I'm still skeptical

Well, the new GOP-controlled Congress is under way and it looks like a lot of changes are taking place.

I got a call last week from Cong. Larry Combest's office wanting to know if we wanted to hook up with other newspapers on a telephone conversation with him.

I said no, that I would rather wait at least 100 days into the current session. Then it might be interesting to talk with Combest about what has, or hasn't, been achieved. Right now is too early for an overview.

Combest is now a member of the majority House party, and his press aide said it was like a breath of fresh air for him.

Being the optimist I am, I'm hopeful that the reform-minded new Congress will make meaningful changes, not just transparent, publicity-oriented moves.

For example, I remember when Reagan took over as President and immediately announced a freeze on new federal employees or whatever. That announcement got top play in the press.

But it didn't last very long and its demise was overlooked by the media. In other words, these "freezes" are a big waste of time - except for the publicity value.

I'm also waiting to see what changes passed by the House are also passed by the Senate, a more deliberative body. And whether President Clinton signs these bills into law. That's when we'll see if substantive change is achieved. Frankly, I don't view Senate Majority Leader Bob Dole as a reformer. But let's wait and see. The tide may carry him along.

I was glad to see the House urge that bill putting Congress under the same laws as the rest of the nation. That was a shock to me. I mean, we all know that Congress considers itself above the law. Wow - this is reform.

Anyway, these early recommended reform measures all look good and I hope the Senate also acts upon them and President Clinton signs them into law. Then it will be time for Congress to get into the meatier issues.

I still stress that health care reform is a top priority. If you wonder why your health insurance premiums are skyrocketing - it's because of the swelling number of Americans who can't afford health care and thus get it for free at our hospitals.

I won't go into my usual diatribe about the shrinkage of the middle class today; I think I've covered it well enough over the past few years. But it's not going away. And I don't want to see the U.S. becoming a two-tier economic system - poor folks and rich folks. That doesn't bode well.

Another thing I look forward to is when all these new congressmen and women realize how little power they have, once they get worked over by the federal bureaucrats and the judges. They will learn their place.

I always love it when a law is passed with one intention, and then is subverted by the bureaucrats who carry it out.

And then some judge in Timbuktoo may not like it and thus cancel it for the nation.

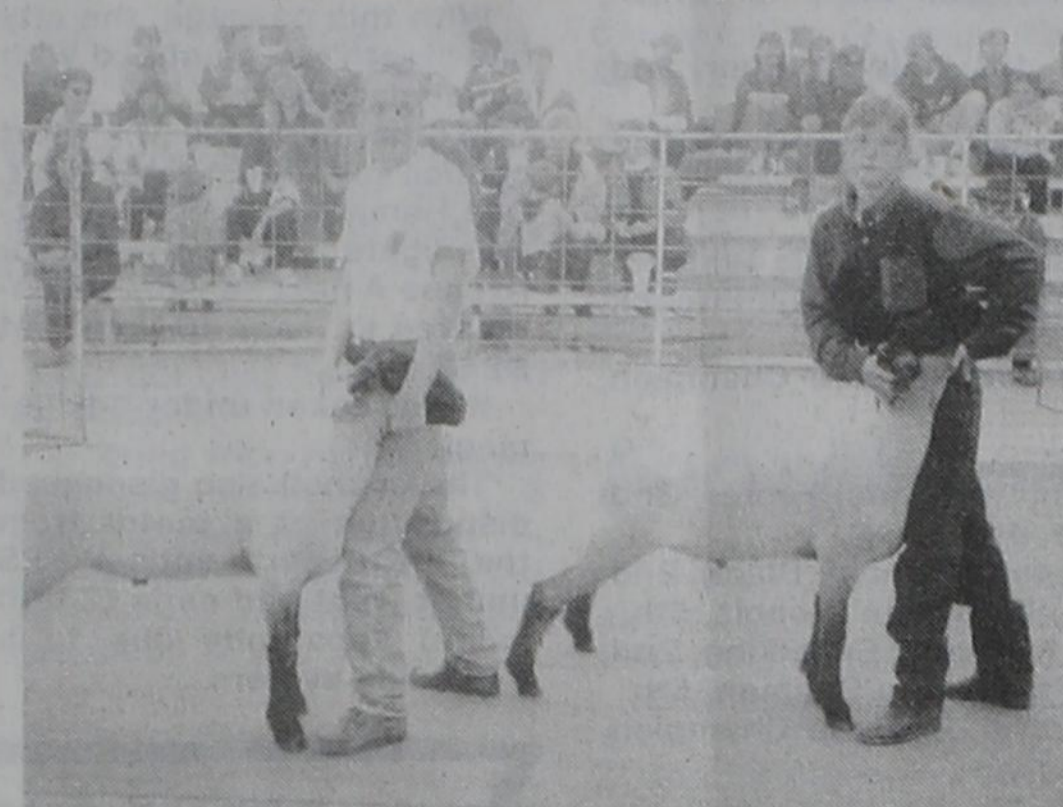
That's why I have a sense of humor about politics.

