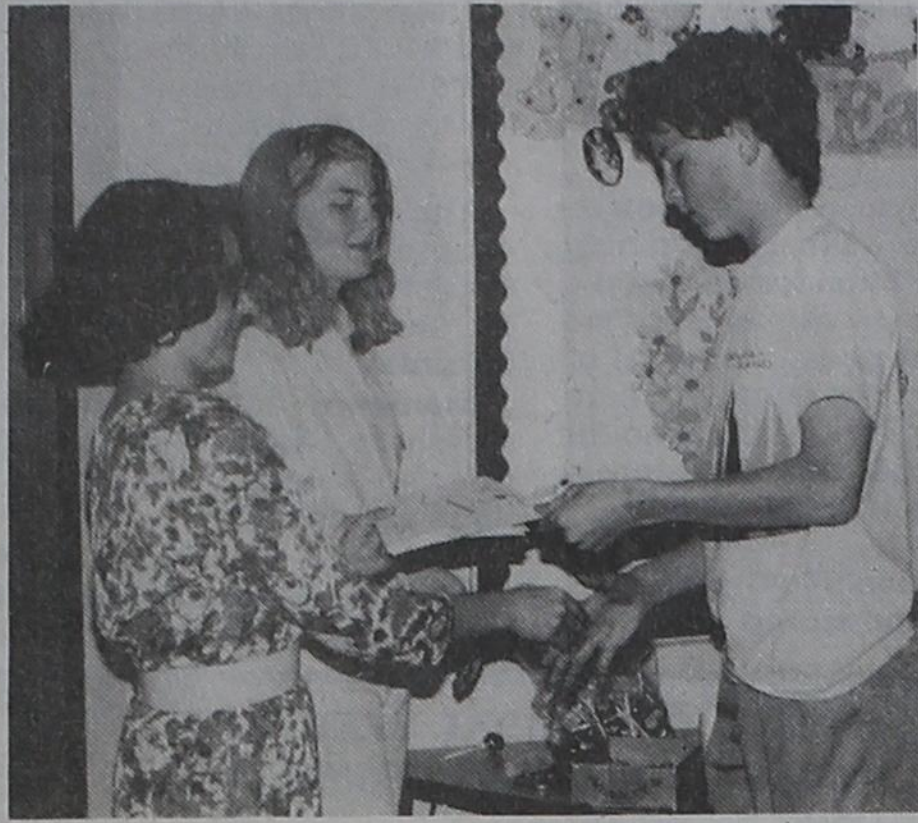
So if you want to join one of our committees - arts and crafts, concessions, merchants giveaway, parade, etc. - just call me at 481-3681. We'll find a place for you.

Some moisture finally arrives

Seasonable early spring weather prevailed over the plains last week.

On March 28, though, the sunny skies quickly turned black, and the area was blanketed with snow showers that brought much needed moisture. As usual, different places received different amounts.

Randy Kelley of Farwell reported 1" of moisture, while Linda Lee of Muleshoe reported nothing but blowing dust.

Fred Chandler reported that .3" of moisture was accumulated at the Sherley Anderson Pitman Elevator in Farwell. Lonnie McFarland reported .18" at the Sherley Anderson Elevator in Lariat.

"We didn't set any records," said Scott Brown at the

Sherley Anderson Elevator in Lazbuddie. "We could use a good rain. We're getting ready to plant and we have quite a bit of activity going on," he said. Brown reported only .09" of moisture in Lazbuddie.

Texico area residents Paul Dee Barnes, Bruce Mayfield, and Byron Mayfield reportedly had: .3", .25", and .45" of moisture respectively.

Mike Pomper of Farwell measured .6" of moisture in his rain gauge.

Saturday morning, the area received a beautiful dusting of snow. It looked like several inches, but it melted down to only a small amount.

Buster Herington estimated .4" of moisture in his rain gauge south of town, but the storm brought enough moisture to get his truck stuck in the mud.

