Weed Control Helps To Get A Stand Of Grass

Recent rains have been beneficial for newly planted grass and for grass that was planted last year. Observations over the county indicate that newly seeded grass, primarily lovegrass, is developing into a good stand. Native grass seedlings from last year are improving. Weeds are going to interfere with grass establishment.

Planting grass is an expensive conservation practice, and once the seed has been planted, one or more weed controls may be necessary to obtain a good stand of grass. The benefits of weed control almost always offset the cost involved. Herbicidal weed control is generally more effective than mechanical weed control, especially when perennial weeds are encountered.

Grass can occasionally be established without weed control. Considering the cost involved with planting, it makes good sense to improve the odds for getting a stand by applying timely weed control.

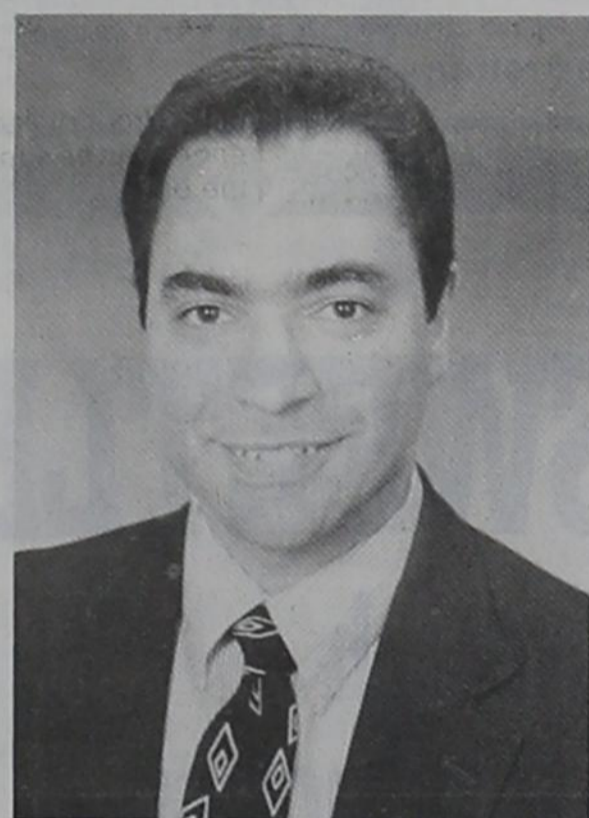

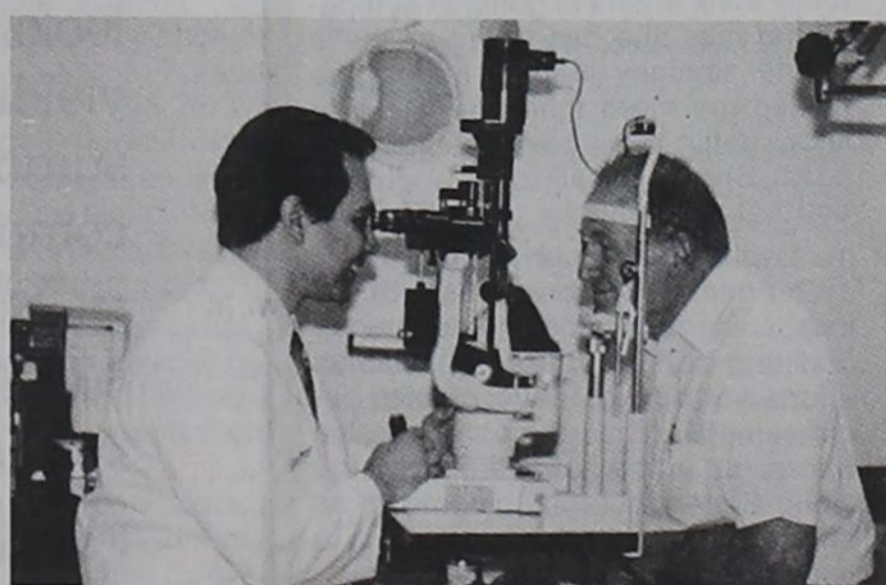
