This year's giveaway will take place throughout the early afternoon of the Saturday festivities at Farwell City Park. To enter, you must be at least 12 years old and you must be present to win. Drawings will start at 12:30 p.m.

Bicycle contest registration starts

All area youngsters are reminded that registration starts Monday for the Border Town Days Decorated Bike Contest.

Youths must sign up at Texico City Hall.

This year once again offers a nifty incentive: Ted and Teddy Lopez, of Tedson Trailers in Texico, are donating a brand new bike to the winner of "Best of Show" -- the bike judged as the best decorated regardless of age category.

This year's LTD theme is "Stories from the Bible." It is very important to follow the themes since that is a large portion of the judging.

Also, an anonymous donor has provided funds for cash prizes in each category.

Plus, every participant will receive a free train ride on the Border Town Days Express.

"Everything is ready at Texico City Hall for kids to register," said Linda Moss, who is in charge of this year's bike contest. She is being assisted by Joy Stanton.

The registration deadline is 3 p.m. July 25.

Mrs. Moss said that youths planning to enter the decorated bike contest in the parade need to register, giving their name and age, to be eligible for the cash prizes.

The contest will be held an hour before the Border town Days parade on July 26. After the bicycle contest, all entrants will ride in the parade to the Farwell city park.

Prizes will be announced at the beginning of the Day in the Park festivities, at 1 p.m. at the Farwell city park gazebo.

No motorized bikes are allowed in the contest. All riders must bring their decorated bikes to Anderson Street (between Texico City Hall and the flea market -- across the street from Citizens Bank) by 9:45 a.m. Texas time (that's 8:45 New Mexico time) and line up for the judging there.

Texico police will be on hand to escort youth across Wheeler Avenue, if needed.

The portion of Anderson Street where the judging will take place will be closed to vehicular traffic during this period.

"You must be on time or you will not be judged," advised Mrs. Moss.

She added, "Contestants need to be sure to stick to the theme -- "Stories from the Bible" if they are going to be counted. The judges will be looking for adherence to the theme.

The contest is open to youths who live in the Texico and Farwell school districts.

Other rules are:
 -- All participants ride in the parade (their folks can go along too if they wish) and must continue to Farwell city

Ray Autrey protests new ordinance; will be discussed again

After hearing a protest from Ray Autrey about newly passed Ordinance 284, the Texico City Council voted Tuesday to re-discuss it and possibly make changes.

Autrey asked that the ordinance be rescinded. He pointed out three rules that he felt should be eliminated that dealt with fences: that permits not be needed, thus saving the resident money; that new material not be mandated, again due to higher costs and also the fact that some used material would suffice when a fence needs repair; and that the 1 1/2-ft. setbacks not be required.

Autrey talked of having residents sign a petition opposing the new ordinance.

Responding to Autrey's criticisms, Mayor Nathan Tharp said the ordinance allows residents to seek variances from the council. And the indication was that if the requests made sense, the council would approve them.

Tharp said the council has had problems with fencing in Texico that has caused it to make the changes. Again, he stressed the appeal process.

Discussing zoning problems, he noted that there are still eight mobile homes that were moved into the community that haven't been brought up to aesthetic review standards despite the fact that the homeowners promised to do so.

Tharp urged the council not to return to the old ordinances due to many problems and the lack of their enforcement ability. But some of the councilmen were unaware of some of the language in the new ordinance and decided to bring it back for discussion at its next meeting.

In other business, the council:
 -- Discussed plans for the new city hall complex to be built adjacent to the new community center. Councilman Oran Jay Autrey is working on this with engineer Bob Lydick.

-- Heard city marshal Gil Holguin report that 56 calls were received in June. Accident reports were up (5) and there were 8 arrests.

-- Changed the date for its next meeting to July 17. The meeting will begin 30 minutes early with a public hearing on the Infrastructure Capital Improvement Plan.

-- Approved the annual joint powers agreement with Clovis on housing prisoners there.

-- Named new councilman Dean Henninger as the EPCOG

representative.

-- Heard city attorney Marion Ty Rutter report that West Hereford Street was never dedicated to the city and isn't the city's responsibility although it's inside the city limits. Property owners along the street will be talked with about dedicating it to the city so the city can repair it.

-- Is seeking an animal control officer.

-- Received no bids for the city's used pickup. It was advertised in the Clovis paper, but not the Tribune.

