p.m. at the United Methodist Church in Allison, TX. with Gary Jahnel and Rev. Tom Carter officiating. Burial will be in the Cataline

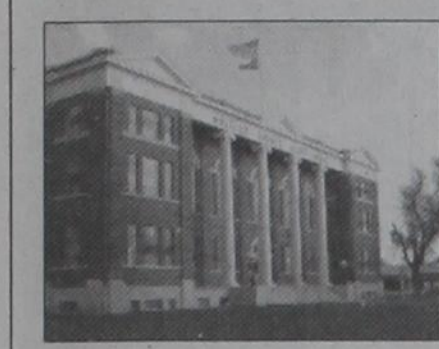
Cemetery, Allison, TX under the direction of Wright Funeral Home, Wheeler, TX.

## STORM REPORT

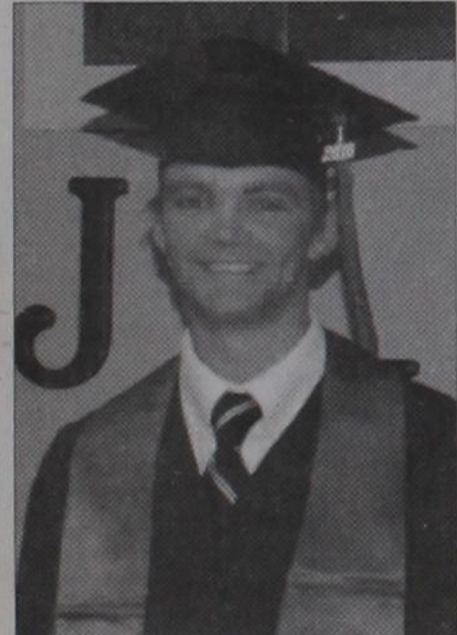
As Reported by Stormie Meriwether, First Grade Student

## Mayor And Four Councilmen To Be Named in May Election

With the death of Wanda Herd, Bob McCain, mayor pro-tem, took over the duties of mayor. At the November meeting of the council, Bob McCain was appointed as mayor and took the oath of office at the December meeting. Also at the December meeting, Don Rose was appointed to fill the vacancy on the council left with the appointment as Bob McCain as mayor. Walter Simmons was named Mayor Pro-tem. Appointed individuals serve only until the next regular election, at which time individuals will be elected to fill the unexpired terms.

The City of Wheeler will hold an election May 14, 2011, for the purpose of electing the mayor and (4) council members.

The opening in the mayor's race is for a one-year unexpired term, vacated by the death of Wanda Herd. To be elected for Place 2 will be for the unexpired term vacated with the appointment of Bob McCain, mayor pro-tem, to the office of Mayor.

Three 2-years positions on the council are to be filled with the 2011 election. Places 1, 3 and 5 are presently held by Walter Simmons, Barbra Koelzer, and Jim Hill respectively.

Last year Mayor Herd, Bob McCain and Stacy McCasland were re-elected to their places on the council.

## December Board Minutes Pay Increase Tabled For Parkview Employees

**DECEMBER 15, 2010**  
Chairman Thomas Helton called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. in the Board Room at Parkview Hospital. Present were: Thomas Helton, Chairman; James Batton, Secretary; Ray Hudson, and Dale Garner. Absent: Sue Chandler. Also present: Ann Fagan Cook, RN, BSN, CEO; Sue Stiles, RN, BSN, CNO and John P. Lavelle, M.D.

Chairman Helton called an Executive Session pursuant to Texas Govt. Code 551.074 - Personnel - Dr. John P. Lavelle at 6:02 p.m. Sue Chandler and Dr. Lavelle joined the session at 6:25 p.m. At 6:52 p.m. Chairman Helton excused Ann Fagan Cook and Sue Stiles from the session and they left the room.

