### WHERE'D THE SERVICE STATION'S GO ?

Believe it or not...at one time service stations, or "fillin' stations," as most of us called them, would pump your gas for you. All you had to do, was drive up and stop next to the pump. Almost immediately, there'd be some young guy step up and ask you, "How much, regular or ethyl?" He would then proceed to check your oil, wash your windshield, check your tire pressures, and maybe, even check your brake fluid level. A lot of the time, if they weren't very busy, two of them would tag-team your car to get you done quicker. These jobs were usually manned by high school boys as a part time job, or even some young, married men. In addition to all that, a lot of stations would fix flats and do minor tune-up jobs. As an extra bonus, some boys even considered these jobs to be a good way to meet girls.

For a while, there were a few stations that would have a sign on some pumps that would say, "attendant," and another set of pumps that would say, "self service." The attendants would take your money and then bring back your change. A few people would pay with a check, but most paid with cash. You didn't have to worry about someone getting your credit card number, because credit cards hadn't been invented yet.

Dad said, at the time I was born, he had a job at a fillin' station, making thirteen dollars a week and was glad just to have a job.

I still think it would be nice, if you had a choice to have "full service" or not. Who knows, the tips might even be pretty good....

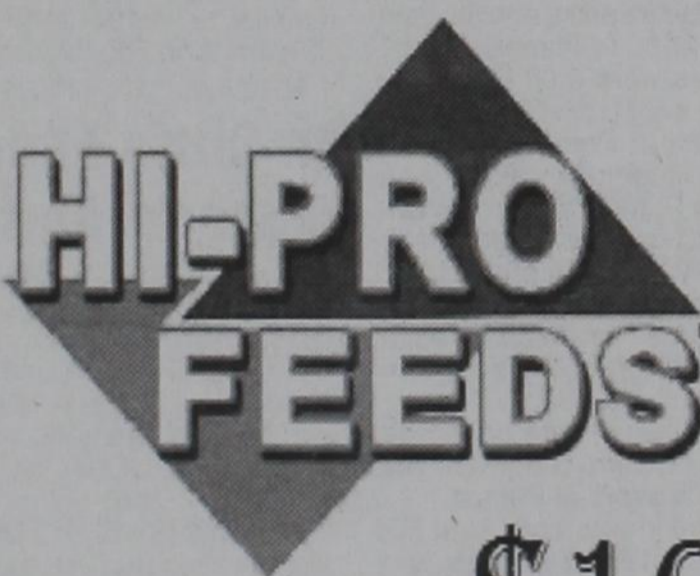

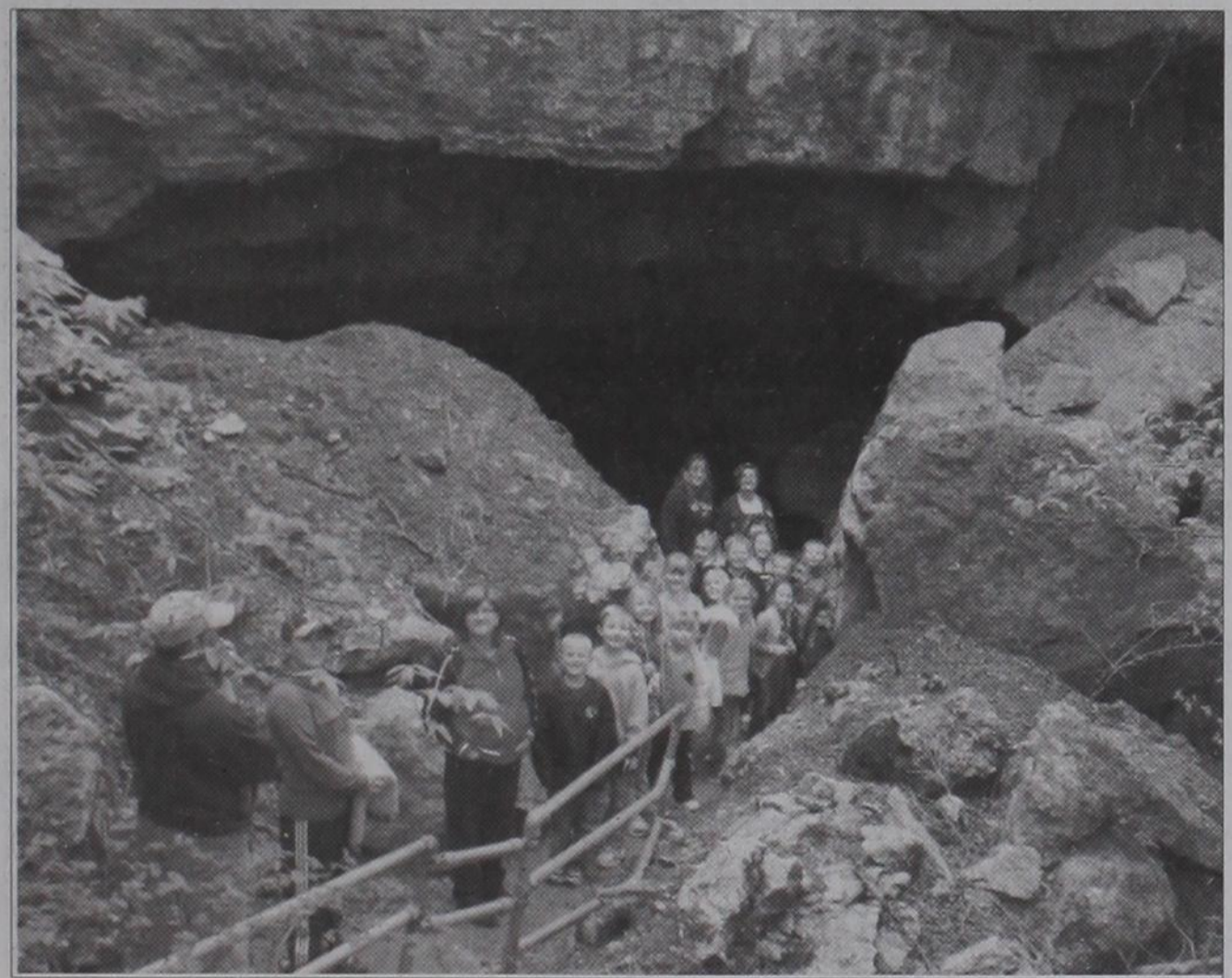

