

# THRIFTWAY OPENS NEW BUILDING, 15,500 Sq. Ft.

## 'Grand Opening' Ceremonies Tues.

Thriftway in Wheeler will open the doors of their new store in Wheeler Tuesday morning at 7:00. The Grand Opening ceremonies will begin at

10:00 a.m. Tuesday. Door prizes, free samples, free balloons, lots of bargains and many surprises will be offered through the -- days of celebration.

wife Julia became partners in the store in 1960. In 1963 the business was enlarged. Twenty-five feet was added to the west side of the existing building, which made the building 75'x125'

Thriftway, an Affiliated Foods store, is owned and operated by Johnny and Donna Velasquez of Wheeler. Johnny and Donna purchased the store and began operation of the business in October of 1977.

The new facility is located at 300 East Oklahoma Avenue (east highway 152). The building houses 15,000 square feet and paved parking is offered for 70 cars. The building offers a greater selection in all departments, spacious shopping areas, modern scanning check-out registers and expanded deli.

Ground breaking ceremonies were held Monday, November 28, 1988. The contract, issued to Plains Builders, Inc., allowed 120 working days for completion.

The property used is 3/4 of the 300 block of Oklahoma Ave. The building faces the north and is located on the southeast corner of the property, directly behind the General Telephone

building. Parking for the store is to the northwest and directly in front of the store. The cotton gin and mill once occupied this property.

The business was begun in June of 1939 and operated for 32 years a Clay Food Store. Mrs. Linda Clay with her daughter and son-in-law, Lottie Eva and Cecil Denson, opened the store on the south side of the square in Wheeler.

The store operated on the south side of the square for a few years with a nice business and moved across the street to a large frame building on the corner one the west side of Main Street. It was from this location that the business began to grow. The location was ideal for people to gather on Saturday evenings and Saturday nights. Many customers would buy their weekly supply of groceries, then set them aside and go to the "mid-night preview" at the Rogue Theatre. After the show was over, which was between 12:30 and 1:00 a.m., they would call for their groceries and go on their way home.

During World War II merchandise became hard to get; Cecil went to work at the Amarillo Air Force Base Commissary. The two women and the Densons two children stayed in Wheeler and managed the store. After the war, the business prospered.

In 1949 a severe wind storm damaged the frame building, housing the store. Faced with the finding of a new location, the Densons moved back to the south side of the square and operated from two different buildings. A new building was erected at the corner of West Texas and Canadian—the building's present location.

In 1971 the business was sold to Cliff Pritchard of Shamrock and was operated under the name of Pritchard's Thriftway. The business was operated by Cliff and Jerry Pritchard, brothers, for six years.

In October, 1977, Johnny and Donna Velasquez with their three children, Tommy (age 6) Jana (age 3) and Casey (age 1 1/2) were living in Mobeetie, where they owned and operated Mobeetie Grocery. They had been in Mobeetie for five years. The couple operated both businesses for a period of six months and sold the Mobeetie business and moved to Wheeler to devote full time to running Thriftway.

A delicatessen and Bakery were added in 1980 to better serve their customers.

Changes and redecoration has taken place over the next years, but nothing compares to the opening of the new facility.

The area Volunteer Fire Departments fought a grass fire Tuesday south of Wheeler. The seven-alarm fire was first reported at 11:30 a.m.; Wheeler Volunteer Fire Department reported to the scene 3 miles south of Wheeler.

The "controlled burn" was intentionally set, but a sudden increase in the wind quickly blew the flames out of control.

Additional help was requested and Shisco's was paged at 11:37. Briscoe's firemen were requested at 11:40. The Mobeetie Volunteer firemen were called into action at 11:59. Sweetwater called, and their help was accepted at 12:55. Allison's Fire Department was called at 12:55 and Kelton's help was requested at 1:48.

The Wheeler Volunteer Ambulance Service reported to the scene at 11:59 with gatorade. One fireman was taken to Parkview Hospital for treatment of minor burns to the ear.

The fire was brought under control around 3:00 p.m. An estimated 550 acres were blackened by the fire.

## AREA ATHLETES EARN PLACE IN REGIONAL MEETS

### Mustangs Win 7th District Championship

The Wheeler Mustangs won their seventh consecutive District Championship in track this past weekend.

The Mustangs were in a close battle with Booker throughout the afternoon, but managed a narrow 159 to 147 win. McLean followed with 92 points, with Fellet scoring 65.

A total of seven tracksters qualified for the Regional Competition to be held in Levelland at South Plains College.

Chad Bentley and Kelly Aderholt both qualified in three events, with Chad placing second in the 800 m dash (2:05) and 1600 m run (4:48).

Chad and Kelly, along with Mack Marshall and Michael Kenney tied for first place in the 1600 m relay in a dead heat with Booker (3:42). Kelly placed first in the 400 m dash (52.5) and also ran on the first place 400 m relay team with Shane Guest, Ike Finsterwald, and Shawn Bradstreet (45.9).

Michael Kenney brought home the gold in the high jump competition with a personal best of 6'6". Michael also placed third in the pole vault with a vault of 10'6".

Shawn Bradstreet qualified in the pole vault with a vault of 10'6" in addition to the 400 m relay. Shawn also placed 6th in the long jump (19'2") and placed 3rd in the 100 m dash (11.8) and fourth in the 200 m dash (23.6).

Ike Finsterwald qualified second in the 400 m relay (53.5) a personal best, and also in the 400 m relay. Ike placed third in the 200 m dash with a personal best of 23.4, and