At 7:30 p.m. the Board came out of Executive Session and Mrs. Cook and Mrs. Stiles rejoined the meeting. Dale Garner made a

motion reinstating Dr. Lavelle to full privileges with the exception that he would not work the ER at Parkview Hospital for Southwest Medical Associates at this time but could see his own patients in the Parkview ER. Before he returns to work here for Southwest, he will again come before the Board with that request. James Batton seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

Dr. Emilio Jacques was to meet with the Board but could not arrange his schedule for this month's meeting. This will be rescheduled when he is available.

Dale Garner made a motion to approve the consent agenda. James Batton seconded the motion. There was some discussion regarding some bills. Question was called and the motion passed unanimously.

Ann Fagan Cook presented the investment report. Ms. Fagan

Cook reported that two CD's did mature on December 12 and 14 respectively. Dale Garner made the motion directly Ms. Fagan Cook to obtain current rates tomorrow and put the CDs wherever the rate was highest. Ray Hudson seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Bad debt and charity write-offs were presented. Ray Hudson made a motion to accept the bad debt write-offs. James Batton seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously. Dale Garner made a motion to accept the charity write-offs. Sue Chandler seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Ms. Fagan Cook presented the QAPI minutes and scorecards. There was discussion regarding some of the financial indicators. James Batton made the motion to approve the reports as presented. Sue Chandler seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Chairman Helton reopened the discussion regarding staff pay increases that was discussed last month. Mrs. Stiles and Ms. Fagan Cook both shared some different ways of computing pay increases that would be fair and equitable to all.

An across-the-board percentage increase could add as much as \$100,000 to each payroll which the hospital cannot afford at this time. This would also not be an acceptable way to reward long-term employees. Dale Garner made a motion to table this item until the March 2011 meeting. Ray Hudson seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

There was no new business and the meeting was declared adjourned at 8:00 p.m.

