### Farwell to halt band program

The Farwell School Board on Tuesday voted 4-3 to discontinue the band program.

In favor of the decision were Steve Kaltwasser, Mark Schwertner, Gary Patterson and Ronald Byrd.

Opposed were Teresa Ancira, David Norton and Mike Woods.

Participation in band had declined greatly in recent years. A poll of current high school students in band was taken recently and it showed that more than half of those in band were not planning to participate next year, said Supt. Larry Gregory.

Gregory said Farwell Schools is facing a \$400,000 cutback due to this year's lower enrollment. Currently, there are 517 students -- a drop of 51 from last year.

State officials have told Farwell to expect 470 students next year. So Gregory and the board are looking at cost savings now.

It looks to be a great season for cotton growers in and around Parmer County -- and the Parmer County Cotton Growers Cooperative is definitely going to be making some major changes.

Expansion-wise.

Manager Ron Riley says that they are going to be expanding the gin, therefore expanding capacity as well.

To expand capacity, they will be adding another overhead, cleaning equipment and 2 lummus 170 gin stands.

"And this," says Riley, "will bring our capacity to 60 bales an hour." That compares to the 28 to 30 bales that were being ginned last fall.

They are also increasing the pump capacity which, in turn, will increase press capacity. "So a lot of bales are going to fall out of the back," Riley jokes.

Riley says that there will be no need for any outside construction to take place. The people he has on staff will be able to handle the job sufficiently.

Last year, Parmer County Cotton Growers Co-op ginned close to 31,000 bales and Riley says that they could have been able to gin 8,000 to 10,000 more if they could have gotten to it in a timely manner.

With the expansion they will be able to gin 45,000 to 50,000 bales this year.

Parmer County farmers are expected to plant between 25 and 35 percent more acres of cotton. This increase of volume is a key reason for the expansion.

"It will be great for the communities," Riley states. They will be hiring another 5 or 6 people when the construction is over. "And potential customers can have their cotton ginned quickly and efficiently," added Riley

Riley encourages people to come out and look for themselves at how things are turning out.

Staff was re-hired, including auxiliary, secretaries, etc. Carolyn Scott was rehired as business manager.


Christa Rossan was okayed as a substitute teacher.

The weather day was changed from April 17 to April 20 after a poll of teachers was taken. This allows for a 5-day Easter holiday.



For many people, the word "estate" still implies vast wealth. But all of us will have estates, no matter what level of financial resources we end up with.

The big questions you need to answer are: Is your estate big enough to generate estate taxes? If so, what can you do to reduce these taxes for your heirs?

If your estate is worth less than \$650,000 in 1999, you can pass the entire amount free of estate taxes, to your heirs. (Over the next several years, this figure will increase, in stages, to \$1 million.)

You may think that \$650,000 is a lot of money, which it is. But when you consider that this threshold includes all your assets -savings, investments, retirement plans, insurance policies, cars, home -- you can see that it's attainable.

Your heirs will have to pay a minimum of 37 percent in estate taxes on every dollar over \$650,000 -- and this tax rate can go all the way up to 55 percent. Fortunately, there are ways


to combat this heavy tax By setting up a burden. properly structured living trust, you and your spouse will each be able to claim the \$650,000 exemption, thereby allowing your heirs to receive up to 1.3 million, free of estate taxes. You can use the living trust concept to achieve other goals. Suppose you'd like to give a substantial sum of money to a charitable organization, but you're not sure you can afford it. You may be able to solve this dilemma by setting up a charitable remainder trust. If you have an appreciated asset, such as a stock or a piece of land, you can transfer it to the trust, which then sells the asset at full market value. The trust then uses the proceeds to invest in incoming producing assets, out of which you will receive a lifetime income stream. When you die, the remaining assets got o the charitable organization you've chosen. By establishing this type of trust, you'll receive three types of tax benefits. First, you'll avoid paying capital gains taxes, because you won't own the asset when it's sold. Second, you'll reduce your current income taxes, because you'll receive a charitable income tax deduction. And third, you'll reduce your estate tax liability, because you've shifted an asset out of your estate. Living trusts and charitable remainder trusts can be complex, so you will need to consult with your legal and tax advisers before taking action.


