

# Grass Fire Tuesday May Have Been Arson

The Wheeler Volunteer Fire Department was called to the scene for a fire Tuesday, March 22, 2011, around 1:00 p.m. The fire started in some grass and wheat stubble south and east of Wheeler.

The fire was brought under control by 2:30, due partially to the east side of the property having been plowed prior to the fire.

Called to help fight the fire were Allison, Briscoe, Kelton, Mobeetie and Wheeler. The Wheeler County tankers and maintainers, drivers and operators were also called in to help fight the blaze, which was burning during the worst of conditions—exceedingly

dry with high winds. It was determined after the blaze was extinguished that the fire was deliberately set. If found guilty of setting a fire, an individual is responsible for damage and if death or injury is a result, the person could be imprisoned.

The Wheeler Volunteer Fire Department was called to the scene a short time later to bring a hot spot under control.

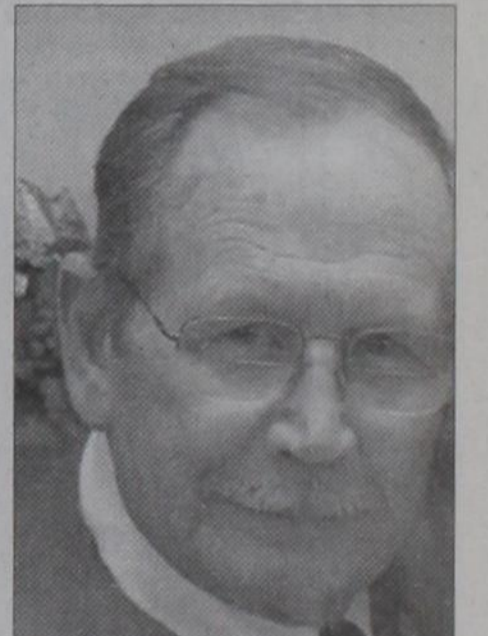

The Wheeler County Commissioners' Court met in regular session on Monday, March 28, 2011, at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Courtroom of the Wheeler County Courthouse, 401 Main Street, Wheeler, Texas, to consider prior bills and discuss matters of mutual concern.

At 10:00 a.m., the commissioners considered the nine items on the agenda.

The hourly payroll time sheets were approved for payment.

The court voted to pay the bills as approved.

No action was taken on the budget.

No action was taken on the burn ban. The court discussed the need to inform the public on fines and responsibilities of individuals who set fires, accidental or deliberate. This information is to be released to the press at a later date.

No reports by county offices were received.

## OMTA Wildlife Art Exhibit Corresponds With Turkey Hunting Season Opening

The Old Mobeetie Jail Museum will host a Wildlife Art Exhibit featuring the work of photographer R.D. "Dick" Wilberforce of Canadian, Texas and painter Herb Booth of Rockport, Texas. Works will be displayed from April 2-April 17 at the Visitor's Center in Old Mobeetie. Mark these dates on your calendar as a "must see" activity.

Wilberforce's photography exhibit will include works featuring wildlife, dogs, horses and cattle.

Wilberforce is a veteran outdoor photographer whose images have graced over 125 magazine covers. These publications include Ducks Unlimited, Quail Unlimited, Wild Bird, Quarterhorse Journal, Wing & Shot and Gun Dog. "I've been fortunate enough to enjoy documenting God's creatures and the outdoor world for over half a century," Wilberforce said. "You can't ask for a more challenging or rewarding life than one working with nature and the people who respect and enjoy it," he added.

Original watercolors by Rockport artist Herb Booth will also be on display. Booth, who has wedded his artistic skills with decades of experience as a naturalist and hunter, is one of the best known and most sought after painters of sporting and wildlife scenes in Texas. Booth's work has been featured in many of the nationally known sporting magazines. Some of this well known prints will be featured including prints of waterfowl done for Ducks Unlimited 1991 Central Flyway Collection, "Shiner's Show" from the February 2005 edition of Parks and Wildlife's magazine, and Migratory game bird stamps done for the National Wild Turkey Federation. He will also have books available for purchase.

In addition to Wilberforce and Booth, several works by Kenneth Wyatt, commissioned by the Old Mobeetie Museum, will also be on display. The Visitor's Center, two blocks east of the Old Mobeetie Jail Museum, will be open daily from 1-5 pm during the 15 day exhibit. Admission is free and the public is invited to attend and take advantage of the opportunity to see this outstanding display of art.

