## BTB Merchants' Giveaway starts

A multitude of Twin City businesses will be participating in the 11th annual Border Town Days Merchants Giveaway program held in conjunction with the annual BTB celebration July 25.

This year's giveaway will take place throughout the afternoon of the Saturday festivities at Farwell City Park. To enter, you must be at least 12 years old and you must be present to win.

Any merchant who hasn't been contacted but wishes to participate should call BTB chairman Mike Pomper at 481-3681 by Tuesday.

Each participating business has a box in which customers may register for the prize to be given away by the merchant. A person may sign up once each time he is in a store until July 24, when the boxes will be picked up and taken to the park for the drawings.

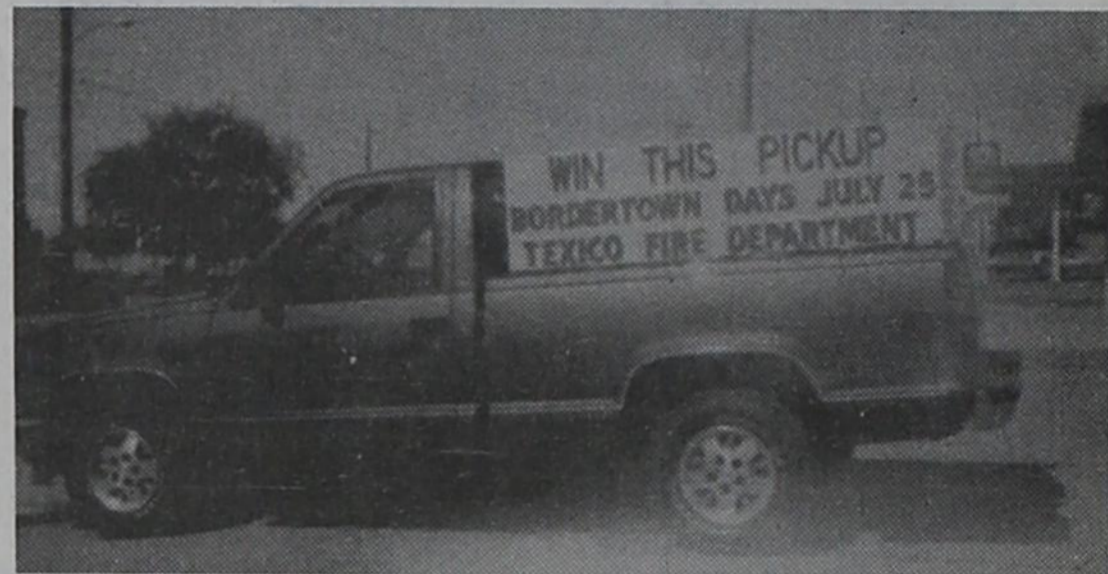
This year's BTB theme is "Recycle America." It's important to follow the theme, since that is a large portion of the judging.

The registration deadline is 3 p.m. Friday, July 24.

Mrs. Qualls said that youths planning to enter the decorated bike contest in the parade need to register, giving their name and age, to be eligible for the cash prizes and free train tickets.

No motorized bikes are allowed in the contest.

All riders must bring their decorated bikes to Anderson street (between Texico City Hall and the flea market - across the street from Citizens Bank) at 9:45 a.m. Texas time, and line up for judging there on July 25. The street will be blocked off so that there will be no vehicular traffic.

"You must be on time or you will not be judged," said Mrs. Qualls.

"Contestants need be sure to stick to the theme (Recycle America) if they're going to be counted," said Mrs. Qualls. The judges will really be looking for adherence to theme this year.

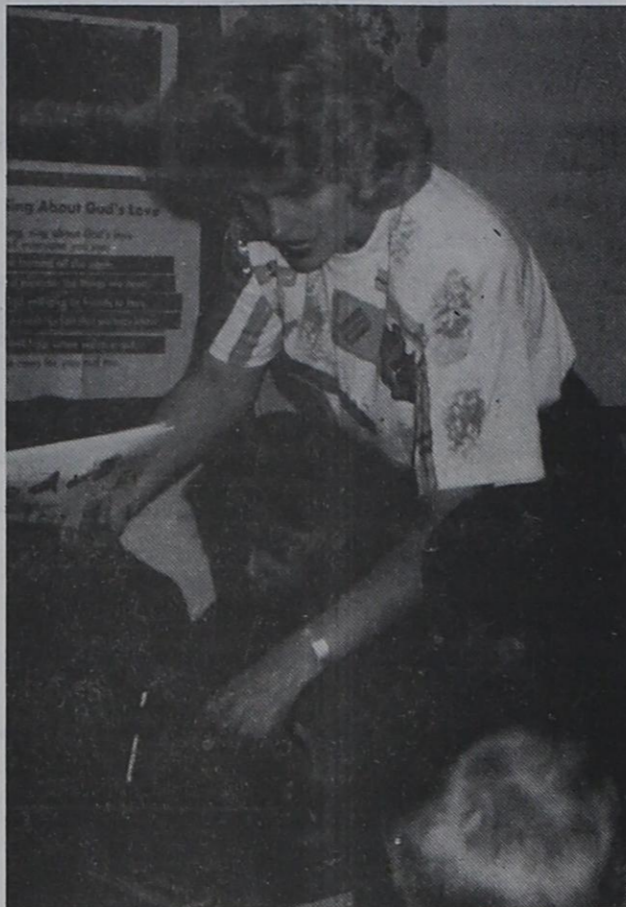

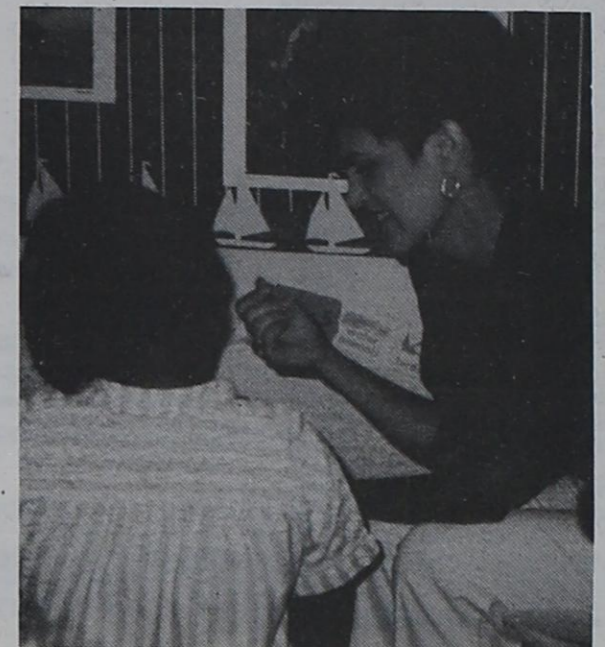