### Very Little Damage To Times Equipment

The Wheeler Fire Department was called to the Times building Tuesday morning after fire broke out in the back shop of the newspaper. Thanks to the quick action of the firemen, very little damage was reported. Eight or nine bundles of paper were destroyed; a couple of tables burned and one printing roller was ruined.

The Wheeler seniors were selling light bulbs to help finance their senior trip. 60-, 75- and 100-watt light bulbs were in packages of eight and sold for \$2.00.

J-Lee Department Store was having their "April Dollar Days" sale. Men's Jockey shirts were on sale for \$5. Ship 'n Shore blouses were on sale for \$2.98; or, you could get a "Fabulous Dallas Cotton" dress for \$6.95.

The bargain at Clay Food Store was U.S.D.A. Grade A Guaranteed Fresh Fryers for 59c each. Twelve cans of Ballard or Pillsbury biscuits were 89c.

The Wheeler Times was looking for someone to write "Personals" for the times. The editor, Don Earney, wrote: "The pay is small, the rewards few and the gripes are many, but we need someone."

The Baptists set a record Sunday; they had 353 in Sunday school and approximately 500 at the Sunday morning service.

Cecil Pierce was in Ft. Ord, Calif., taking his basic training.

The election results for 1961-61 Student Council were announced. Officers were president, G. C. Baker; Chaplain, Carol Gandy and Song Leader, Gwen Barnes.

### Parkview Artery Shaking Baby Syndrome

Shaken baby syndrome (SBS) is a collective term for the internal head injuries a baby or young child sustains from being violently shaken. (Every year, nearly 50,000 children in the United States are forcefully shaken by their caretakers. More than 60 percent of these children are boys. Nearly 2,000 children die every year as a result of being shaken. The victims are on average six to eight months old, but may be as old as five years or as young as a few days.

