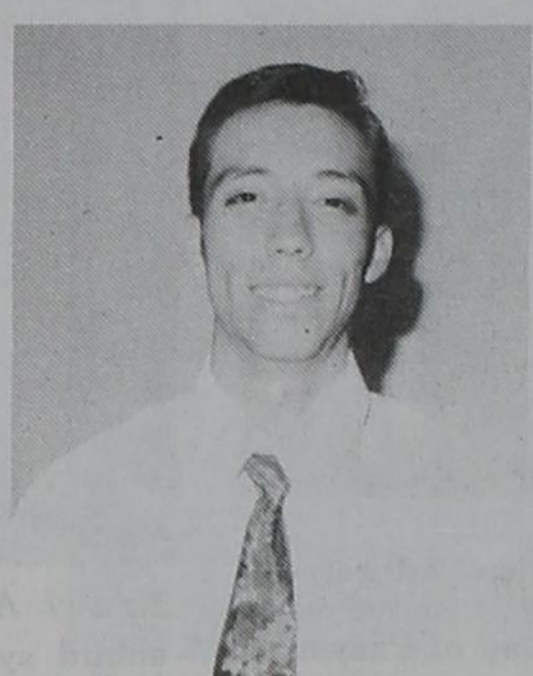

April Dawn Stout is the Historian. She is the daughter of Gerald and Karan Stout.

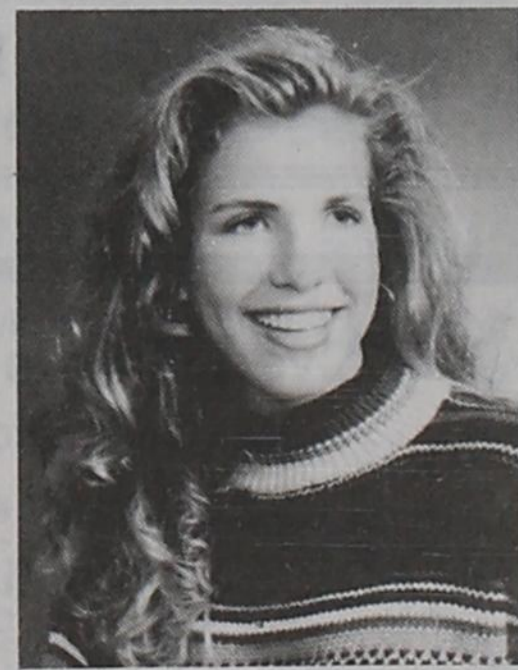

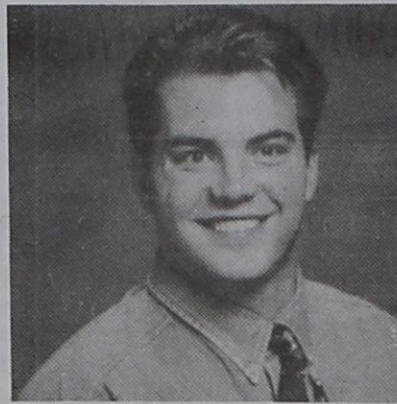

Basketball camps for Farwell boys only will be run by Coach Doug Boyd June 13-17.

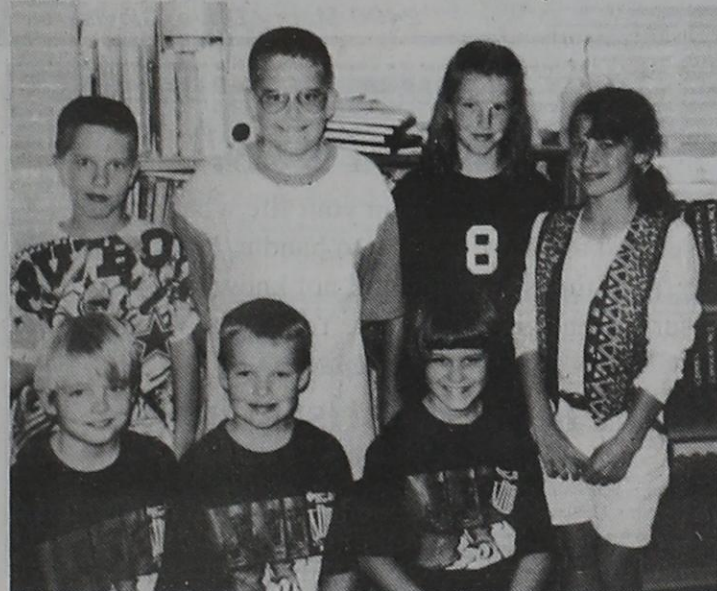
One camp will be for 1994-95 3rd, 4th and 5th graders from 9 a.m. to noon.

