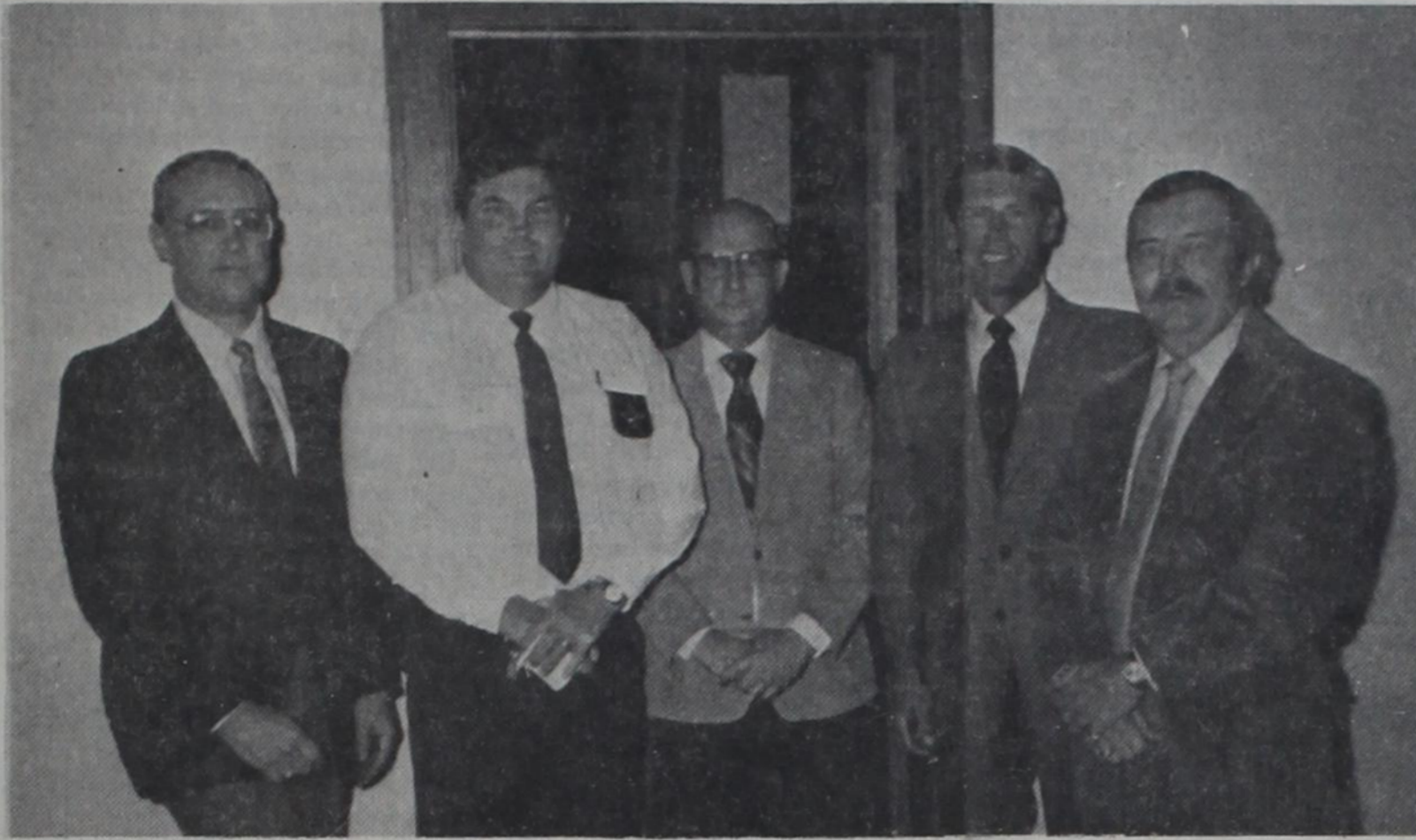

### From the Minister's Desk:

Have you heard about the middle-aged bachelor who proposed to the middle-aged spinster?

As he began his proposal, he said: "I've good news for you." Her pointed reply was: "Good news? Why I've already got a cat that stays out late and a dog that growls at me, why do I need a husband?"

This humorous little story illustrates an important truth. This truth is that whether news is good or bad often depends upon the circumstances of the people who hear it.

But let me tell you some news that does not depend upon the circumstances of the people who hear it. This news is always good news!

This good news is composed of three facts. Please carefully consider these facts.

**Fact one:** You are loved by God. This love has been clearly demonstrated by the sacrificial death of His Son, Jesus Christ. The Apostle Paul wrote: "While we were still helpless, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. For one will hardly die for a righteous man; though perhaps for the good man someone would dare even to die. But God demonstrates His own love toward us in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us." (Romans 5:6-8)

**Fact two:** You can be a changed person.

One of the greatest truths of Christianity is that people can change. Perhaps the Apostle John is the best illustration of this change. He is often described as the apostle of love because he repeatedly emphasized love in the New Testament letters that he wrote. He is also described in his latter years by early church

historians as the gentlest man who repeatedly encouraged first century Christians to "love one another."

But John was not always such a man. When Jesus called John and his brother James to be apostles, He surname them, "Boanerges, that is, sons of Thunder." (Mark 3:17) John was apparently changed from a high-tempered disciple into an apostle of love.