She died Jan. 14 in Clovis. She was born Aug. 23, 1921, in Elk City, Okla. She had been a Clovis resident since 1972.


Surviving are a brother, Lester Sears, of Farwell; 2 sisters, Lorraine Hall, Bovina, and Jody Fulgham, Clovis.

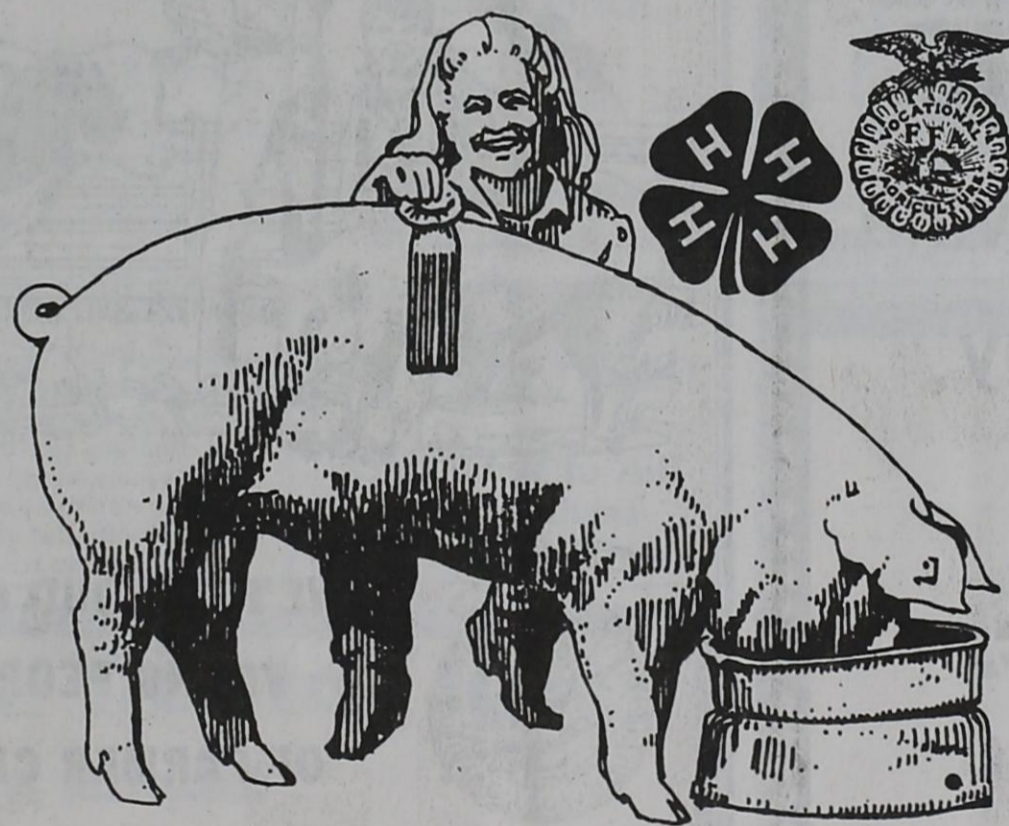

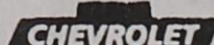

windows, doors and roof work for the high school and cafeteria.

