Those wishing to spend the night at the campgrounds may do so with hook-ups available at the old jail.

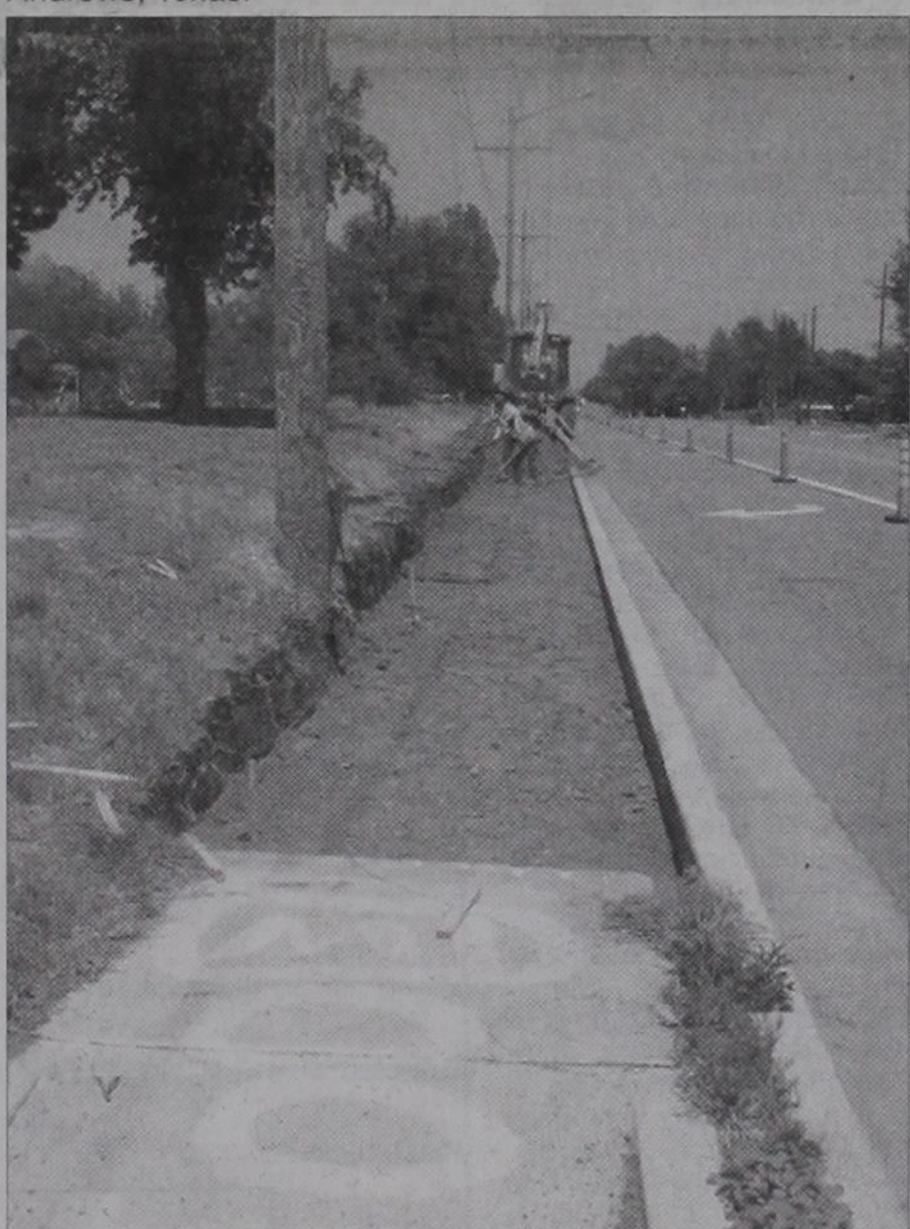

Wheeler County - On the 24th of August at 11:10 AM 20 year old Jovana Vasic of Bradenton, FL was killed in a tragic tractor crash on I-40 Near Shamrock. Milan Vasic 43 of Des Plaines, IL was injured and taken to NWT hospital in Amarillo

Laurentiu Jeler of Chicago, IL was traveling east on I-40 in a 2006 Freight Liner truck tractor semi-trailer. Jeler for an unknown reason veered across the median and traveled into the west bound lanes of I-40 striking Vasic's 2006 BMW head on killing Jovana Vasic.

