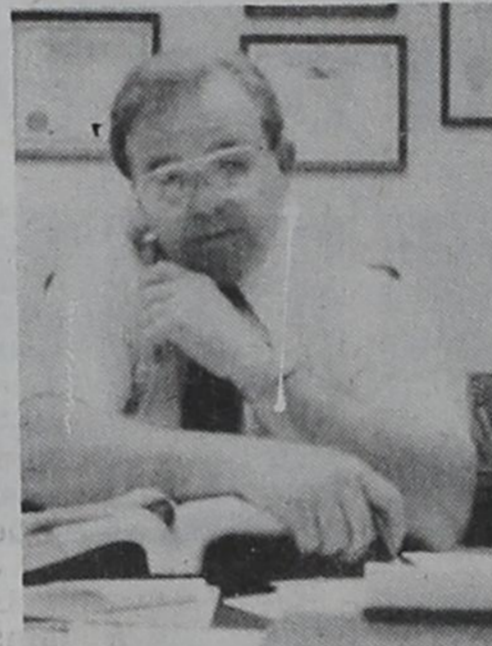
## Auxiliary orders washing machine