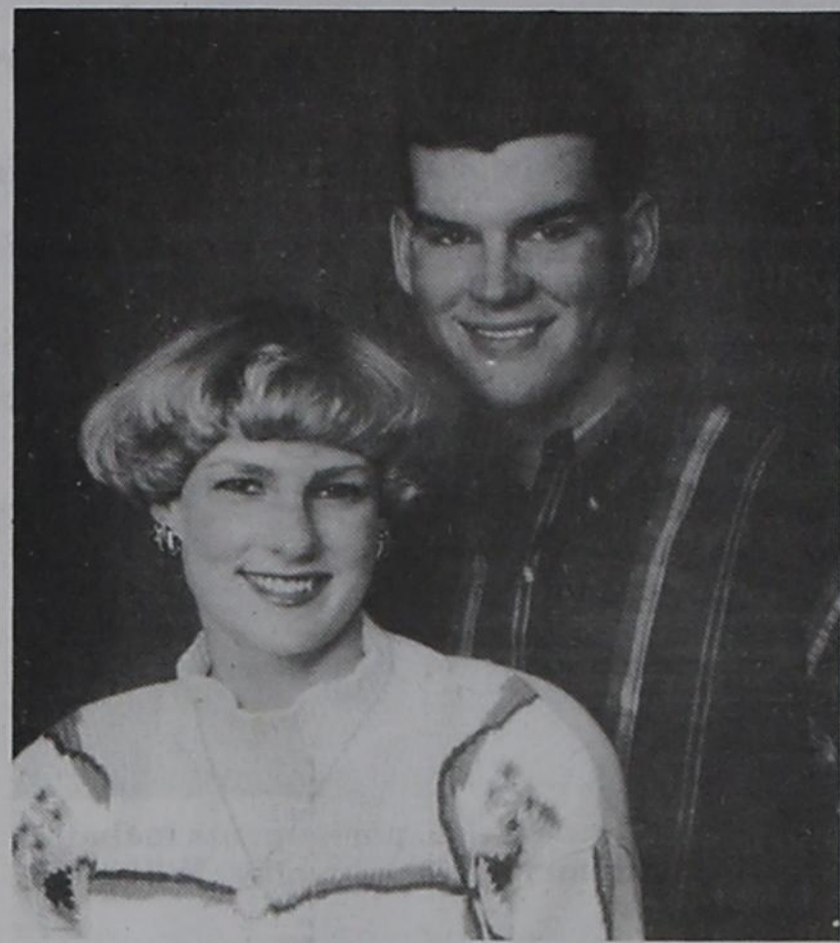

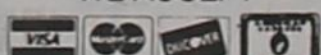

- 1 1/2 c. (12 oz.) cleaned, cooked shrimp

- 6 - 9" flour tortillas

### 4-H Bucket Calf project upcoming

Parmer County youngsters ages 5-12 are invited to participate in the 1994 4-H Bucket Calf Project, said Gary Patterson, Parmer County Extension Agent.

Youths will learn to care for calves from a few days up to 4 months of age. They will attend monthly weigh days through the summer when calves, weight gains will be monitored. A program will be presented at each weigh day on a variety of topics ranging from animal health and disease prevention to nutrition and feeding.

The project ends with the annual bucket calf show held in August. Project participants will maintain simple records of their project as well.

"This project was developed to minimize competition and maximize the learning opportunities," said Patterson. "Our goal is to get as many kids as possible exposed to the value of caring for an animal project. The daily care for a calf helps teach young people responsibility. This has been a tremendous project."

Guidelines for the project are simple. Calves are bought during May or early June. Calves need to be started on a milk replacer then gradually weaned to feed. Records are kept on the expenses of the project. All participants will receive awards at the completion of the project.

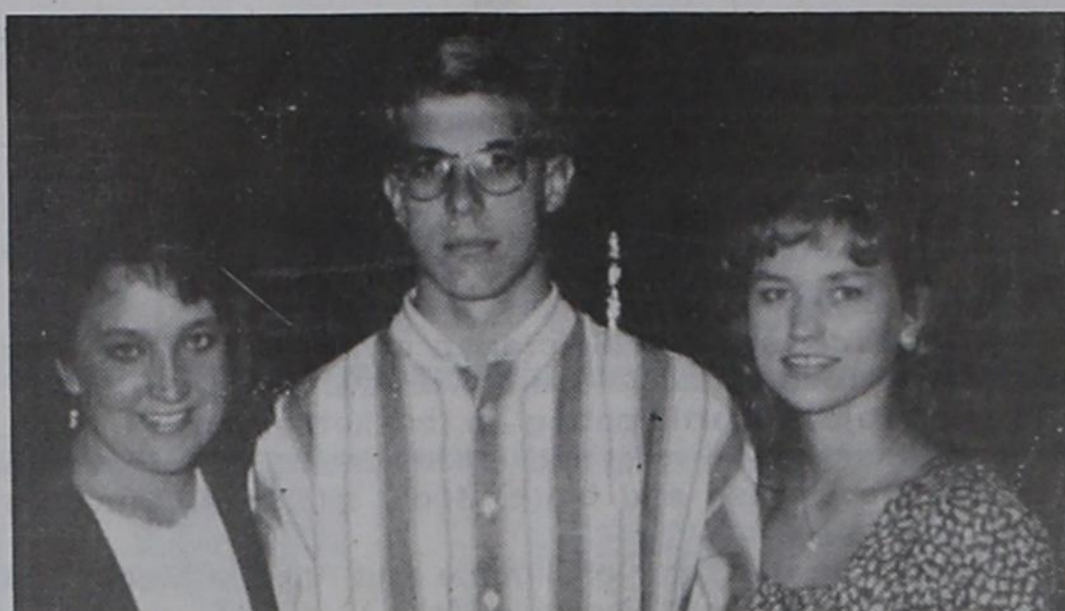

Texico had some super years from its JV basketball teams. The JV boys went 22-3 and the girls were 18-5.