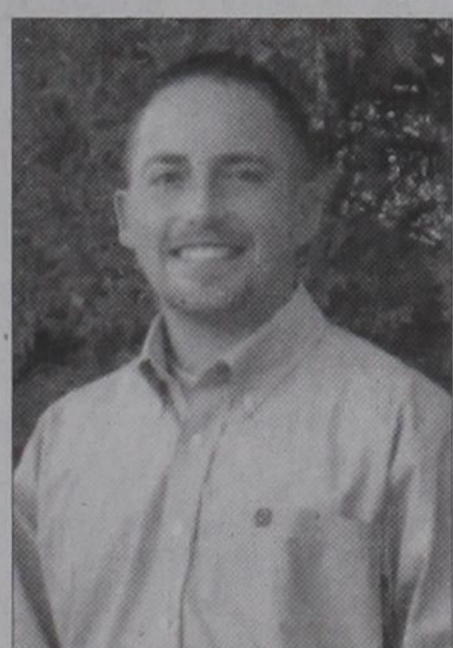

## Singing Women Of Texas Plan To Perform At Methodist Church

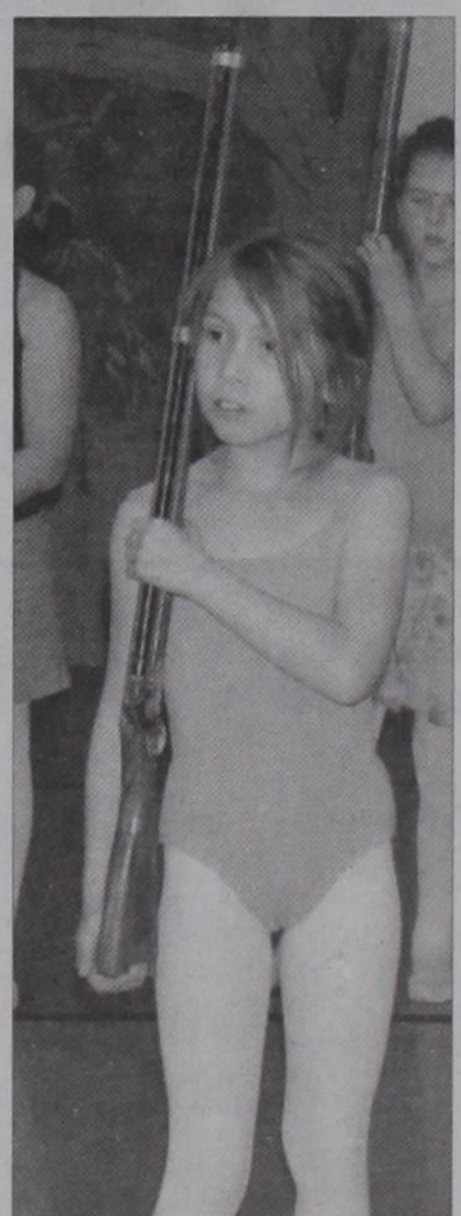

## KPDR Radio Station Expansion Underway

KPDR is in its 25th year of broadcasting from Wheeler. On August 31, 1986, the station began at 3:00 p.m. After the engineer on the project failed to get the antennas installed at the top of the tower, he placed a temporary antenna on the Ware TV tower about 30 or 40 feet high. Then, when he turned on the transmitter that had been brought for the start of the station, it caught on fire. But, the crowd had been invited to gather at the Wheeler High School auditorium for a "live" broadcast to begin the operation of the station. So, it all began in Wheeler that day with a small piece of equipment called an exciter putting out a signal of about 10 watts from that low antenna. Soon, the station was able to broadcast at 300 watts. Then, in November of 1986, the transmitter that was actually purchased for (Continued Page 6)

