## AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS DRESSED IN THEIR BEST WILL BE SHOWN AT SOUTH PLAINS FAIR

(Special to Leader)  
Littlefield, Texas, August 28.—Rex and others who prophesied storms would soon turn the plains into a barren waste get an eye full should they attend the agricultural show at the South Plains Fair here here 23 to 28.

The building will be doubled in size to accommodate the big show.

Vocational, community and individual agricultural exhibitors are competing for a thousand in premiums and prizes.

Cotton, Queen Wheat, Crown Grain Sorghum, the Royal of vegetables, fruits, hay, Sudan grass, peanuts, alfalfa, and other agricultural products will be in their best clothes and ready to the thousands of fair

visitors who will trek through the Agricultural Building.

County exhibits from Bailey, Lamb, Hale, Cochran, Hockley, Crosby, Terry, Lynn, Garza, Gaines, Dawson and other counties will compete for honors and \$475 in prizes. First place will get \$75, second \$60, and so on down the line to the last prize of \$25 which is the minimum any county will get.

At least 20 vocational agricultural exhibits will be set up this year, competing for \$200 in prizes, the top getting \$25.

Lubbock county community exhibitors will compete for \$110, the top getting \$25 and individual exhibitors will compete for approximately \$200 in prizes on individual agricultural and vegetable crops.

A new entertainment feature, the newly acquired Harley Sadler three-ring circus will play at the fair the last three days. Harley Sadler's circus is larger than any that has visited this section in several years.

## New Road Project Would Increase Highway 7 Travel

The Scurry County Times, published at Snyder, says:

Delegates from Nolan, Runnels and Coleman counties were in Austin Tuesday afternoon to appear before the State Highway Commission asking that the proposed Sweetwater-Winters-Coleman highway be built, with asphalt topping, as a lateral road project, said the Sweetwater Daily Reporter.

Preliminary estimates show cost of such construction would be in the neighborhood of \$200,000, which would be derived from federal funds earmarked for building "farm-to-market" lateral roads.

The three counties hope that the lateral road might later be designated as a state highway.

If the proposed strip is built, new traffic would be pulled onto Highway No. 7 and thus through Scurry County and on toward Lubbock. The improvement would save about 16 miles between Sweetwater and Coleman, in addition to providing a hard-surfaced route.

Commissioners courts of each of the three counties—Nolan, Runnels and Coleman—have set the project as No. 1 in the WPA program. They are hopeful of having the commission take the burden from the local sources and construct the road.

Starting from Sweetwater, the route would go over State Highway No. 70 south for about 14 miles, thence south and east across the Divide and to Hylton and the Runnels County line, a distance of 17 miles.

**Million Dollar Hall Of State Is Feature Of Centennial Exposition**



Central unit of the Texas Centennial Exposition, the Texas State Building will cost \$1,200,000. Designed by a committee of Texas architects, the building will be a massive structure of Texas limestone with a frontal width of 488 feet, a depth of 258 feet and 80 feet high at its center, where the Niche of Heroes will be located. The two front wings will be occupied by re-

gional rooms, devoted to the four geographical divisions of the state—East, West, North and South—while at the extreme ends will be the Halls of 1836 and 1936.

Forming a third wing, extending to the rear from the Niche of Heroes, will be the Great Hall of Texas. This hall will be a large room with six semi-circular bays in which will be displayed flags of the six

governments that have ruled Texas. At one end, silhouetted against stained-glass windows, will be a heroic statue symbolic of Texas. On the floor will be outlined a map of Texas with bronze markers showing historic places and old pioneer trails. Murals will decorate the bays and walls of the regional rooms. Below the great hall will be an auditorium. The walls of the Niche of Heroes,

behind its columns, will bear relief, heroic figures of the heroes of Texas, while windows in the side colonnade will be placed smaller figures of historic Texas characters.

The interior of the Hall will be a replica of a Texas while that of the Hall of 1936 will be modern.

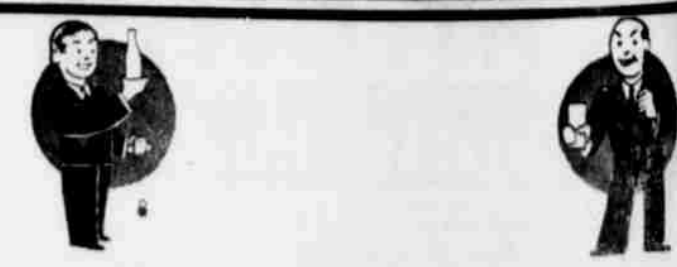
