Voters will be asked to
mark different two ballots for this election. These ballots do not set up a new County Educational District; they simply exempt certain items from On the count are asked to vote on two propositions:

- "The constitutional amend ment to allow the voters of a county education district
to adopt certain exemptions from the district's ad valorem taxation for residence homesteads and to provide for the taxation of certain tangible "The property.
- "The constitutional amend suance of general obligation bonds to provide educational loans to students." The state is asking for the right to is-
sue $\$ 300$ million worth of additional bonds to finance student loans.
The other ballot has three propositions on it:

The exemption of 20 percent of the market value
of the residence homestead from ad valorem taxation in (name of county education district)."

The exemption of $\$ 10,000$ of the market value of the esidence homestead of an
individual who is disabled and of $\$ 10,000$ of the market value of the residence homestead of an individual who is 65 or older from ad valcounty education district). The taxation of all tangile personal property, other han manufactured homes, in (tion district) that is not held or used for the production of income.