How was this change accomplished? The Apostle Paul wrote: "If any man is in Christ, he is a new creature; the old things passed away; behold, new things have come." (II Corinthians 5:17)

To be a changed person, a person must be "...in Christ...". And the New Testament teaches that a person is "...in Christ..." when he is baptized into Christ. (Galatians 3:26-27). When a person is baptized into Christ, he is a "...new creature..." who is gradually changed into the likeness of Jesus. (Colossians 3:1-10, Ephesians 4:17-24)

**Fact three:** You can choose. You are not a pawn or a puppet. Jesus does not demand or force a person to be His disciple. He said: "If anyone wishes to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow Me." (Matthew 16:25)

Notice that Jesus offered voluntary servitude. He said: "If anyone wished to come after me..." You can choose to accept or to reject Jesus' offer of discipleship. It is entirely your choice to make.

I hope that you will carefully consider these three facts. I think that you will agree that these facts compose good news, regardless of what the circumstances of your life may be.

## About Our Schools

**"Middle School— A Tough Time"**  
The middle school or high school years are difficult ones for many students. But most of the problems that children encounter during this time are not related directly to their school experiences. Rather, these problems pertain to the changes that occur as children mature physically, emotionally, and socially. It is during the middle school years that children acquire some of the characteristics that we associate with adulthood. These students are consumed with a desire to be like others, and they experience much pressure to be "in" with their peers. It's surprising that middle school students are able to concentrate on formal learning at all during these years.

Many parents add to the pressures of this period by exhibiting anxiety as their children move from the "safety" of the elementary school to the "uncertainty" of the middle school or junior high school. And parents may even make it more difficult for their children by hurrying them into social situations and competitive activities that they are not yet ready for. Parents can help their children during this period by recognizing two realities. First, all youngsters go through these years and some youngsters will have an easier time of it than others. Second, during this period, children need strong parental support and encouragement. In addition, there are six specific things we can do to help our children during the middle school years.

First, provide support for your child as he or she learns to be an independent human being. At the same time, provide your child with opportunities for becoming more independent. Encourage your child to accept the responsibility that must accompany independence.

Second, avoid overreacting to the many "problems" and emotional changes that seem to be occurring in your child. Most of these changes are normal. Although problems associated with maturing will be more severe in some youngsters, they are a part of growing up and they can be resolved.

Third, don't make excuses for undesirable behavior that your child may exhibit. Rather, remain firm about the proper behavior, courtesy, and respect that you expect your child to demonstrate toward you and others.

Fourth, don't push your child into social situations and competitive activities that he or she is not yet ready for. When your child feels emotionally, socially, and physically ready to enter these situations, offer your encouragement.

Fifth, encourage your child

academically. While it seems that children are interested in nearly everything except classroom work during this time, they will respond positively if you praise and encourage their academic endeavors.

Sixth, keep in contact with the school and become involved in school activities. Know the course of study your child is taking, and get to know his or her teachers.

Yes, the middle school or junior high school years are considered to be tough times for many students. But by showing understanding, encouragement and support, parents can help make those years enjoyable and successful for their children—as they should be.

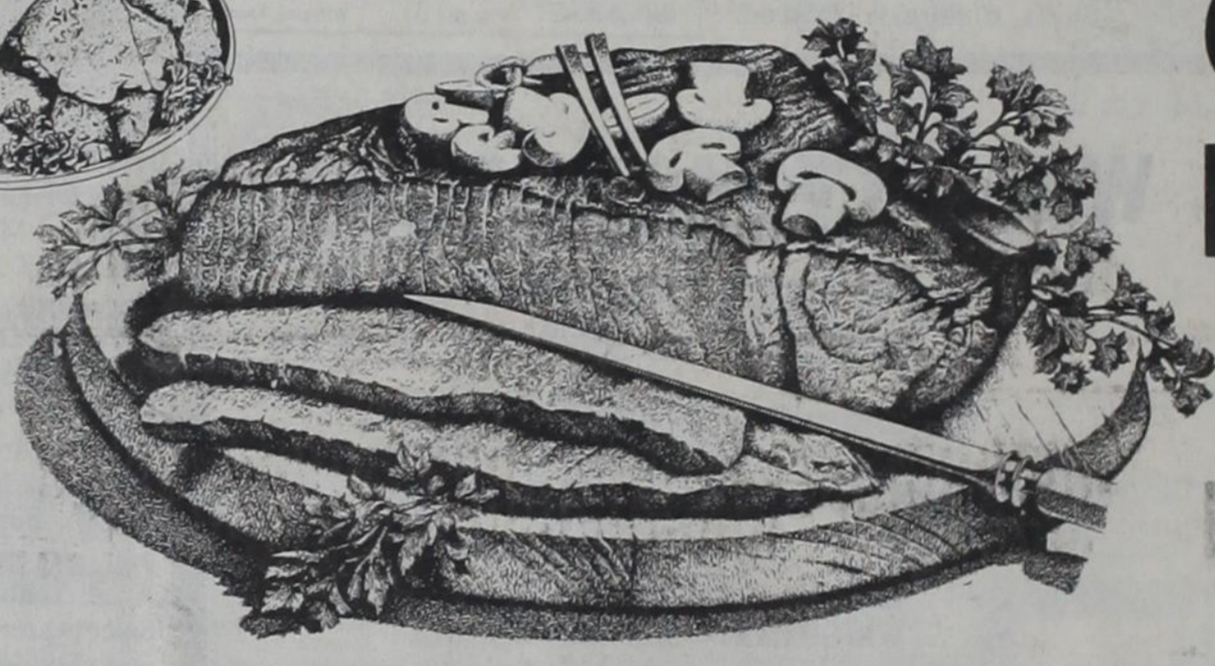