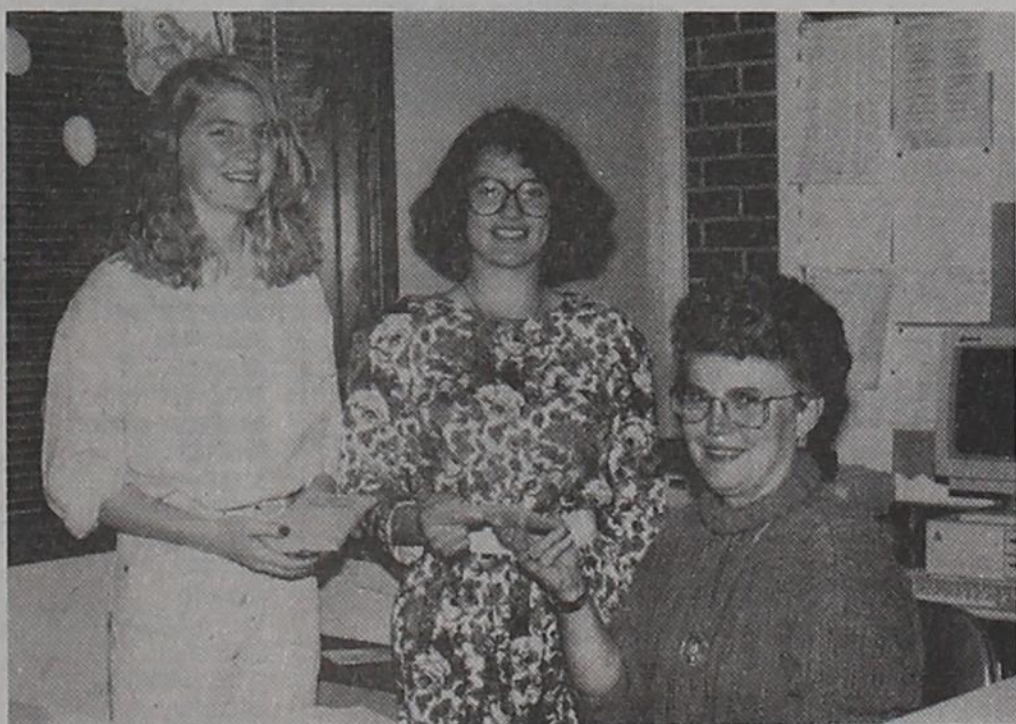

Theme: 'Salute To Our Troops'

BTD planning starts anew

"Salute to Our Troops" was chosen as the theme for this year's Border Town Days celebration when the BTD committee met for its organizational meeting Monday at the Farwell Convalescent Center.

The committee felt that theme was most appropriate, especially in light of President Bush's call for 4th of July activities to feature a patriotic theme this year.

The planning for the 25th annual BTD is now under way. As usual, the event - which drew more than 3,000 folks last year - will be held the last Saturday in July. That means the Day in the Park and Parade are scheduled for Saturday, July 27.

Officers were re-elected: Mike Pomper, president; Shandra McIntosh, vice president, and Ann Cooper, secretary - treasurer.

Committee assignments were made:

Arts and crafts fair, Lynne Mahaney; merchants' giveaway, Debra Looper; concessions at the park, Cynthia Thigpen; queen's contest, Susan Franse; parade, Jack Allen Kirkland Leigh Ann Woods.

Three groups signed up for park concessions:

1. Beta Sigma Phi, Cokes and sno cones.
2. Farwell Convalescent Center Auxiliary, baked goods and homemade ice cream.
3. Texico 4-H, hot dogs, homemade ice cream, Pepsi and orange drinks.

The committee voted to increase the fee for arts and crafts concessionaires, from \$10 to \$15. But the added \$5 will go toward gift certificates to be spent at the crafts show that day. This has been suggested by several fair participants. Last year, there were 35 concessionaires.

The fee for the park concessions, though, will remain at \$10.

The committee also voted to use the BTD button sales as a giveaway, also. Each of the 500 BTD buttons will have a number on the back. A number then will be chosen from a hat at BTD and an amount of money (yet to be determined) will be given the winner, who must be present.

A discussion was held about increasing the scholarship money for the queen's contest winner. It was raised from \$100 to \$200 three years ago. Pomper said he eventually would like to see that total reach \$500.

It was decided to wait awhile to see how finances were going this year before voting on raising the scholarship money. Also, area groups will be asked if they would like to contribute toward that scholarship fund.

Pomper said one person had suggested that a float be entered in the parade featuring area servicemen who served in the Persian Gulf War. A person to head this project will be sought.

Ms. Looper, administrator of the Farwell Convalescent Center, noted that the center will have its 15th anniversary

in July. They plan to celebrate it the day after BTD - Sunday, July 28.

The committee also voted to give tickets, worth a free ride on the train, to all children who enter the decorated bicycle contest but don't win any money.

Mrs. McIntosh, who is also a member of the queen's contest committee, reported that the committee is in good shape again this year. In addition to ladies who served last year, Loveda Boothby, wife of the Farwell school superintendent, has joined it. Also, at the end of last year's BTD, Margie Crooks, a Texico real estate sales lady, asked to help, too.

Mrs. Cooper gave a detailed financial report, which was accepted.

Last year's proceeds to-

talled \$3,018.45. Expenses totalled \$2,990.30 - for a final bank balance of \$28.15. Since the committee keeps a \$2,000 bank balance, the total currently is at \$2,065.71 (including interest).