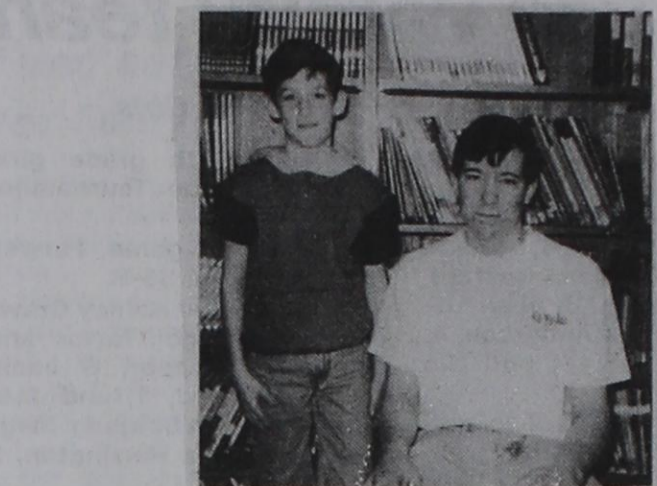
- Will seek bids for a new school bus.

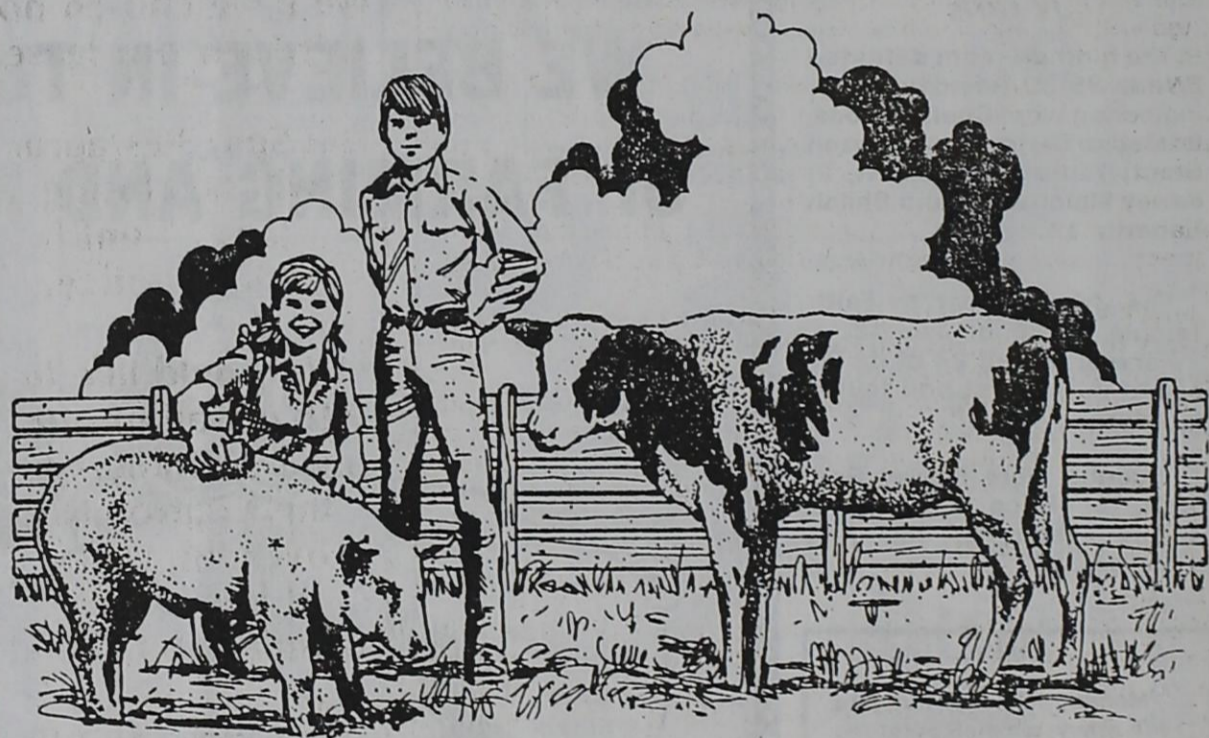

**A true treasure**

As a teenager, I earned money by doing the thing that most teenage girls are good at: babysitting. And while I enjoyed the children that I sat with and learned a lot about patience and responsibility, it was something that I couldn't see doing for very long; or at least until I had children of my own.

I recently had the pleasure of interviewing a woman who babysat children for 37 years in Farwell - Jewell Thomas. And, true to her name, she is a jewel of a person and a true treasure to parents and families from the Farwell-Texico area.

Jewell came to Farwell from Borger, Texas in February 1957 with five of her six children. The oldest boy was already in the Navy and was away on duty. She had recently divorced her husband and came to live nearby her parents.

In October of that same year, the First Baptist Church of Farwell needed someone to watch the children in the nursery every Sunday morning. She gladly took the job, thus began a long history of babysitting.

