. . . the swift journeying of the Shepherds . . .


Mary and Joseph and the new-born Child . . .





At a recent city commission meet-ing, orders were issued that all pro-visions of the traffic ordinances must be rigidly enforced, and the commission gave W. G. Street, city secretary, and City Marshal J. L. Walraven instructions to see that this is done.

We are only asking that all people cooperate by parking within the white chalk lines, thus permitting more peo-ple to park on Main Street."
