# **New Seatbelt Laws Are Now In Affect**

House Bill 537, all occupants of a passenger vehicle, no matter their age or where they are sitting in the vehicle, must be secured by a safety belt. Maximum fines can reach as high as \$200, plus court costs. (The previous law exempted anyone 17 and older from wearing a seat belt in the offense cannot be issued until back seat.)

The law also adds seat belt requirements for larger passenger vans.\* In addition, children younger than 8 must be in the appropriate child safety seat.

(This new law makes no changes to pick-up bed and school bus requirements.)

Buckle children into the appropriate child safety seat.