"At first I was the only one watching the babies and toddlers, but I eventually needed someone else in the nursery to help me," she said. "Everyone really started having kids after I came to work at the nursery!"

Being in the nursery at the church for so many years allowed Jewell to see many children grow up from the time that they were tiny babies to the day that they had children of their own.

I asked her if she remembered the first child that she kept in the nursery. "I can't, for the life of me, remember," she stated. "But I do remember my very first day and I never planned for the job to last as long as it did!"

She has even kept several generations of families in the nursery.

"I watched LeAndra Chadwick, (now Mrs. Ronald Byrd) as a young child and then I got to watch her children. I've also kept all the Williams' kids (Bert and LaMoin) and then their grandkids," she said. "And there were others too. The family that I have watched the most children for is the William Martin family. I got to watch all of Willie and Sharon's kids and I got called 'Grandma' by the little girls."

Many of the children called her "Grandma" and they loved and treated her like their real grandmother. Together, with Betty Dollar and Irene Woods, Jewell would gather the children and love on them just like a grandma would. "My favorite thing to do when I was in the nursery was to rock the kids and give them lots of love. I can recall having three babies in my lap at one time!" she said.

She would get down on the floor with the kids and build things with the blocks. She would also watch them at play with each other.

"We adults could learn a lot from little kids on how to get along with each other. I've seen little girls that would be 'spatting' with each other one minute, then be loving and caring for each other the next minute," she stated.

Jewell has a way with kids and, as she recalled, apparently always did. "People always told me that I had a special touch with them, even when I was a young girl," she said.

Jewell worked for a time at the Fortune Fashions Sewing Factory that was located in Farwell in the 70's and she also kept children in her home during the week.

"My career was children. I made a decent living and loved everyone of the kids like they were my own," she said.

Before she made the decision to retire, one of her sons asked her why she didn't quit babysitting and dealing with the kids.

"I told him I wasn't ready to give it up. I really enjoyed being with the children. They kept me going a lot of days," she said.

However, she did decide to retire from the nursery in January 1994. The families and children that she watched for so many years honored her with a reception at the church. Her sister, Gladys Johnson and her children and families that were able to attend were there as well. The cake served at her retirement reception was decorated with the phrase that summed up how everyone felt about Jewell. It read: "Thank You Jewell for loving our children!"

**Qualls, Jobe attend telecommunications confab**

Greg Qualls and Tim Jobe, 7th graders at Texico Jr. High, were selected out of the 7th grade science class to attend Tel-Ed '94, the 4th International Conference on Telecommunications in Education in Albuquerque on Nov. 10-13.

They were selected because of their involvement in an experiment entitled "Ring of Light," sponsored by Los Alamos National Laboratories and the Department of Energy. The experiment was conducted May 10, 1994 during the annular solar eclipse. During the week preceding the eclipse, the 6th grade science students at Texico Jr. High gathered weather data using a Davis Weather Monitor donated to the school by the Los Alamos Labs.

The data was collected and put into a computer located in the schools' science lab and from there, it was downloaded to Los Alamos via a modem connected to the school computer and linked to the telephone lines over an on-line bulletin board called GeoNet.

Greg and Tim carried the experiment a step further by using their personal home computers to log onto the GeoNet and communicated with the scientists at Los Alamos and with each other.

At the two day conference, Tim and Greg demonstrated the Davis Weather Monitor and the GeoNet and their classes' involvement in the the "Ring of Light" experiment to educators from all around the U.S. and Canada.

The boys were also taken on a tour of the Museum of Natural History and spent a day at a hands-on science museum for school age students. TelEd is sponsored annually by the International Society for Technology in Education.

**ENMR warns of phone credit card fraud scheme**

ENMR Telephone officials said they have been notified of a telephone credit card fraud scheme used locally.

The scheme begins with a person calling telephone customers and claiming to be a long distance toll fraud operator. The caller will then ask the customer for his telephone credit card number and PIN number for verification.

If the customer gives the number to the caller, the caller will then use the numbers to make long distance phone calls all over the world. These calls will then be billed back to the unsuspecting customer's account. The current scheme involves calls to the Middle East.

ENMR warns all telephone customers not to give out their credit card numbers to anyone calling who ask for them. Legitimate fraud investigators would not ask for these numbers because they already have them.

If you receive a call like this, don't give out your number but call your local telephone customer service rep.