Vasic was pronounced dead at the scene by Wheeler County Justice of the Peace Rick Waldon. The cause of the crash is still under investigation by DPS troopers.

Selling Watermelons On The Honor System


About this time last year, I needed to make a trip to Wellington, to get some tractor, or implement parts. As I approached the edge of town, I noticed a trailer

parked on the corner of someone's yard. It had a sign on it that simply said, "Watermelons." I made a mental note of that, so I would be sure and stop there when I headed back home. While in the store getting the parts I'd gone after, I started talking to one of the other customers. During our conversation, I mentioned that I was needing to rig up a hay spike to go on the back of my tractor. He told me that he had one he never used anymore, and I could have it. He gave me directions to his house, which was at the north edge of town, and exactly where the spike was located. "You won't

need to knock on the door, 'cause there's nobody home," he told me. Sure enough, I found his house and loaded up the spike. Now, I'm ready to head for home. However, the trailer loaded with the watermelons I mentioned, was just a little ways from his house. I stopped and walked over to it. There wasn't anyone around; just a sign that told the price of the melons and a steel box with a slit in the top, that said, "Put money in here." So, I picked out a melon that looked just right and put the money for it in their box. That... brought back memories of when I was a kid. My folks used to sell peas, peaches and watermelons. Since we lived right next to the highway, they built a little

temporary shade between our house and the highway. There would usually be one of us there, but if we needed to all be gone for some reason, my mom would put out a container for money and a sign, like the folks at Wellington, did. If we ever got beat out of anything, it was never mentioned. I've heard it said, "Character, is when a person will do the right thing, even when nobody else is around."

Exercise For Older Adults

Regular exercise and physical activity are important to the physical and mental health of almost everyone, including older adults. Being physically active can help you continue to do the things you enjoy, stay independent as you age and produce long-term health benefits. Health experts agree that older adults should be active every day to maintain optimal health.

Physical activities are activities that get your body moving such as gardening, walking and/or taking the stairs instead of the elevator. Exercise is a form of physical activity that is specifically planned or structured such as weight training or an aerobics class. Physical activity and exercise are both important and can help improve your ability to do the everyday activities you enjoy.

Physical activity can do a number of things for people of all ages but may be especially helpful to older adults. In addition to helping mood and increasing social interaction, physical activity may help prevent, delay or improve conditions such as diabetes and heart disease. Physical activity also helps strengthen muscles and bones which have a tendency to weaken as the body ages.

One of the great things about physical activity is that there are so many ways to be active. For example, you can be active in short spurts throughout the day, or you can set aside specific times of the day on specific days of the week to exercise. Many physical activities are free or low cost and do not require special equipment.

The National Institute on Aging (NIA) recommends the following when considering exercise and/or physical activity:

• **Stretch.** Before you start any exercise and after you complete any exercise, you will want to stretch your muscles. This will help loosen and warm your muscles in addition to helping prevent injury and cramping. It is also important to remember that you may or may not be thirsty during or after exercise; however, your body will need plenty of water, especially after you are finished exercising.

• **30 minutes.** The NIA suggests that you should do something to increase your heart and breathing rate for at least 30 minutes most days of the week. The 30 minutes do not have to be all at once, you could do three 10-minute exercises. A good rule of thumb to see if you are doing enough is to try to talk during exercise: if you cannot talk at all, you are exercising too hard; if you can talk without any trouble, you are not exercising hard enough.

• **Use your muscles.** Every time you move a part of your body, you are using a muscle. When those muscles are not used because of a lack of physical activity they weaken. If your muscles get too weak, you may not be able to walk or even get up from a seated position. In addition, strong muscles help reinforce your bones, making it less likely that you will fall. Whatever exercise you do should include something that uses your muscles, whether you are walking laps or

raking leaves in the front yard.

