ORDINANCE NO 193

TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO.25 AN ORDINANCE MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO DISCHARGE FIREWORKS WITHIN THE CITY OF WHEELER, DEFINING THE TERM FIREWORKS AND PRO-VIDING A PENALTY AND A SAV-ING CLAUSE.

SECTION 1.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Wheeler that it shall hereinafter be unlawful for any person to discharge any fireworks of any kind or size anywhere within the city limits except for the July 4th fireworks presented to the Public by the Wheeler Fire Department at the City Park.

The term "fireworks" shall mean and include any fire cracker, roman candle, torpedo, sky rocket or any other combustible package or contrivance of inflammable or combustible material, regardless of the name whether named or not capable of producing audible, visible or physical effects.

SECTION 2. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not exceeding one hun-

dred dollars. SECTION 3.

The declaring of any section or portion of the above ordinance unconstitutional or in violation of State or Federal law or city charter shall not effect the remaining sections or portion of such ordi-






