One need not be a prophet in order to foretell that the "Gifts-From-Washington" era will be a matter of history only

dred leaders to the possibility of dred leaders the possibility of It is not to be inferred that Farm Chemurgy is a cure-all for the ills of agriculture. Its function at best is to supplement the farmer's income from his existing outlets with new outlets to factories. Not every region of Tex as possesses the marked advantages from a chemurgic development stand rom a chemurgic development stand has taken its firmest hold in the piney woods where surveys show a standing wood fiber which can be converted into paper and plaustics, an annua production of $4,000,000$ bushels sweet potatoes as a source of com-
mercial starch, an array of veretable oil crops from cotton and Spanish peanuts to flax and possibly castor beans. These three fundamental sour ces of chemurgic raw materials give East Texas a marked advantage over most other regions of the state

The East Texas Chamber Commerce and enterprising leaders in Gladewater and Beaumont were quick oo realize their natural advantages not only of caw materials in the form of cellulose and lignin, starch; vegetable oils and protein, but the further ad vantage of cheap and abundant fuel in the form of natural gas and petrol. eum, vast deposits of iron, sulphur and salt. This combination is not easily duplicated. For this reason the farm che murgic movement fits East Texas like he proverbial glove. Of course common sense must be linked with re gional enthusiasm. A firm hand must e kept on the bridle. Careful surveys and piot plants must precede capital 0 insure the widest possible distribuion of its benefits to all concerned. Under sound guidance chemurgy can ransform an entire region by revital. zing an agriculture which has sunk o desperate levels but which needs only correct planning to provide new or enlarged sources of farm income. It will be well for other regions of Texas to take stock of their re. sources. As-these fit the pattern of paper mills, plastics, solvents, rapid drying oils, they should benefit. The application of chemical research in its itra-modern terms has vast possibil. ities.