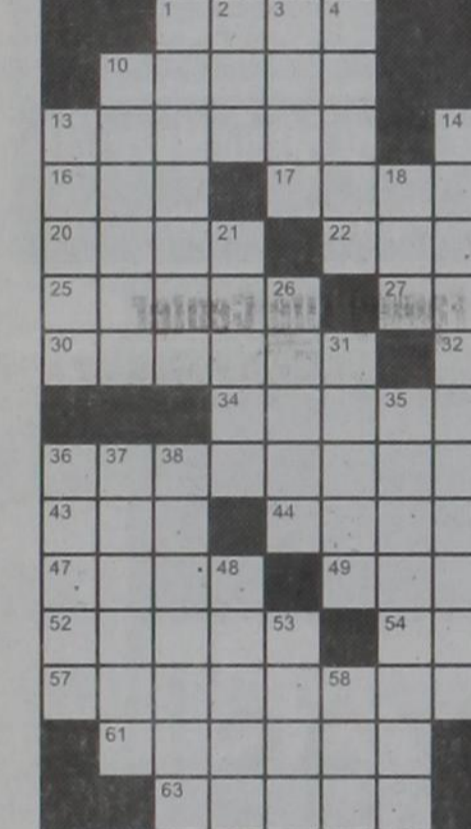

(from Page 1) KPDR, but was not ready in August, arrived and the station was able to transmit at the 3,000 watts that had been the plan from the start. However, the original engineer had said that grounding was not needed. So, within a couple of months, lightning got the transmitter, and that began a series of many problems with the transmitter. The transmitter itself was the one and only transmitter built by the manufacturer. It wasn't funny at the time, but some of these things seem comical now. You had a preacher heading up the project who didn't know anything about what he was doing. He just had a dream. Then, you had an engineer who tried too hard to keep expenses down by advising not to ground the transmitter and to use simple radiator clamps from the implement store to secure the cable to the tower. Those soon began to cut into the cable. Add to that the purchase of a transmitter from an individual who had never built a transmitter. Then, the radio signal began to interfere with television sets all over town. That required that KPDR arrange to replace most of the cable strung all over Wheeler to TV sets.

That has been the output power for many years, reaching a distance of 40 miles from Wheeler, and often as many as 60 miles.

NOW, KPDR has a new tower located between Wheeler and Pampa. The tower has been completed. A large transmitter has been set in place. Within a couple of weeks, the antennas should be installed and the transmitter turned on to make the station a 20,000 watt station, broadcasting from a taller tower at a higher elevation. The newly expanded Wheeler station will produce a signal that is as strong in Pampa as it is in Wheeler and is expected to reach a large portion of the Central Panhandle, Eastern Panhandle, and Western Oklahoma. This will make KPDR the biggest of all 6 stations on the Kingdom Keys Network. It all started in Wheeler, TX, the little town with the big heart, and has grown again and again, with 10 translators in addition to the 6 stations and one more station coming within a year to Liberal, Kansas.

Who would have ever thought that a little place like Wheeler, TX would be the place from which such a powerful signal would originate?

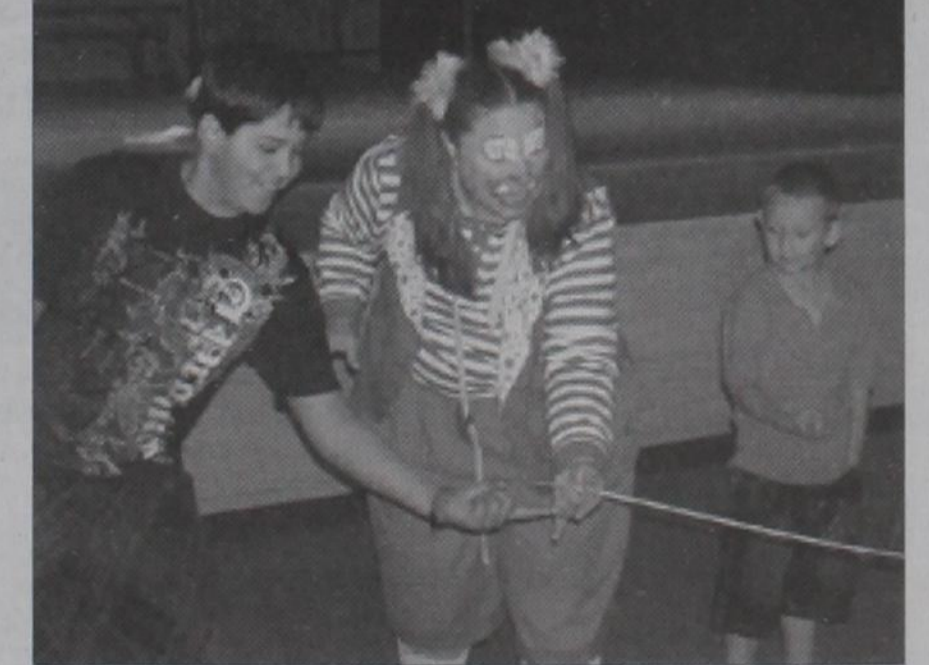