Men are more likely than women to shake a child; typically, these men are in their early 20s and are the baby's father or the mother's boyfriend. Women who inflict SBS are more likely to be babysitters or child care providers than the baby's mother. The shaking may occur as a response of frustration to the baby's inconsolable crying or as an action of routine abuse.

Infants and small children are especially vulnerable to SBS because their neck muscles are still too weak to adequately support their disproportionately large heads, and their young brain tissue and blood vessels are extremely fragile. When an infant is vigorously shaken by the arms, legs, shoulders, or chest, the whiplash motion repeatedly jars the baby's brain with tremendous force, causing internal damage and bleeding. While there may be no obvious external signs of injury following shaking, the child may suffer internally from brain bleeding and bruising (called subdural hemorrhage and hematoma); brain swelling and damage; mental retardation; blindness, hearing loss, paralysis, speech impairment, and learning disabilities; and death.

Prevention  
Shaken baby syndrome is preventable with public education. Adults must be actively taught that shaking a child is never acceptable and can cause severe injury or death.

### Renewable Energy Funds Available

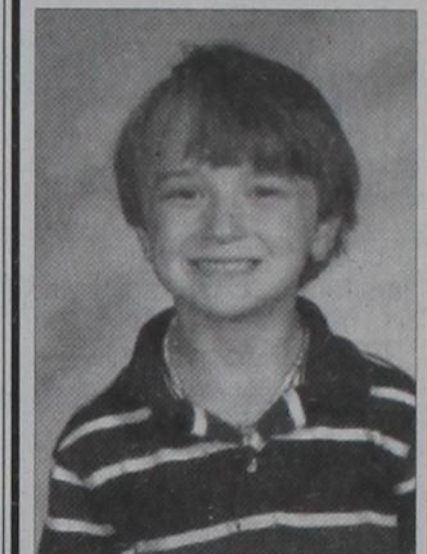
Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack invites agricultural producers and rural small businesses to apply for loans and grants to implement renewable energy systems and make energy efficiency improvements. "Biofuels and other renewable energy sources present an enormous economic opportunity for rural America and the rest of the nation," Vilsack said. "President Obama and I recognize that we need to win the future by implementing a long-term strategy to meet our country's current and long-term energy needs. The funding I am announcing today will help make America's farmers, ranchers and rural businesses more energy efficient."

"We're pleased to offer this funding availability to those who are interested in identifying and implementing projects that will conserve energy," said Paco Valentin, Texas State Director of USDA Rural Development. "Projects funded through Rural Development's REAP program reduce our dependence on foreign resources and help Americans become more energy-efficient."

USDA is providing funding for up to \$61 million in guaranteed loans and \$42 million in grants through the Rural Energy for America Program (REAP). Funds are available to help agricultural producers and rural small businesses develop renewable energy systems, including assistance to fuel station owners to install flexible fuel pumps that will offer Americans more renewable energy options. In addition, funding is available for energy efficiency improvements and studies to determine the feasibility of renewable energy systems.

Recently, USDA issued a rule to clarify that the definition of renewable energy systems in REAP includes flexible fuel pumps, sometimes referred to as "blender pumps." This clarification is intended to provide fuel station owners (Continued Page 5)