• **Improve your balance.** In addition to strengthening your muscles, it is also very important to strengthen your sense of balance. After all, many falls are caused by loss of balance. To do this, try standing on one foot, holding onto a chair for support if you are unable to do this task alone. Also, try standing from a seated position without using your hands

or arms. Be very careful when trying these activities and have someone else present when you are doing them.

Your health provider will be a key player in your exercise routine. Please remember to consult him or her before beginning any type of physical activity. You will want to discuss with him or her how your personal health condition may be affected by exercise. Also, you will want to start slowly with any type of exercise routine. A good adage to remember is "start low and go slow." Doing too much, too soon may seriously injure your body.

• Do not hold your breath while straining.

• Use safety equipment to prevent injury. This may mean a helmet for bike riding or proper shoes for walking or running.

• Drink plenty of liquids unless specifically advised otherwise by your health provider.

• Bend from the hips, not from the waist.

Exercise may cause soreness or a little discomfort but should

never cause pain.

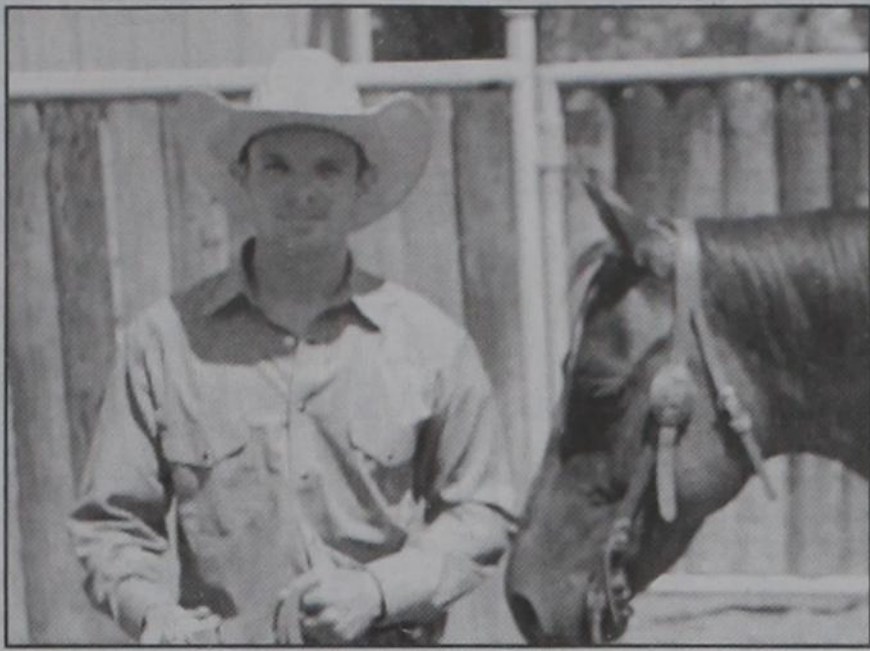

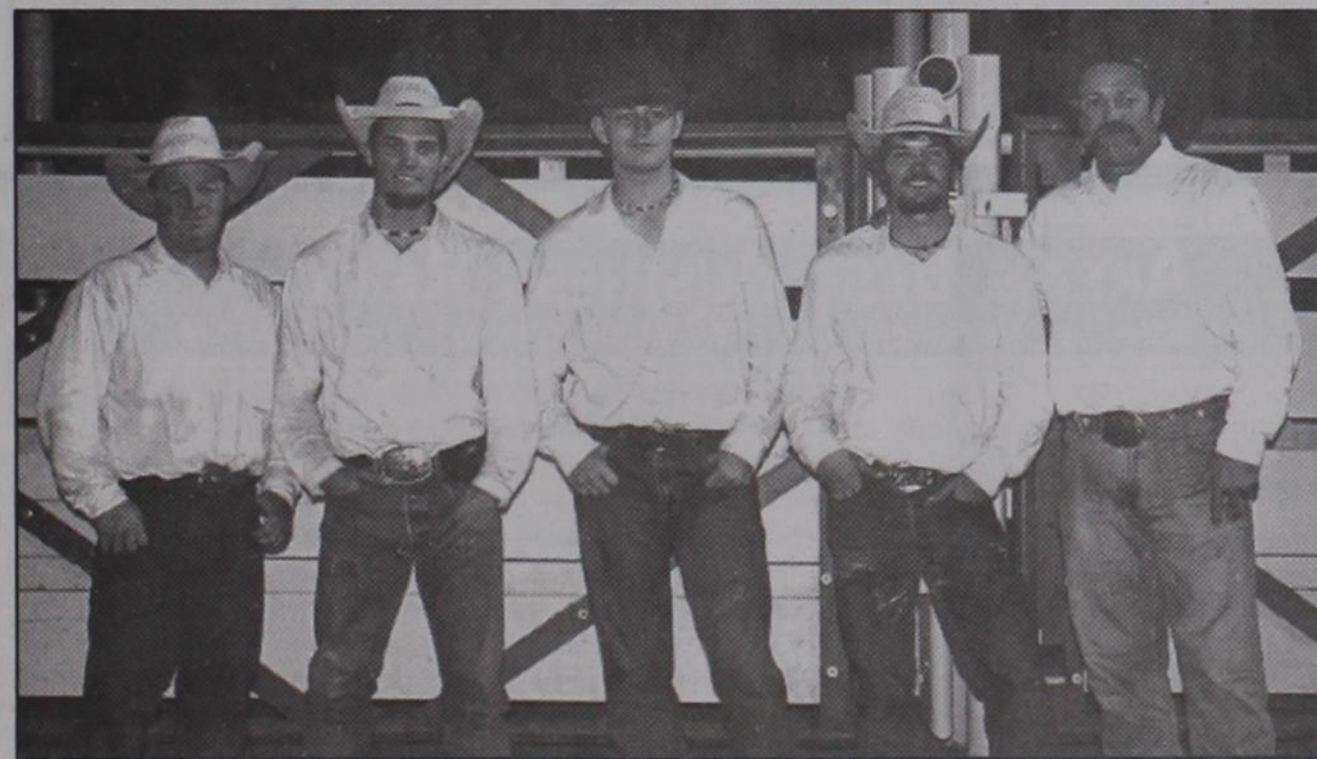

redrawing of the precinct borders, there will be changes in employees and equipment. The miles of roads in each precinct will change after the new precinct boundaries are in place after January 1. Adjustments will have to be made in their budgets at that time.

The Wheeler County Sheriff's Department requested additional funds to hire four more employees. Three more deputies and equipment and an additional jailer are needed.

Ft. Elliott Schools have complained of the need to patrol FM 1046, which runs past the Briscoe Campus and within a short distance of the Mobeetie Campus. A county deputy patrolled at

Mobeetie and counted approximately 200 vehicles from 5:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m.; part of this traffic are employees of the Allison plant traveling from work to their home in Pampa.

\$200,000 was moved and put into the County Sheriff's budget.

For the 2011-2012 fiscal year, Wheeler will have a budget of \$13,140,240.00.

After the new budget was approved, the commissioners lowered the tax rate for the year to 0.2785.

offering a \$50,000 matching grant to a city that was able to raise \$50,000 for improvements. The Wheeler EDC gave the City the first \$50,000 for the sidewalk

project. An advisory committee was then appointed to designate what type of fund the \$100,000 should be invested in. The advisory committee consisted of Kim Goad, Wanda Herd, Bob McCain, Kay Stiles and Harrison Hall. It was through their wise investment, more donation from Wheeler EDC and private donations, that the sidewalk project is now becoming a reality.

The cost of the sidewalk project is \$264,086.00. Once again, our community has worked together to make Wheeler a better place to live.




