Farwell Police Chief Roy presented a detailed year-end report to the Farwell City Council on Tuesday.

It includes totals going back to when he first was employed as the chief.

Complete details are listed in the adjoining box.







There's a direct relationship between the amount of money we wish to accumulate and the number of years we have to accumu-

The subject of a hearing would be limited to applicable air quality requirements, which do not include issues such as water quality, noise, traffic safety, or zoning. If a hearing is held, it will be a legal proceeding similar to civil trials in state district court.

To request a hearing, you must submit the following: (1) your name (or for a group or association, an official representative), mailing address, daytime phone number, and fax number, if any; (2) the applicant's name and permit number; (3) the statement "I/we request a public hearing"; (4) a brief, specific statement or how and why emissions from the proposed facility would adversely affect you in a way not common to members of the general public; and (5) the location of your property relative to the proposed facility.
