How about them 'Pokes! In this era of sometimes dull pro football, the Dallas franchise stands out as a beacon of light.

I really liked the call that Coach Jimmy Johnson made to run from punt formation deep in his own territory in the first quarter of Sunday's playoff game against the Packers.

Sure, it failed as far as the necessary yardage needed went. But, more importantly, it succeeded on other fronts.

First, it scared the you-know-what out of Green Bay. They were never sure what Johnson might try after that.

Second, it made the Cowboys' defense play tough. It created inspiration for them. Three times Green Bay had the ball in Cowboys' territory in the first quarter, and the Pack could only get 3 points. That was the game right there.

Third, it got the crowd into the game. And it got fans like me excited about watching.

Fourth, it told the Cowboys' offense that the coach had confidence in them to score enough points to overcome a gutsy call that failed.

Yep, I liked it. And I like the way Johnson coaches. He gets after it.

I'm a great believer in running from punt formation when the yardage is small. I often watch the defensive line during the punt and see wide open holes. And there's nothing that wipes out a team worse than when you make that surprise first down instead of giving up the ball to them.

But, alas, coaches play percentages and it shows, at least in the long run, that the conservative approach is best (or so they say). But I feel that they go by percentages too much and don't take into account the individual situations.

What really bugs me is when the coach calls for a punt when his team is on the 35- or 40-yard line of the opposition. So often, the punter kicks into the end zone and you only pick up a few yards. I really hate that. Yet you see it all the time, that conservative approach.

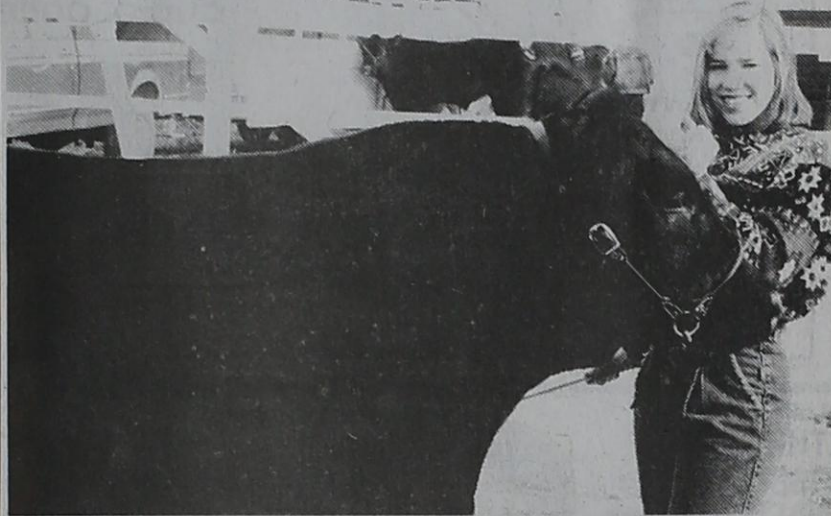

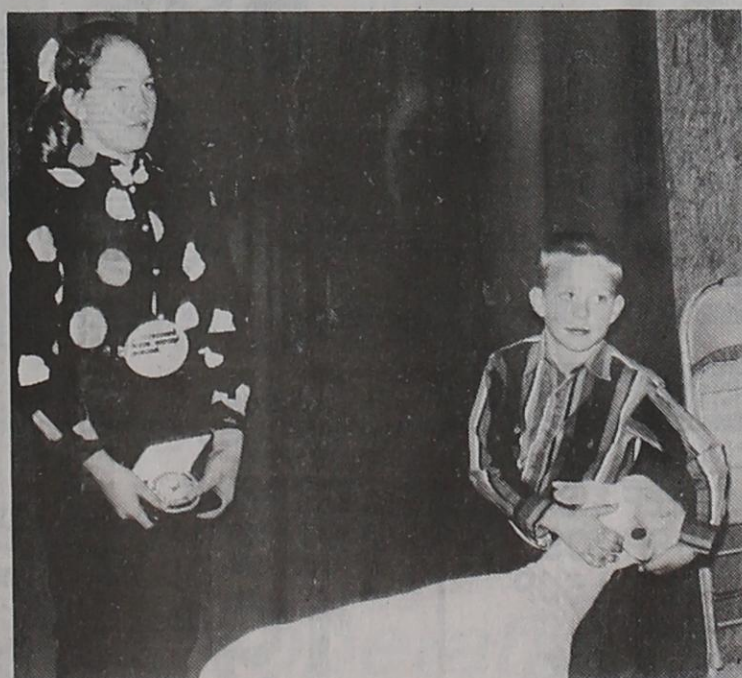

Parmer Livestock Show on tap

The Parmer County Junior Livestock Show will be held Jan. 21-24 in Friona.