-- Received two bids from Clovis firms (one was accepted) for the janitorial work at the community center. It was advertised in the Clovis paper, but not the Tribune. Oran Jay Autrey said he doubted anyone locally was licensed to do this work.

-- Accepted a bid from Valley Mower for \$6,200 for a mower.

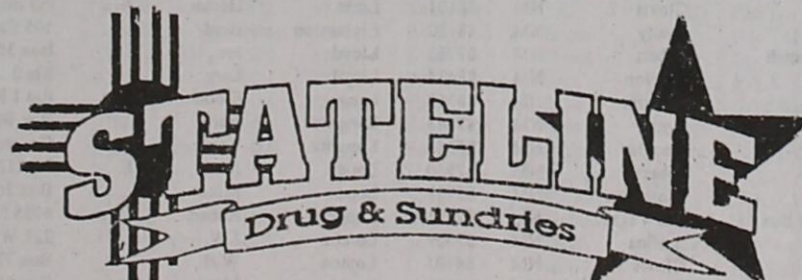

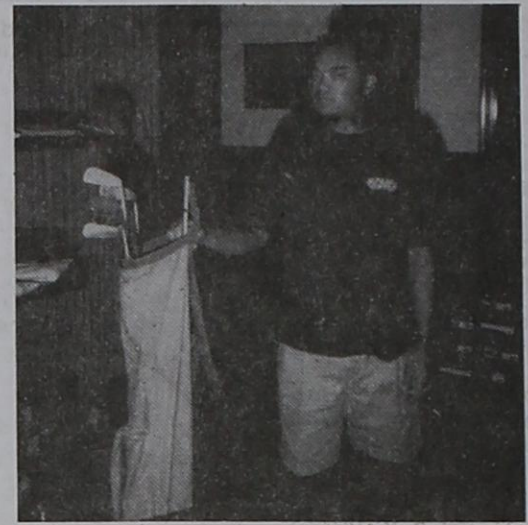
ducer Mark Williams, of Farwell, was part of a Texas congressional delegation during a trip to Washington, D.C., this week.

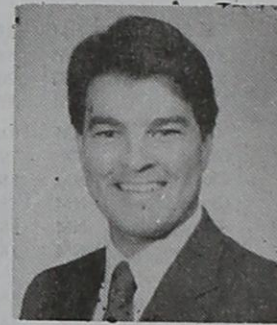

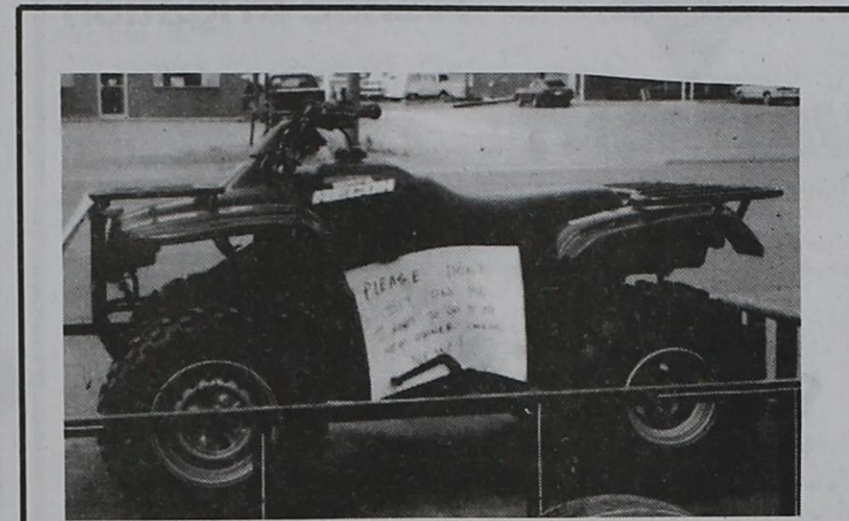



- One secretarial position has been eliminated. Sheryl Morris will be the superintendent's secretary and Paulette Foster will be the secretary for kindergarten through 12th grade.

Secretary Susie Sterling resigned in May.

-- The special education teacher's position wasn't replaced. Alice Barber has retired. Current staff will be used.

-- Some elementary school grades will use a team teaching approach. Each class will have a teacher but this method will allow the use of some federal funding.