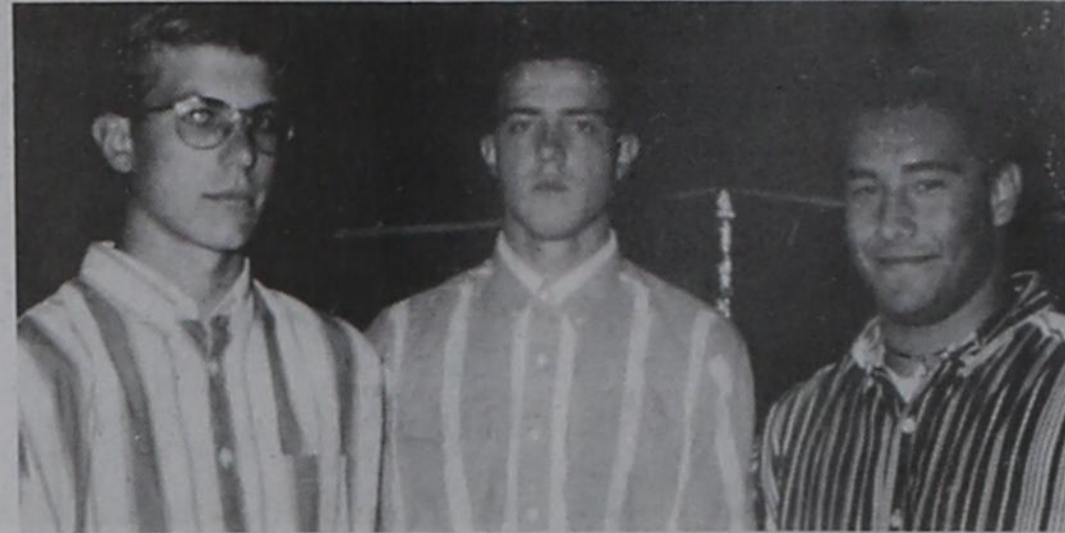

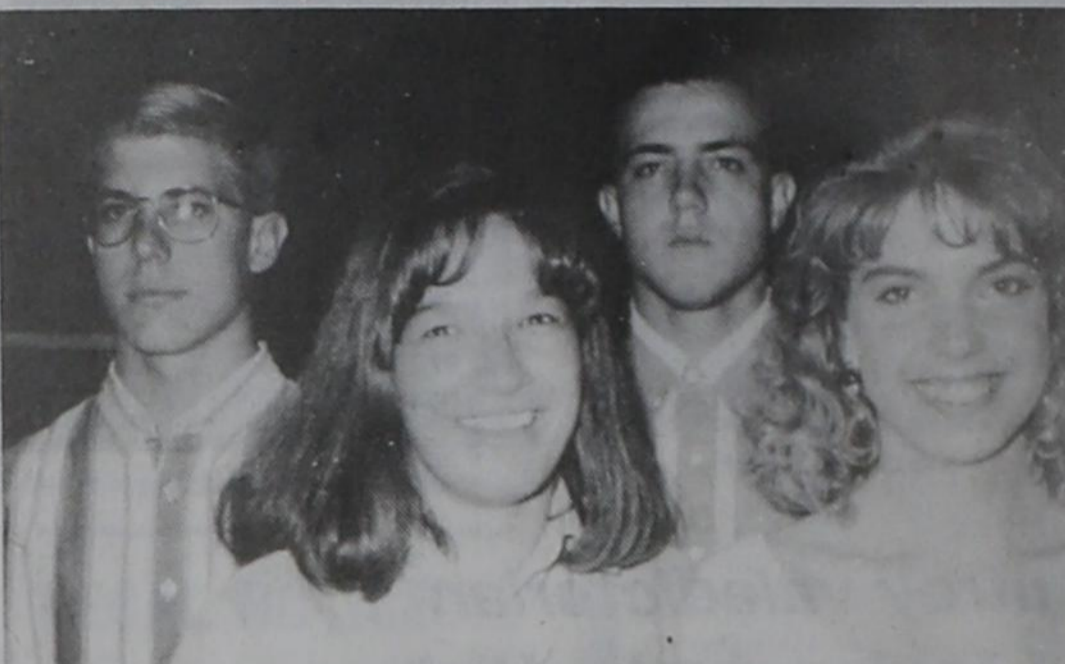