In addition, there are two separate bank accounts with \$200 (and interest) in each for former BTD queen contest winners. They are eligible to receive the money if they attend an institution of higher learning within 3 years of high school graduation.

Pomper said he was pleased to see last year's BTD end in the "black" since the expenses included buying new speakers for the gazebo. They cost \$430.31. "They worked out beautifully," said Pomper. "I'd like to again thank Ed Hargade for handling that project."

Dr. Frank Kretsinger opens practice here

The Farwell Clinic has been remodeled, and it has recently reopened with Dr. Frank Kretsinger of Muleshoe as the physician.

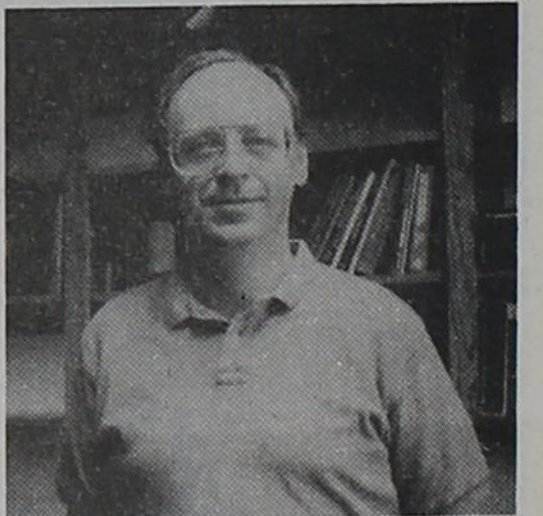
Kretsinger was born in Keene, Texas which is in the Dallas- Ft. Worth area. He studied at the University of Texas at Arlington and at North Texas.

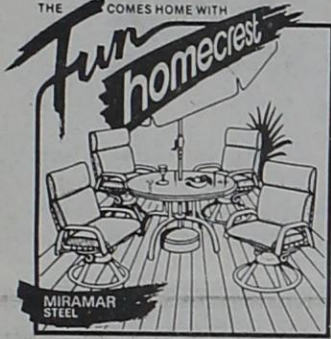

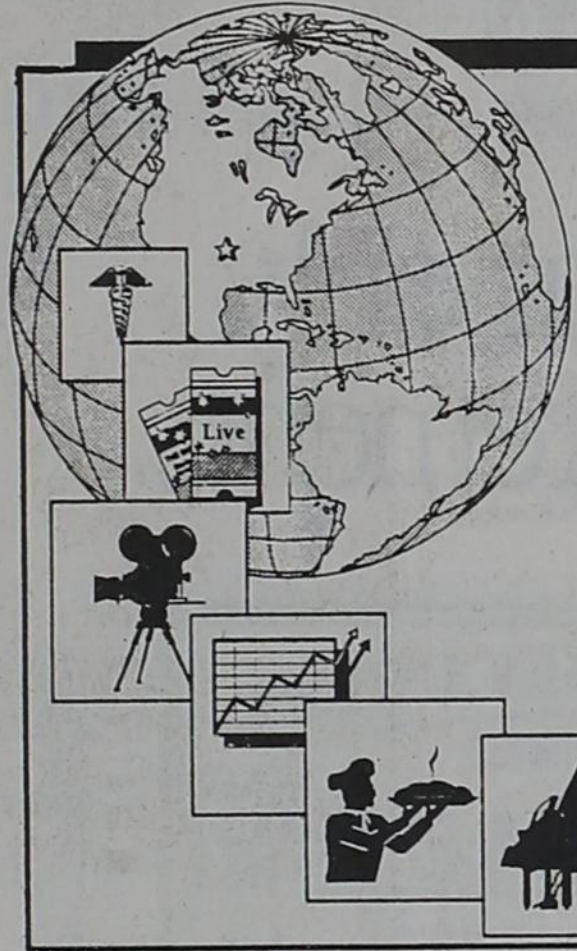

When a sender wants to fax something to someone who is not fax-equipped, the recipient is directed to a nearby Public FAX network location to pick up the urgent material. The purpose of the network is to make fax capability universal. People with fax can send to people without fax and vice versa, thereby saving them the one-day delay that comes with having to use overnight letters.

Another service offered by Public FAX agencies is the provision of a free fax number. Without requirement of guaranteed usage, United Drug of Farwell, of Farwell, TX 79325 will allow area people to use its local fax number as their own. Users can issue the number to would-be fax senders or even print it on their business cards and stationery. There is a small per-page charge for materials received. United Drug of Farwell makes immediate telephone calls to advise local users of fax mail that has arrived and then keeps it confidentially in a personal folder until it is picked up.

Other service features include the capability of sending pictures and photographs and having mail faxed for international delivery via INTELPOST.
