TRUMAN'S 'SUFFICIENT' U. N. POLICE FORCE

President Truman wants "a sufficient police force" for the United Nations to maintain the peace of the world, after which he would have "world disarmament" but "not on a unlateral basis." This is the substance of a letter he wrote to Sen. Elbert D. Thom- buried, risen, and coming again. as, member of the Senate committee on foreign relations. It was in reply to a letter from Senator Thomas to the President, stating that the "technique of accomplishments of . . . disarmament is still lacking."

It is difficult to see, that the President's letter adds anything to the possibilities of achieving a disarmament technique. It is a reiteration of thoughts that have been privately expressed many times. Yet it is important because it is a flat-footed statement from the head of one of the two great powers in the world today. It is more definite and goes farther than the U.N. Charter.

Of course, the President could not afford to say so, but possibly he is thinking of a police force built up among the signatories of the North Atlantic Pact and the Rio Agreement. Such a police force would not be an all-U.N. organization unless Russia could be persuaded to contribute its part, and that seems highly improbable-for the present, at least. Yet Article 51 of the U.N. Charter, under which the Rio Agreement and the North Atlantic Pact have been signed, provides for collective armed action by members of the U.N.

The North Atlantic Pact in its present form contemplates only defensive military action by the signatory Western Democracies. Yet it would not be difficult so to amend the pact as to provide for a police force. The same would apply to the Rio Agreement. Such action might lead to an outright consolidation of the two international alliances. -From The Dallas Morning News






