



### Parkview Artery **Shaking Baby** Syndrome

Shaken baby syndrome (SBS) is a collective term for the internal head injuries a baby or young child sustains from being violently shaken. ( (Every year, nearly 50,000 children in the United States are forcefully shaken by their caretakers. More than 60 percent of these children are boys. Nearly 2,000 children die every year as a result of being shaken. The victims are on average six to eight months old, but may be as old as five years or as young as a

few days. Men are more likely than women to shake a child; typically, these men are in their early 20s and are the baby's father or the mother's boyfriend. Women who inflict SBS are more likely to be babysitters or child care providers than the baby's mother. The shaking may occur as a response of frustration to the baby's inconsolable crying or as an action of routine abuse.

Infants and small children are especially vulnerable to SBS because their neck muscles are still too weak to adequately support their disproportionately large heads, and their young brain tissue and blood vessels are extremely fragile. When an infant is vigorously shaken by the arms, legs, shoulders, or chest, the whiplash motion repeatedly jars the baby's brain with tremendous force, causing internal damage and bleeding. While there may be no obvious external signs of injury following shaking, the child may suffer internally from brain bleeding and bruising (called subdural hemorrhage and hematoma); brain swelling and damage; mental retardation; blindness, hearing loss, paralysis, speech impairment, and learning disabilities; and death. Prevention

Shaken baby syndrome is preventable with public education. Adults must be actively taught that shaking a child is never acceptable and can cause severe injury or death.







## Seatbelts Have Save 2.800 Lives

Officials are pointing to a 10year-old campaign which urges seat belt use - Click It or Ticket as the reason for fewer traffic fatalities and injuries in the state since the program began. ( (The program has saved more than 2,800 lives and led to 48,000 30fewer serious injuries while lowering related costs by \$10 billion, according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. Prior to the campaign, only about 76 percent of the people on Texas roads reported using seat belts in vehicles. Last year, the Texas Transportation Institute reported, the usage rate reached almost 94 percent. ((This year's campaign will be May 23-June 5, as thousands of the Texas law enforcement officers will work additional hours to check for seat belt use. ( ("The officers' real mission is to save lives," said Bev Kellner, Texas AgriLife Extension Service passenger safety program manager. "For every percentage point our usage rate goes up, many lives are saved and many serious injuries are prevented. ( "We've come a long way, but there's still more work to be done," Kellner said. "Though traffic fatalities are down, motor vehicle crashes are still the leading cause of death for Texans aged 44 and under." ( (Kellner said that in 2009, more than 3,000 Texans died in vehicle crashes and nearly half of those killed were unbuckled. ( ("Unfortunately, there are some groups that are still resistant to wearing their seat belt - young drivers, especially young men, as well as pickup truck drivers and their passengers have a lower usage rate," she said. "Getting pickup truck drivers and passengers to buckle up is especially important because pickup trucks are twice as likely to roll as passenger vehicles. In fact, wearing your seat belt reduces the risk of fatal injury by 45 percent, and in pickups, that number increases to 60 percent." ( (According to the Texas Department of Transportation, in 2010 half of pickup truck drivers killed in traffic crashes were not buckled up. ( (Keliner said the Click It or Ticket Ccampaign combines education and enforcement to achieve compliance with seat belt use. ((She noted that buckling up is not just for passengers in the front seat. Since 2009 the seat belt law in Texas requires all passengers both front and back to buckle up in every position where there is a seat belt. The law also includes 12- and 15-passenger vans. ( (For children, the law states that all children under age 8, unless taller than 4 feet-9 inches, need to be in a child safety seat system. For best practice, experts recommend, keep children under 4 feet-9 inches tall in a booster seat until the vehicle seat belt fits them properly. ( ("Our goal this year is to get every Texan

Renew (from Page 3) ers with incentives to install flexible fuel pumps that will offer Americans more renewable energy options. The Obama administration has set a goal of installing 10,000 flexible fuel pumps

to always buckle up, on every trip,

nationwide within 5 years. The rule also makes the following clarifications:

· Grants are available for audits of energy improvements and studies to determine the feasibility of renewable energy systems; and

· Agricultural producers in nonrural areas are eligible for REAP assistance. Small businesses must still be located in rural areas. This clarification makes REAP eligibility requirements consistent with those of other USDA energy

programs. Under REAP, local businesses receive assistance to deploy wind, solar and other forms of renewable energy. For example, in Texas, the Red Caboose Winery was a recipient of a REAP grant in 2010. The grant was used to create an electric generating system with 44 photovoltaic panels and 2 inverters, which generate 9.9 kH of electricity. The system is tied to the grid, and any excess electricity is fed onto the grid. Red Caboose Winery is the most sustainable winery in Texas and the only winery that generates 100% of its own electricity. The winery uses 100% rainwater for irrigation in the vineyards, recycles all of their barrels, and composts all of their waste.

The deadline for submitting completed REAP applications for renewable energy and energy efficiency improvement programs is June 15. For renewable energy feasibility studies, energy audits and renewable energy development assistance grants, the deadline to apply is June 30. 

Examples of large shade trees are maples, oaks, spruce and many pine species.

· To slow strong winter winds, many people use evergreen trees, but large deciduous trees work well, too. Windbreaks should be planted on the north side of your home, a fair distance from the nearest structure. Spruce, firs and pine trees make fine windbreaks.

Before you plant, you should also discover which trees grow best in Texas. To do so, consult the Arbor Day Foundation's Har-Мар diness Zone www.arborday.org/treeinfo, or

contact a local nursery or arborist. Once you've determined the function of your tree and which species you'd like, you're ready to plant. You must take special care of your tree during planting time to ensure that it will grow healthy and strong.

When planting a containerized tree, there are six steps you need

1. Call before you dig. Call the 811 hotline to have underground utilities located. (2. Handle your tree with care. Always lift it up by its root ball and keep its roots moist until you plant it. (3. Dig the proper hole. Dig 2 to 5 times wider than the diameter of the root ball with sloping sides. (4. Dig to the proper depth. The trunk flare of your tree should sit slightly above ground level. (5. Back fill the hole with native soil. That is, unless the soil is all clay. Tamp soil gently to fill large air spaces. (6. Mulch your new tree. Add 2-3 inches of mulch around the planting area but keep it 1-2




