





The pigs continued to look good as long as they were still nursing, but as soon as Dad weaned them, by moving them to another pen, they started to develop the same features as their mom. No matter how much we fed her and them, they stayed skinny. As if this wasn't problem enough, the old sow decided she really preferred chicken, over any other food we were feeding her.

It was just about suicide for a chicken to get in the old sows pen. She'd let it walk around in the pen, pecking at stuff on the ground until it began to feel comfortable, then she would sidle up beside it. In the blink of an eye, she'd grab the chicken. She probably ate more chickens in three or four months,