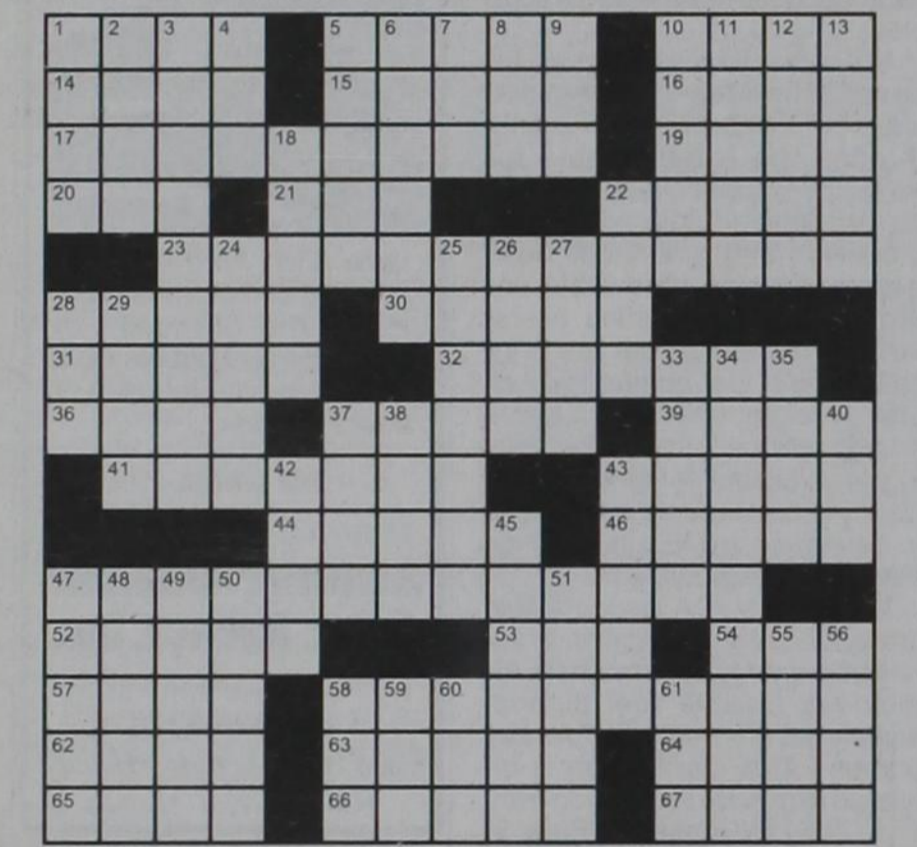

## Seatbelts Have Save 2,800 Lives


Officials are pointing to a 10-year-old campaign which urges seat belt use — Click It or Ticket — as the reason for fewer traffic fatalities and injuries in the state since the program began. ((The program has saved more than 2,800 lives and led to 48,000 fewer serious injuries while lowering related costs by \$10 billion, according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. Prior to the campaign, only about 76 percent of the people on Texas roads reported using seat belts in vehicles. Last year, the Texas Transportation Institute reported, the usage rate reached almost 94 percent. ((This year's campaign will be May 23-June 5, as thousands of the Texas law enforcement officers will work additional hours to check for seat belt use. ((The officers' real mission is to save lives," said Bev Kellner, Texas AgriLife Extension Service passenger safety program manager. "For every percentage point our usage rate goes up, many lives are saved and many serious injuries are prevented. ((We've come a long way, but there's still more work to be done," Kellner said. "Though traffic fatalities are down, motor vehicle crashes are still the leading cause of death for Texans aged 44 and under." ((Kellner said that in 2009, more than 3,000 Texans died in vehicle crashes and nearly half of those killed were unbuckled. ((Unfortunately, there are some groups that are still resistant to wearing their seat belt - young drivers, especially young men, as well as pickup truck drivers and their passengers have a lower usage rate," she said. "Getting pickup truck drivers and passengers to buckle up is especially important because pickup trucks are twice as likely to roll as passenger vehicles. In fact, wearing your seat belt reduces the risk of fatal injury by 45 percent, and in pickups, that number increases to 60 percent." ((According to the Texas Department of Transportation, in 2010 half of pickup truck drivers killed in traffic crashes were not buckled up. ((Kellner said the Click It or Ticket campaign combines education and enforcement to achieve compliance with seat belt use. ((She noted that buckling up is not just for passengers in the front seat. Since 2009 the seat belt law in Texas requires all passengers both front and back to buckle up in every position where there is a seat belt. The law also includes 12- and 15-passenger vans. ((For children, the law states that all children under age 8, unless taller than 4 feet-9 inches, need to be in a child safety seat system. For best practice, experts recommend, keep children under 4 feet-9 inches tall in a booster seat until the vehicle seat belt fits them properly. ((Our goal this year is to get every Texan to always buckle up, on every trip,

every time so we can celebrate more lives saved next year," Kellner said. ((For more information, see <http://www.texasclickitorticket.com/>. (-30-