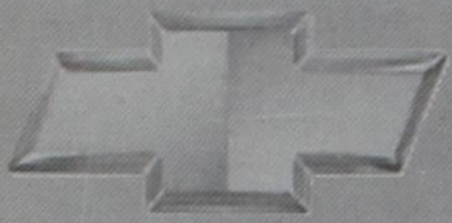

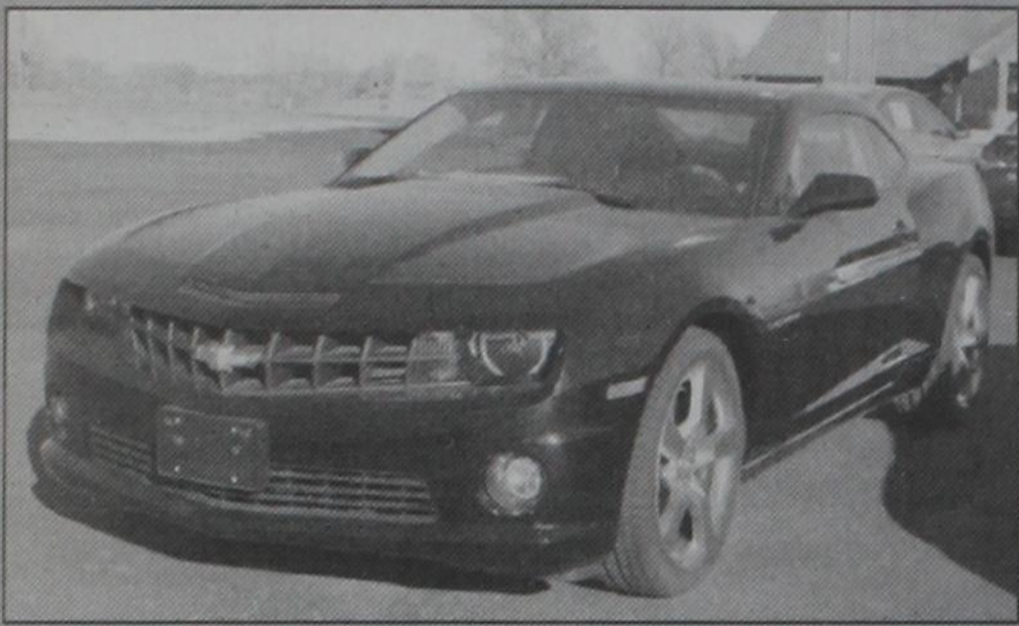

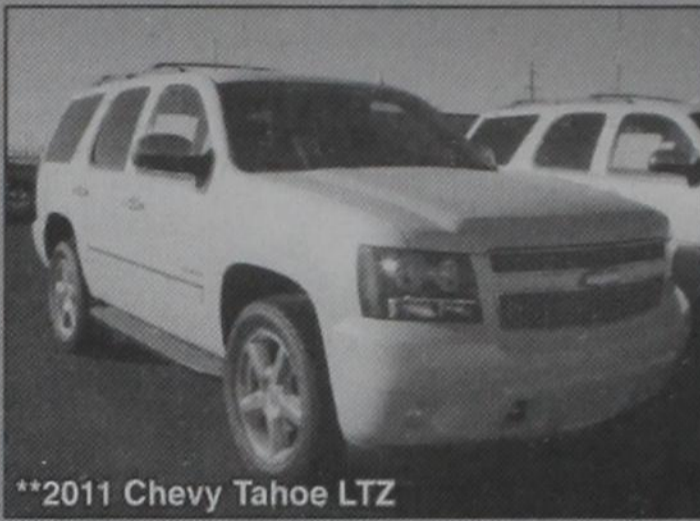

- You may believe you no longer need medication when you start to feel better and your symptoms go away.
- You may want to drink alcohol and/or use drugs and feel that you should not mix them.
- You may not be able to afford the medication.

If these issues concern you, please talk to your doctor or nurse.

- Tips to Help You Take Your Medication
- Give your medication a chance to start working before giving up. This can take 6-8 weeks or more.
  - Talk to your doctor and nurse if you are having any side effects. They can usually be dealt with and some go away completely after a short time.

- Ask your doctor to prescribe your medication all at once if possible or in 2 doses.
- Ask your nurse to teach you how to use a weekly pill box.
- Take your medication at the same time each day, as part of a daily routine.

- Relate these benefits to taking your medications.

Physical activities are activities that get your body moving such as gardening, walking and/or taking the stairs instead of the elevator. Exercise is a form of physical activity that is specifically planned or structured such as weight training or an aerobics class. Physical activity and exercise are both important and can help improve your ability to do the everyday activities you enjoy.

Physical activity can do a number of things for people of all ages but may be especially helpful to older adults. In addition to helping mood and increasing social interaction, physical activity may help prevent, delay or improve conditions such as diabetes and heart disease. Physical activity also helps strengthen muscles and bones which have a tendency to weaken as the body ages.





**Exercise** (from Page 3) short spurts throughout the day, or you can set aside specific times of the day on specific days of the week to exercise. Many physical activities are free or low cost and do not require special equipment.

The National Institute on Aging (NIA) recommends the following when considering exercise and/or physical activity:

- ° **Stretch.** Before you start any exercise and after you complete any exercise, you will want to stretch your muscles. This will help loosen and warm your muscles in addition to helping prevent injury and cramping. It is also important to remember that you may or may not be thirsty during or after exercise; however, your body will need plenty of water, especially after you are finished exercising.
- ° **30 minutes.** The NIA suggests that you should do something to increase your heart and breathing rate for at least 30 minutes most days of the week. The 30 minutes do not have to be all at once, you could do three 10-minute exercises. A good rule of thumb is to see if you are doing enough is to try to talk during exercise: if you cannot talk at all, you are exercising too hard; if you can talk without any trouble, you are not exercising hard enough.
- ° **Use your muscles.** Every time you move a part of your body, you are using a muscle. When those muscles are not used because of a lack of physical activity they weaken. If your muscles get too weak, you may not be able to walk or even get up from a seated position. In addition, strong muscles help reinforce your bones, making it less likely that you will fall. Whatever exercise you do should include something that uses your muscles, whether you are walking laps or raking leaves in the front yard.
- ° **Improve your balance.**