Weigh-in for barrows, heifers and steers will be from 1 - 5 p.m. on Friday at the showbarn west of Hwy. 60.

Judges are: Burt Williams, (steers and heifers); Dirk Aaron (barrows); Jerry Franklin (lambs) and Carl Wheeler (showmanship).

On Saturday, lambs will be weighed and classified from 7 a.m. - 8:30 a.m. Steers will also be classified at 7 a.m.

Only one re-weigh is allowed within 1 hour of the first weight being taken or at the discretion of the superintendent.

The Steer Show begins at 9 a.m. It will be followed by the Heifer Show. At 11 a.m. the Lamb Show will be held. The Barrow Show follows at 2 p.m.

The sale will take place on Monday. There will be announcements at 6:30 p.m. followed by the sale at 7 p.m.

McGaa reports on junked vehicles

Farwell Police Chief Roy McGaa reported to the Farwell City Council Tuesday on progress being made to remove junked and abandoned vehicles from inside the city limits.

Three letters were sent out Jan. 12 and more will be sent out soon to property owners involved. The first three letters concerned about 25 vehicles.

Of those three, one property owner has begun moving the junk to Portales. Another asked for more time to comply and he will be asked to attend the next City Council meeting.

Once the certified letter is received, property owners have 10 days to comply or seek an appeal. After that they can fined a maximum of \$200 per day.

Other owners of junk were discussed, too.

The City Council started its action against the junk last summer.

In other business, McGaa reported that he has been informed by the Texas Highway Patrol that the THP will not answer vehicle accident calls in Farwell unless the THP is kept current on a schedule showing what days McGaa is working. McGaa said he is complying with this dictate.

For his December report, McGaa said he received 36 calls - 16 while on duty, 19 off duty and one 911 emergency. He issued 6 warnings, issued 9 traffic tickets and made no arrests.

The "activity breakdown" included 1 911 call, 2 building burglaries, 1 criminal mischief, 2 disorderly conduct, 2 domestic violence, 1 firearm violation, 2 juvenile problems, 1 loud music, 2 non-classifieds, 1 suspicious person, 4 suspicious vehicles, 1 theft, 9 traffic tickets and 2 assistance calls.

In his year-end report (he worked the last 33 weeks

of 1993), McGaa said 7,400 miles were put on the patrol car - 44 miles a day, including travel to in-service schools.

In 1993, 115 tickets were issued and 110 written warnings given. This resulted in \$4,359 in revenue collected for Farwell.

The city council also:

- Heard a request for a donation to the proposed KidCare Program, where kids have their photos taken in case of abductions. Tracy Bridges, a Parmer County sheriff's deputy in charge of this, made the request.

Bridges said about \$1,000 has been collected and he needs about a minimum of \$1,200 to take photos of Farwell kids. Then he will take photos of other county kids. He said the local banks and ENMR have made financial commitments.

Under the program, pic-

tures are taken and also fingerprints. They are kept in a kit which the parents keep.

Bridges hopes to have a special photo day in March near Farwell school. He said Dairy Queen will give out free ice cream coupons. Parents must be with their kids.

Bridges also planned to talk with the Texico Community Activities Organization Tuesday about the program. If Texico kids show up at the photo day, they will be included. He said Texico firemen may help, too.

A few of the important points about the show are: The Parmer County Junior Livestock Show is open to all 4-H, FFA and FHA boys and girls under the supervision of the county agent and vocational agriculture teachers of the county. Exhibitors must be enrolled in grades 3-12 in one of the four public schools in the county, or they must be a resident of Parmer County attending a private school in grades 3-12.

Each exhibitor may show up to four animals, but no more than three in any one species (except commercial steers).

There will be two divisions in each species of showmanship competition: Junior (13 and under) and Senior (14 and over). A judge will be selected to name a champion showman in each species and age division.

Only one re-weigh is allowed within 1 hour of the first weight being taken or at the discretion of the superintendent.

Fifty percent of each class will be sold at the sale, up to 140 head. Livestock Show information is available from the Parmer County Agricultural Extension Service office in the county courthouse.
